HUSKIE BITES

- The winningest Division I program in Illinois (all-time) and in the MAC over the last decade, the Huskies have played in a FBS record six straight Mid-American Conference Championship games.
- NIU extended its MAC record for consecutive bowl games played to eight with its appearance in the 2015 SDCCU Poinsettia Bowl.
- With six championship game and six bowl appearances since 2010, NIU has played 84 games, the most by any team in the nation.
- Rod Carey embarks on his fourth season as NIU head coach with a 31-12 career record that includes the 2013 Orange Bowl; Carey has a school-record three wins over Big Ten teams and a 21-3 record in MAC games. He ranks sixth all-time at NIU in victories.
- NIU will host Toledo in the first football game ever to be played at Guaranteed Rate Field in Chicago on November 9, 2016 in the first Huskie Chi-Town Showdown. The game at the home of Major League Baseball's Chicago White Sox kicks off at 7 p.m. on an ESPN Network.
- The Huskies return 53 letterwinners and 16 starters for 2016 - six on offense, six on defense and four specialists, led by All-American cornerback Shawun Lurry, who led the nation in interceptions as a sophomore in 2015, and Freshman All-American offensive tackle Max Scharping. NIU's top passer, receiver, rusher and returner all return.
- Off the field, NIU owns the top Graduation Success Rate (GSR) in the Mid-American Conference, and one of the top GSR's in the Football Bowl Subdivision with an 86 percent mark. NIU leads the MAC in GSR by 12 percentage points over the second-highest MAC program and is 14 points above the FBS football average. The Huskies rank tied for 11th nationally among FBS programs and are tied for third among public FBS institutions.

LID LIFTERS: As a Football Bowl Subdivision (FBS) program, NIU is 18-29 in season-opening games. The Huskies have won each of their last three season openers. The Cardinal & Black defeated UNLV, 38-30, in the 2015 season opener at Huskie Stadium, opened the 2014 season with a 55-3 win over Presbyterian at home, and knocked off Iowa, 30-27, at Kinnick Stadium in 2013.

SERIES HISTORY: This is the first meeting between the Huskies and Wyoming on the gridiron. However, the two schools have met on the volleyball and basketball courts. The NIU volleyball team faced Wyoming Nov. 23, 1985, while the Huskie men's basketball team took on the Cowboys Dec. 27, 1986 in the Wyoming Cowboy Shootout in Casper, Wyoming.

DON'T CHANGE THAT CHANNEL: NIU's first three games of the season will be televised live on the CBS Sports Network. NIU's game at South Florida (Sept. 10) and the home opener versus San Diego State (Sept. 17) will also be shown on CBS Sports Network.

ROAD WARRIORS: The Huskies own a 22-4 record in true road games since a 31-30 victory at Buffalo on Oct. 22, 2011. Three of those four losses came last season as NIU went 3-3 away from home.

ROAD TRIP: After opening the past two seasons at Huskie Stadium, NIU takes to the road for the 2016 season opener. In fact, NIU is on the road for its first two games of the season. The last time the Huskies played their first two games away from home was 2013 when NIU defeated Iowa, 30-27, at Kinnick Stadium in the season opener before traveling to Idaho where the Huskies scored a 45-35 win at the Kibbie Dome.

NIU vs. THE MOUNTAIN WEST: The Huskies' loss to Boise State in the 2015 San Diego Credit Union Poinsettia Bowl to even their record to 10-10 versus teams that currently comprise the Mountain West Conference. NIU owns winning records against UNLV, Fresno State and San Jose State. In addition to facing Wyoming this season, NIU will play host to San Diego State Sept. 17 in the 2016 home opener. NIU defeated UNLV in the 2015 season opener to improve to 5-0 vs. the Rebels.

NIU HEAD COACH ROD CAREY

Entering his fourth full season at the helm of the Northern Illinois University football program, Rod Carey has “carried” on the winning tradition of the Huskies that has led to NIU’s position as the fifth-winningest team in the nation over the last six seasons. At the same time, NIU has become one of the top academic programs in the Football Bowl Subdivision with a Graduation Success Rate ranked in the top 15 in the country and atop the MAC.

Carey’s NIU teams are 31-12 in his three years as head coach of the program, and have won three Mid-American Conference West titles and the 2014 MAC Championship. The Huskies have played in the MAC title game every year of Carey’s coaching tenure at NIU, an FBS record six consecutive times.

He entered last season tied for eighth on NIU’s all-time coaching wins list, and now needs three wins in 2016 to move into fourth place on the list, and will then rank behind only Huskie coaching legends Chick Evans, Howard Fletcher and Joe Novak in victories.

Carey-led Huskie teams have three wins over Big Ten Conference teams - more than any of his predecessors, including two in 2013. NIU posted a perfect 12-0 regular season record that season behind quarterback Jordan Lynch, who Carey helped develop into the first Heisman Trophy finalist in NIU and MAC history. The Huskies spent 12 weeks in the Top 25 rankings and coasted through the league slate to win the MAC West title and advance to the MAC Championship game. Carey was named the MAC Coach of the Year, and was a semifinalist for the Maxwell Football Club Coach of the Year Award.

Prolific offensive production, leading to four consecutive 11-plus win seasons, has been a hallmark of Carey’s six seasons in DeKalb as he arrived at NIU in 2011 as offensive line coach and was elevated to offensive coordinator in 2012. He was named head coach on December 2 and making his head coaching debut versus Florida State in the Discover Orange Bowl.

Last year, Shawun Lurry became the sixth NIU player to be named an All-American under Carey’s guidance when he earned first team honors from the FWA. Huskies won the Vern Smith Award, presented annually to the MAC MVP, in each of Carey’s first three years.

Under Carey’s guidance, nine Huskie players have been in NFL camps, including five who began the 2016 campaign on a roster with three more playing in the Canadian Football League.

Carey joined the Huskies in 2011 after three seasons coaching the offensive line at the University of North Dakota. Prior to going to North Dakota, Carey spent the 2007 season as the offensive line coach at Illinois State. From 2000-06, Carey served on the coaching staff at the University of Wisconsin-Stout, where he was the offensive coordinator and offensive line coach. In all, Carey coached 26 all-conference selections and seven All-Americans during his time at UW-Stout.

Carey began his collegiate coaching career at the University of Minnesota (1998-99) and was a high school coach in his hometown of Wayzata (Minn.) prior to that.

POWER OF NIU'S "19" DUO: Double numbers are common on college football teams, but rarely do two players star with the same number. All-American cornerback Shawun Lurry and NIU's leading receiver from 2015, Kenny Golladay both wear No. 19. Other than playing on opposite sides of the ball, there is another "big" difference between the two. Golladay stands 6-4, 213, while Lurry has a 5-8 180-pound frame.

HUSKIE HIGH FIVE: The Huskies face three opponents from the "Group of 5" in 2016 with games at Wyoming (Mountain West) and South Florida (American) to open the season, followed by a visit from Mountain West champion San Diego State to Huskie Stadium to open the season Sept. 17.

PLAYING THE PERCENTAGES: NIU returns 94.9 percent of its 5,579 yards of total offense from 2015. The Huskies bring back 5,295 yards from last season's total, led by Drew Hare's 2,214 yards of total offense. The Huskie quarterback rushed for 252 yards and passed for 1,962 in just nine games last year. Running back Joel Bouagnon tallied 1,285 yards rushing, while quarterback Ryan Graham and tailback Jordan Huff added 795 and 653 yards, respectively.

WELCOME BACK: NIU quarterback Drew Hare returns to the field after missing the last five games of the 2015 season following an Achilles injury suffered in the first half of NIU's 32-27 victory at Toledo. Hare threw for 1,962 yards and 14 touchdowns with just four interceptions, completing 164 of 257 passes. He also rushed for 252 yards and one touchdown in nine games in 2015. The O'Fallon, Mo. native is one four Huskie signal callers to win a MAC championship and is looking to become the first to win two in his career.

MILLENNIALS: For the first time in school history, NIU returns a 1,000-yard rusher and 1,000-yard receiver from the previous season. Senior tailback Joel Bouagnon rushed for 1,285 yards on 283 carries in 2015. After sitting out the 2014 season after transferring to NIU from North Dakota, redshirt senior Kenny Golladay amassed 1,129 yards receiving on 73 receptions. Both players also had at least 10 touchdowns on the year, with Bouagnon scoring 18 TDs, while Golladay reached the end zone 10 times last season.

NIU'S ALL-AMERICAN: In addition to returning a 1,000-yard receiver and a 1,000-yard rusher, NIU also returns an All-American in cornerback Shawun Lurry. Last season as a sophomore, Lurry led the nation in interceptions with nine and in interception return yards. He earned first team All-America honors from the Football Writers Association of America, second team accolades by the Walter Camp Foundation and third team honors from the Associated Press.

SWEET HOME CHICAGO: The NIU football team returns to Chicago this season when NIU plays host to Mid-American Conference rival Toledo, Nov. 9 at Guaranteed Rate Field. It will be the first college football game played at the home of the Chicago White Sox.

HUSKIES IN THE PROS

STATE CHAMPS: With a 566-476-51 overall record, NIU boasts a .541 winning percentage which is tops among all seven of Illinois' Division I (FBS and FCS) football programs. At the end of September, NIU will take on the team ranked second on the list, Western Illinois.

DEGREES IN HAND: Five Huskies – Ladell Fleming, Clayton Glasper, Drew Hare, Lincoln Howard and Levon Myers – were among the 58 NIU student-athletes to walk across the stage at graduation and receive their degrees in May. Glasper and Howard earned their degrees in kinesiology, Fleming graduated with a degree in organizational & corporate communications, Hare and Myers earned degrees in leadership and management and marketing, respectively. The five are all in postgraduate studies or grad school this fall.

MAKING THE GRADE: The NIU football program continues to be as successful in the classroom as it is on the field. The Huskie football program matched its multi-year Academic Progress Rate (APR) of 970, a school record, which it set last year. The multi-year APR for each NCAA Division I team is based on the past four year' totals for eligibility and retention of each scholarship student-athlete. NIU's 970 ranks above the national average of 964 for Football Subdivision schools and tied for second in the MAC.

SENIOR SALUTE: The Huskies' 2016 roster includes 22 seniors, with 19 listed on the depth chart entering the Wyoming game and 12 slated to start. Quarterback Drew Hare headlines the group and plays behind an offensive line featuring Levon Myers, Lincoln Howard and Josh Ruka with reserve guard Ron Brown. Tailback Joel Bouagnon and wide receivers Kenny Golladay, Clayton Glasper, Aregeros Turner, and Anthony Maddie round out the NIU seniors on the offensive side of the ball. Defensive linemen Mario Jones, Corey Thomas and Ladell Fleming, linebackers Jamaal Payton and Sean Folliard, and cornerback Anthony Brooks comprise the Huskie seniors on the defense. Punter Jake Ambrose, kicker Josh Orne and long snapper Bobby Ramlet provide experience on the special teams.

ORANGE YOU GLAD YOU CAME TO NIU: The 22-man 2016 NIU senior class, the largest in Rod Carey's tenure as head coach of the Huskies, boasts 15 redshirt seniors. Of those 15 redshirt seniors, 11 made the trip to South Beach for NIU's appearance in the 2013 Orange Bowl. They are the last remaining Huskie class who had the orange Bowl experience.

CLIMBING THE CHARTS: NIU has amassed a 65-19 record since 2010. That win total puts NIU in some esteemed company. The Huskies rank tied for sixth in wins over the last six years, behind Alabama (72), Oregon (69), Florida State (68), Ohio State (68) and Stanford (66). The Huskies are tied with Michigan State, one win ahead of the next most successful "Group of Five" team – Boise State.

SOME STRETCH: No FBS team in the nation has played more football games since 2010 than NIU. With appearances in six straight conference championship games and bowl games, the Huskies have played in 14 football contests in each of the last six seasons for a total of 84 games. Florida State and Alabama have each played in 82 games, while Stanford and Michigan State tallied 81 games played the last six seasons.

NEW ADDITIONS: NIU head coach Rod Carey welcomed five new coaches to his staff (see chart on page 3) during the offseason. Three of those five coaches are very
