Nebraska has won 30 consecutive games against current members of the Mountain West Conference. The Huskers are 35-2 all-time against Mountain West schools.

Nebraska out-rushed Fresno State by 261 yards, outgaining the Bulldogs 292-31 in the rushing department. In last year's bowl win over UCLA, the Huskers had a 259-yard edge in rushing yards.

THE MATCHUP

Nebraska continues its season-opening homestand at Memorial Stadium on Saturday when the Huskers play host to the Wyoming Cowboys. Game time in Lincoln is set for 11 a.m. (CT) with the contest televised nationally on ESPN2.

Nebraska is coming off a solid opening to the 2016 season following a 43-10 victory over Fresno State on Saturday night in Lincoln. Nebraska led by just four points at halftime, but broke the game open with 29 unanswered points in the second half.

The Huskers showed a powerful rushing attack in the opening-game victory, racking up 292 yards on the ground, and averaging nearly six yards per carry. Nebraska also played turnover-free football in the game, did not allow a sack, and limited the Bulldogs to just 31 rushing yards.

Wyoming opened with a 40-34 triple overtime victory over Northern Illinois in Laramie, in a game that lasted well into Sunday morning. The Cowboys featured a balanced offensive attack in the win, rushing for 243 yards, while passing for 245 yards. Wyoming is coached by Craig Bohl who is in his third season at the helm of the program. Bohl played at Nebraska in the late 1970s and was a Husker assistant coach from 1995 to 2002.

The matchup with Wyoming completes a three-game series between the two schools. The Huskers won at Laramie in 2011 and defeated the Cowboys in Lincoln in 2013. Nebraska holds a 7-0 all-time edge against Wyoming on the gridiron.

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GENERAL POLICIES

All player and coach interviews must be arranged at least one day in advance through the Nebraska Communications Office. Contact Keith Mann, Shamus McKnight, Matt Smith or Jeremy Foote. All post-practice interviews will be conducted at the practice site. Interviews will not be conducted in the weight room, Student Life Complex, training room, hallways or the tunnel leading from the locker room to the field. The Nebraska locker room, training room and football office meeting rooms are **OFF-LIMITS** to the media. When arriving for post-practice interviews, media should wait in the Hawks Center lobby, or access Memorial Stadium through Gate 11 entrance if practice is in the stadium.

Requested players are available (depending on class schedules) at the Monday press conferences (11:30 a.m.-1 p.m.) and after practice on the field on Tuesday (defense) and Wednesday (offense). Players cell phone numbers will **NOT** be given to the media.

Practices are **CLOSED** to the media and to the general public during the season. Media will be allowed to shoot photos/video at the start of practice on Tuesdays (app. 15 minutes). A Communications representative will be on hand during the open portion of practice.

After all games, Nebraska's locker room is closed. Head Coach Mike Riley, coordinators and requested players will be brought to the postgame interview room after a 10-minute cooling off period. At home, the postgame interview room is located in the strength complex of the Osborne Athletic Complex. Media are asked to wait to set up equipment until the conclusion of halftime. On the road, Coach Riley, assistant coaches and requested players will be brought to the designated interview area. Please note, **NO INTERVIEWS** will be conducted on the field as the players are returning to the locker room.

- Saturday's meeting will complete a three-game series between the schools that included a 2011 game at Wyoming and the 2013 season opener in Lincoln.
- Nebraska has scored at least 37 points in six of the seven all-time meetings between the schools, including each of the past five.
- Terrell Newby rushed for 76 yards on 15 carries in the 2013 season opener, marking the first game of his Nebraska career.

HUSKER-WYOMING TIES

The Nebraska and Wyoming football programs share more than just a common border.

- Hall of Fame Nebraska Head Coach **Bob Devaney** joined the Huskers in 1962 after six highly successful seasons as the Cowboys' head coach from 1956 to 1961.
- Devaney posted a 35-10-5 record at Wyoming, before guiding NU to a 101-20-2 record in 11 seasons, including national championships in 1970 and 1971.
- Current Wyoming Head Coach **Craig Bohl** both played and coached at Nebraska. Bohl was on the Husker roster as a defensive back from 1977 to 1979. He coached for eight seasons on the Nebraska staff from 1995 to 2002, including his final three seasons as defensive coordinator.
- Bohl helped Nebraska to a pair of national championships (1995, 1997) during his stint as a Husker assistant coach.

BOHL JOINS LIST OF FORMER PLAYERS, COACHES TO FACE NU

Craig Bohl will join a short list of former Husker players and coaches to match up with Nebraska as an opposing head coach.

- Bohl is just the third former Husker player since 1950 to serve as a head coach in a matchup against Nebraska. Turner Gill was Kansas' head coach in a 2010 matchup with the Huskers, while Warren Powers guided both Washington State and Missouri against Nebraska.
- Bohl is one of six former Husker assistants to later coach against Nebraska as an opposing head coach. The list also includes Gill (Kansas), Powers (Washington State, Missouri), Kevin Steele (Baylor), Jim Walden (Iowa State) and Carl Selmer (Miami).

HUSKERS VS. MOUNTAIN WEST

Nebraska owns an impressive 35-2 all-time record against current members of the Mountain West Conference, including a 43-10 win over Fresno State last Saturday. Entering this week's game with Wyoming, Nebraska has won its past 30 matchups against Mountain West schools.

RILEY PICKS UP WIN #100

- Riley is one of 22 active FBS head coaches with 100 career college victories.
- All 100 of Riley's victories have come while coaching in a Power Five Conference. Riley is one of 10 active coaches to win 100 games at a Power Five Conference school.

NOTING GAME 1

- Nebraska won its 18th straight home night game dating back to 2008.
- Devine Ozigbo** rushed for a career-high 103 yards, marking his first career 100-yard game. His two touchdowns were also a career best, after he had one rushing touchdown as a freshman.
- Senior receiver **Alonzo Moore** had a career-long 57-yard touchdown reception, bettering a 44-yard catch at Rutgers. Moore also had a career-high 92 receiving yards, bettering his 84 yards at Minnesota in 2015.
- Nebraska rushed for 292 yards in the victory, marking the second straight game Nebraska topped 275 yards on the ground. NU rushed for 326 yards in the Foster Farms Bowl.
- Tommy Armstrong Jr.** accounted for 150 yards of total offense in the win and became just the second Husker to surpass 8,000 career yards of total offense. Armstrong now has 8,148 yards of total offense in his career. He accounted for three touchdowns with two rushing scores and one passing touchdown.
- Nebraska limited Fresno State to just 31 rushing yards, marking the third time in four games dating back to last season that Nebraska has limited its opponent to less than 100 rushing yards.
- Safety **Kieron Williams** had a career-high 10 tackles in the game and also had his first career interception. Williams entered the game with 16 career tackles.
- Defensive end **Ross Dzuris** had a career-high two sacks and three tackles for loss. Dzuris had 2.5 sacks in the 2015 season.
- Nebraska did not commit a turnover in the game, marking the first time since a win at Minnesota last season that NU did not have a turnover.

FIRST-TIME STARTERS MAKE DEBUT AGAINST FRESNO STATE

Six Nebraska players made their first career start in the Huskers' victory over Fresno State. The group included one senior, two juniors, two sophomores and true freshman punter **Caleb Lightbourn**.

NEBRASKA LOOKS TO BUILD ON DOMINANCE AT LINE OF SCRIMMAGE

If the season opener is an indication, Nebraska will count on dominating the running game on both sides of the ball for success in 2016.

Nebraska churned out 292 rushing yards on 51 carries in the victory over Fresno State. That rushing effort came on the heels of running for 326 yards in the Foster Farms Bowl win over UCLA to close the 2015 season.

Over the past two games, the Nebraska offense has rushed the ball 113 times, while attempting 32 passes.

The Blackshirt defense has also done its part by shutting down the opposing running game. Fresno State rushed for just 31 yards on 26 carries, and the Huskers registered seven tackles for loss. NU limited UCLA to 67 rushing yards in the bowl game win.

LOCKING UP THE ROCK

Nebraska did not commit a turnover in the season opener against Fresno State, while intercepting two Bulldog passes. The zero-turnover effort was NU's first since not having a giveaway in a 48-25 win at Minnesota last season.

- Nebraska had just two games last season when the Huskers were +2 or better in turnover margin (South Alabama, Minnesota) and won those two games by a combined 62 points.
- Nebraska has had four games with zero turnovers since the start of the 2014 season. In those games, Nebraska's average margin of victory is 31.3 points.

Improving in the turnover department is a key focus for the 2016 Huskers. Nebraska has had a positive turnover margin just one time in the past 12 seasons (+5 in 2009).

NU OFFENSE LOOKS TO BACK UP SUCCESSFUL 2015

The Nebraska offense had a productive first season under Head Coach Mike Riley and offensive coordinator Danny Langsdorf, and the unit appears ready for more growth this fall with many key pieces returning.

In 2015, Nebraska ranked second in the Big Ten in total offense and passing offense, while finishing third in scoring offense.

- Nebraska averaged 32.8 points per game and scored more than 30 points eight times, including five of the final seven games. Nebraska opened 2016 with a 43-point effort against Fresno State.
- The Huskers finished second in total offense at 446.9 yards per game and averaged 6.1 yards per play, the third-best mark in the conference.
- Nebraska passed for 266.9 yards per game to rank second in the conference. The Huskers also allowed just 14 sacks in 13 games to rank second in the Big Ten and ninth nationally.
- NU had 228 plays from scrimmage of at least 10 yards. That total ranked 22nd nationally and second in the Big Ten. Nebraska was also second in the Big Ten in plays of 20-plus yards with 78.
- Nebraska scored 48 points at Minnesota, marking its highest scoring output in its five seasons of Big Ten play. The last time NU scored more points in a conference game was a 51-41 win at Oklahoma State in 2010.
- Nebraska topped the 300-yard passing mark six times in 2015, including each of the first four games. NU had a season-high 407 passing yards at Purdue, the fifth most in school history.

ARMSTRONG POISED TO CHALLENGE NU RECORDS

Quarterback **Tommy Armstrong Jr.** has made 34 starts since taking over as NU's starter in 2013. He has started 26 of 27 games since the start of the 2014 season. Armstrong's 23 career victories rank ninth in school history.

Armstrong produced one of the best statistical seasons in the Big Ten in 2015, ranking among the league leaders in passing and total offense. In his senior year, Armstrong has several Nebraska career records firmly in his sights.

- Armstrong completed 55 percent of his passes in 2015 and threw for 3,030 yards. The passing total marked the third 3,000-yard passing season in school history.
- Armstrong threw for 2,695 yards in his sophomore season in 2014. He is one of just three players in Nebraska history with two 2,000-yard passing seasons, joining Zac Taylor and Taylor Martinez.
- With another 3,000-yard passing season in 2016, Armstrong would become the first Husker to post two 3,000-yard passing seasons.
- Armstrong has five career 300-yard passing games, including four in 2015 (319 vs. BYU, 309 at Miami, 368 vs. Southern Miss, 320 vs. Michigan State). He had a career-high 381 passing yards against USC in the 2014 Holiday Bowl. Armstrong has topped 250 passing yards 12 times in his career, the most in school history.
- Armstrong finished second in the Big Ten in passing yards per game in 2015, averaging 252.5 passing yards per game.
- Armstrong has 6,799 passing yards to rank second on the NU career list. He is 459 yards from Taylor Martinez's school record of 7,258 passing yards. Armstrong's passing yardage was seventh nationally among active FBS players entering the 2016 season.
- Armstrong has 54 career touchdown passes, just two shy of Martinez's career school record. Armstrong has thrown for at least three touchdowns seven times in his Nebraska career. His 54 career passing touchdowns were fourth among active FBS players entering the 2016 season.
- Armstrong has thrown for 22 touchdowns each of the past two seasons, tied for fourth on the NU season chart.
- Armstrong averaged 285.8 yards of total offense per game in 2015 to rank second in the Big Ten.
- Armstrong has 8,148 career total offense yards, good for second at Nebraska. He is 2,085 yards from the school record held by Martinez.
- Armstrong is the first player in NU history with two 3,000-yard total offense seasons, after posting 3,430 yards in 2015 and 3,400 yards in 2014. Those totals are third and fourth, respectively, on the season total offense list.

- Armstrong had a career-high 431 yards of total offense against Southern Miss in 2015, and he has 10 career games of at least 300 yards of total offense. The 10 300-yard total offense games are the most in school history.
- Armstrong ranked 27th in the nation in passes of more than 10 yards (132) in 2015, and 22nd in passes of 20-plus yards (51).
- Armstrong is one of 10 Nebraska quarterbacks to surpass 1,000 career rushing yards. He has 1,349 rushing yards, seventh-most among NU quarterbacks.
- Armstrong twice earned Big Ten Offensive Player-of-the-Week honors in 2015. He first earned the honor against Southern Miss, then was recognized for his four touchdowns (2 rush, 2 pass) and 320 passing yards in the win over No. 6 Michigan State.
- Armstrong was the only active FBS quarterback with 6,500 career passing yards and 1,000 career rushing yards entering 2016.

WESTERKAMP CHASING NEBRASKA RECEIVING RECORDS

Senior receiver Jordan Westerkamp leads a Nebraska receiving corps that has the ability to rank as one of the nation's best this fall. Westerkamp is one of the top pass catchers in Nebraska history. He is one of four captains for the 2016 season, marking the second straight year he has served as a captain.

A Chicago area product, Westerkamp put together one of the most prolific receiving seasons in school history in 2015. He had 65 catches for 918 yards and seven touchdowns. He earned second-team All-Big Ten honors for his effort in 2015.

- His 65 catches were second on the NU single-season charts, and were the most receptions ever by a Husker receiver.
- Westerkamp had 918 receiving yards in 2015, the third-most in school history.

HUSKERS REMEMBER SAM FOLTZ

Nebraska lost a member of its family this summer, when senior punter Sam Foltz passed away in an automobile accident on July 23.

The latest success story of the Huskers' legendary walk-on program, Foltz embodied Nebraska's commitment to success on the field, in the classroom and in the community. On the field, he was the 2015 Big Ten Punter of the Year and his career average of 42.6 yards per punt ranked fifth all-time at Nebraska. In the classroom, Foltz was a five-time member of the Nebraska Scholar-Athlete Honor Roll, and he earned his degree in agronomy last May. Foltz was also active in the community, earning spots on both the Brook Berringer and Tom Osborne Citizenship teams in 2016, when he was also awarded a Nebraska Student-Athlete HERO Leadership Award for his leadership and dedicated community service.

INITIATIVES TO HONOR SAM FOLTZ

- Nebraska football players will wear a special "SF27" decal (pictured) on their helmets to honor Foltz's memory. The logo will also be featured on players' game-day hats, sweatshirts and compression shirts, as well as on the coaches' sideline polo shirts.
- Nebraska's annual student-athlete HERO Leadership Award will be renamed the Sam Foltz Hero 27 Leadership Award. The award will be presented annually to 27 student-athletes across all sports who exhibit strong leadership qualities, commitment to service and ability to encourage/empower peers.
- The Sam Foltz Memorial Scholarship has been created and was presented to Drew Brown before the first game. The Foltz Scholarship will be presented annually to a member of the football team who embodied Foltz's traits of leadership, excellence in the community and in the classroom.
- Nebraska is selecting a Sam Foltz Captain of the Week who will join the season-long captains. The Foltz captain will carry a flag onto the field honoring Foltz's memory.

- Westerkamp was sixth in the Big Ten in both receptions per game (5.0) and receiving yards per game (70.3).
- Westerkamp continues to move up the NU career charts. He is fourth on the NU career receiving yardage list with 1,954 yards, leaving him less than 750 yards from the No. 1 spot.
- He has 130 career receptions, to rank sixth on Nebraska's all-time list. He is 51 catches from the top spot on the career list.
- Westerkamp had a career-high 11 receptions for 118 yards against Southern Miss in 2015. The 11 catches were tied for third on the NU single-game receptions list.
- Westerkamp had a season-high 143 receiving yards against Michigan State, one of four 100-yard games in 2015 (107 vs. BYU, 118 vs. Southern Miss, 123 at Purdue). The four 100-yard games tied the Nebraska season record, accomplished five times previously.
- Westerkamp has seven career 100-yard receiving games to rank third on the NU career list in that category.
- Westerkamp's seven touchdown receptions in 2015 were tied for 10th on the season charts. He has 13 career touchdown receptions to rank in a tie for ninth place on that career list.
- Westerkamp (118) and Brandon Reilly (112) each topped 100 receiving yards against Southern Miss. That marked only the second time in NU history a pair of wideouts topped 100 receiving yards in the same game. Westerkamp and Kenny Bell combined for the feat against FAU in 2014.
- Westerkamp has caught a pass in 27 straight games, the fourth-longest streak in school history and just the eighth time in school history a player has had a streak of at least 20 consecutive games with a catch.

REILLY BIG-PLAY LEADER IN HUSKER RECEIVING CORPS

Jordan Westerkamp is joined in the wide receiving corps by fellow senior **Brandon Reilly**, who established himself as one of the nation's top big-play receiving threats in 2015.

Reilly had 40 receptions for 754 yards and four touchdowns in 2015. His biggest touchdown reception was a game-winning score in the final minute against No. 6 Michigan State. He totaled three catches for 87 yards against MSU, with two receptions of at least 30 yards. The big-play effort against MSU was indicative of Reilly's season.

- Reilly had eight receptions of at least 30 yards, the fourth-most in the Big Ten.
- Reilly's average of 18.9 yards per reception ranked first among Big Ten receivers who averaged at least 2.0 catches per game. The 18.9 yard-per-catch average was also the third-best average in NU history for players with at least 40 receptions.

Westerkamp and Reilly are the headliners among a talented group of receivers that has the ability to rank among the nation's best in 2016.

KICKER BROWN CONTINUES FAMILY TRADITION

Place-kicker **Drew Brown** is a leading contender for conference and national honors, including the Lou Groza Award. Brown established himself as one of the nation's top kickers as a sophomore and earned second-team All-Big Ten honors last fall.

Brown made 21-of-27 field goals in 2015, including each of his last 11 field goals. Nine of the 11 field goals in his streak were from at least 40 yards, and the streak of 11 straight made field goals is tied for the fourth-longest streak in NU history.

- Brown connected on 13 field goals of at least 40 yards in 2015. He was 13-of-17 from beyond 40 yards, including 12-of-14 from 40-49 yards.
- Brown's 13 field goals of at least 40 yards tied for the most nationally among all kickers, matching the total of Joey Slye of Virginia Tech. Only five kickers had at least 10 field goals of 40 yards or more in 2015.

- In Big Ten Conference games, Brown connected on 12-of-14 field goals.

- Brown's 21 field goals in 2015 were second on the Nebraska season list.

- Brown was second in the Big Ten at 1.62 field goals per game and ranked 16th nationally in the category. He was third in the Big Ten in scoring at 8.2 points per game.

- Brown scored 107 points as a sophomore after posting a Nebraska freshman-record 101 points in 2014. He is the first player in Nebraska history with 100-point seasons as both a freshman and sophomore.

- Brown had multiple field goals in seven games in 2015.

Brown jump-started his 2015 season with a record-setting performance against Southern Miss. Brown made five field goals, all in the first half, in the Huskers' 36-28 victory.

- Brown's five field goals in a half tied an NCAA record. He now shares the record with fellow Husker Dale Klein (1985 at Missouri) and New Mexico State's Dat Ly (1988 at Kansas).
- Brown's five field goals were the most ever by a Husker in Lincoln, and tied a Memorial Stadium record held by two opposing kickers.
- The five field goals marked the third time in NU history a kicker had five or more field goals. Klein had an NCAA record seven field goals at Missouri in 1985, and Alex Henery had five field goals at Virginia Tech in 2009.

BLACKSHIRTS LOOK TO STUFF THE RUN AGAIN IN 2016

The Nebraska Blackshirt defense entered 2016 with a goal of making big improvements in pass defense and pressuring the quarterback. The Huskers also look to duplicate their 2015 success in stopping the opponent run game.

The Huskers allowed opponents to rush for 109.9 yards per game, a mark that ranked second in the Big Ten and ninth nationally. NU was strong in the opener, holding Fresno State to just 31 rushing yards. In 14 games since the start of the 2015 season, Nebraska has limited six opponents to less than 90 rushing yards.

- NU is 6-0 in games when opponents rushed for less than 90 yards since the start of 2015.
- Nebraska held Southern Miss to 11 rushing yards, its best run defense effort since Michigan had -17 rushing yards in 2013. South Alabama had just 19 rushing yards.
- In Big Ten play, Nebraska limited Minnesota to 65 rushing yards, while Rutgers had just 89 yards on the ground.

Nebraska did generate a solid pass rush in the opening win over Fresno State, recording four sacks. The Huskers allowed 243 passing yards to the Bulldogs, but did have two interceptions.

GERRY RETURNS TO LEAD HUSKER SECONDARY

Nebraska senior safety **Nathan Gerry** has been a fixture for the Husker defense the past three seasons. Gerry started every game in the secondary in 2014 and 2015 and made his mark as one of the top defensive backs in the Big Ten Conference. Gerry is in his second season as a captain in 2016 and will make his season debut against Wyoming.

In 2015, Gerry was a third-team All-Big Ten choice by the league media, marking the second straight year he earned all-conference accolades. As a sophomore, Gerry garnered second-team all-conference honors.

- Gerry has led Nebraska in interceptions each of the past two seasons with five in 2014 and four in 2015.
- Gerry ranked in the top 10 in the Big Ten in interceptions each of the past two seasons. As a sophomore in 2014, he led the league in interceptions in conference games, with all five picks coming in Big Ten play.
- Gerry's nine interceptions rank just outside of the career top 10 at Nebraska, and he is five interceptions from the career record of 14 interceptions.
- Gerry led Nebraska in tackles in 2015 with 79 stops and ranked second in 2014 with 88 tackles.
- Gerry has 199 career tackles to rank 33rd in school history and fifth all-time among NU defensive backs. He is 55 tackles from the top 10 on the NU career list, and just 28 tackles from ranking second among defensive backs.

NEBRASKA HOPE TO CONTINUE WINNING ON 'MONEY DOWN'

Coaches regularly preach the importance of winning on third down. Nebraska was effective on the 'money down' on both offense and defense in 2015, and looks to carry that success into this season.

- Nebraska ranked third in the Big Ten in third-down conversions at 44.8 percent. Defensively, the Huskers were fifth in opponent third-down conversions at 34.0 percent.
- The Huskers ranked 24th nationally in both categories. Nebraska joined Clemson, Michigan and Tennessee as the only schools in the nation to rank in the top 25 in both third-down conversions and opponent third-down conversions.
- In the season opener, Nebraska hit on 5-of-14 third-down attempts, while limiting Fresno State to 33 percent (5-of-15).

HOME OF THE HUSKERS

Memorial Stadium's history dates back more than 90 years. In the fall of 1922, a drive for \$430,000 in stadium construction funds was undertaken by faculty, students, alumni and friends of the University.

The stadium was named Memorial Stadium to honor all Nebraskans who served in the Civil and Spanish-American Wars; the 751 Nebraskans who died in World War I; the 3,839 in World War II; the 225 in Korea; the 422 in Vietnam; and those in Iraq.

Construction was completed in a few more than 90 working days and Memorial Stadium was dedicated on Oct. 20, 1923, at the Homecoming game in which Nebraska was held to a scoreless tie by Kansas.

The field at Memorial Stadium was named Tom Osborne Field - after the Huskers' legendary Hall-of-Fame coach - in 1998, one year after Osborne's retirement following 25 years and 255 victories as Nebraska's head coach.

Nebraska Head Coach Mike Riley is in his second season in Lincoln in 2016. The season also marks Riley's 25th season overall as a head coach. Riley is in his 16th season as a college head coach, including 14 years at Oregon State and two at Nebraska. He also has nine years as a professional head coach, including three years as an NFL head coach.

- Riley picked up his 100th career college coaching win in the season opener. Riley won 93 games in 14 seasons at Oregon State, before coming to Nebraska.
- Riley is in his 42nd overall season in either the college or professional coaching ranks, the second-most of any FBS head coach entering 2016. He trails only Alabama's Nick Saban, who enters his 44th season in coaching in 2016.
- With his 25 years of head coaching experience, Riley ranks second among current FBS head coaches in total years of head coaching experience. Notre Dame's Brian Kelly is in his 27th season in 2016.
- Riley is one of only four FBS head coaches with at least three years of NFL head coaching experience. Three of those four coaches are in the Big Ten, including Riley, Illinois' Lovie Smith and Jim Harbaugh of Michigan.
- Riley posted a win over sixth-ranked Michigan State in 2015, marking the 15th win of his collegiate coaching career over a ranked team. The victory over the Spartans was Riley's sixth win over a top-10 team.

FOUR SENIORS ELECTED AS 2016 TEAM CAPTAINS

Four Nebraska seniors have been selected by their teammates as captains for the 2016 season. The four players include two each on offense and defense and come to Nebraska from three states.

- Utter is the third player in four seasons to become a captain after arriving in the program as a walk-on, joining offensive lineman Spencer Long (2013) and defensive end Jack Gangwish (2015). It also marks the fourth straight year an offensive lineman has been a captain.

Mike Riley placed three former walk-ons on scholarship before the start of the season. The members of the group are all Nebraska natives and fifth-year seniors in the Husker program.

Nabity has played in 26 games in his Nebraska career, primarily on special teams.

Rath is in the mix for playing time at defensive tackle in his senior year. Rath has played in two games at Nebraska.

Simpson is among Nebraska's top special teams performers. He has played in 28 games and has nine special teams tackles with the Huskers.

Nebraska has a long tradition of relying on its walk-on program to help build the foundation of the program. Six walk-ons have gone on to earn first-team All-America honors for Nebraska, while 13 walk-ons have earned first-team academic All-America recognition.

NU RANKS AMONG NATION'S ATTENDANCE LEADERS

Nebraska averaged 89,998 fans for its seven home games at Memorial Stadium in 2015. Nebraska's attendance average ranked 11th in the nation and fourth among Big Ten schools. The 2015 season marked the third straight year Nebraska ranked 11th or higher in average attendance. The Big Ten had seven of the top 24 schools in average home attendance in 2015.

In 2014, Nebraska was 10th in average home attendance with 91,249 fans per game. The average attendance for seven home games was the largest ever at Memorial Stadium, bettering the 2013 mark of 90,933 per game.

NU has ranked in the top 20 nationally in attendance each of the 17 years with available attendance figures.

NCAA RECORD SELLOUT STREAK ROLLS INTO 2016

One of the most remarkable streaks in collegiate sports continues in 2016. Nebraska has sold out every game at Memorial Stadium since Nov. 3, 1962, a streak of 349 consecutive sellouts, 100 more than second-place Notre Dame.

- Nebraska owns a 297-51 (.853) record during the sellout streak.
- Overall attendance during the sellout streak totals 26,440,170.

HUSKERS OWN BIG ADVANTAGE AT MEMORIAL STADIUM

Nebraska has rewarded the loyalty of its fans with great success at Memorial Stadium.

- Nebraska has won at least six home games in 23 of the past 29 seasons. NU is 163-28 (.853) at home in the last 28 seasons (since 1989).
- Nebraska's most recent perfect home season occurred in 2012.
- The Huskers are 13-7 in Big Ten home games since joining the league in 2011.
- In the past three decades, NU has had three home winning streaks of 20 or more games and overall has posted 41 unbeaten and untied home seasons.
- The Huskers are 532-147-20 (.775, 699 games, 127 years) in Lincoln, and 407-124-13 (.760, 544 games, 93 years) in Memorial Stadium (since 1923).

NEBRASKA AMONG NATION'S TOP ALL-TIME PROGRAMS

Nebraska is in its 127th season of college football and owns an 881-368-40 all-time record in 1,289 games (.699). Nebraska is one of 10 programs with 800 all-time victories, ranking fourth with 881 wins.

Since 1970, NU has compiled a 447-127-5 record, for a .776 winning percentage in 579 games.

- Nebraska ranks as the nation's winningest program over the last 40, 50 and 60 years.
- Since Nebraska's first football season in 1890, Husker teams have won 11 or more games 12 times, including seven times since 1993.
- Nebraska has won 12 or more games seven times, including three seasons with 13 wins (1971, 1994, 1997).
- Nebraska has 24 10-win seasons since 1970.
- Nebraska has 49 nine-win seasons in school history, including 41 since 1970 and 47 since Bob Devaney took over the Nebraska program in 1962. No other school in the nation has more than 32 nine-win seasons in that same time.

- NU was the first team in NCAA history to win 100 games in consecutive decades, leading the nation with 103 wins in the 1980s and ranking second with 108 wins in the 1990s.

- Nebraska ranks third in NCAA history with 52 all-time bowl appearances, while the Huskers rank in a tie for seventh with 26 bowl victories.

HUSKERS RANK IN TOP FIVE OF ALL-TIME AP RANKING

The Associated Press weekly poll began in 1936 and has been a fixture in college football ever since. This August the AP released an all-time top 100 for the first time, ranking programs over the history 80-year history of the poll.

Nebraska checked in at No. 6 in the all-time rankings and was one of three Big Ten programs in the top seven in the poll. Nebraska has appeared in 65 percent of all polls since 1936 and has been ranked No. 1 in 72 polls.

- In addition to the lofty rankings in the AP all-time top 10 poll, Nebraska was also recently recognized as a historically elite program by ESPN.com. In a late August article, ESPN.com identified Nebraska as one of one of eight "Blue Blood" programs in college football history.

NEBRASKA AMONG LEADERS IN AP NATIONAL TITLES

Alabama leads the nation by winning 10 Associated Press national titles since 1936, with Notre Dame (8), Oklahoma (7), Miami (5), USC (5), Nebraska (4) and Minnesota (4) next in line. While the Huskers were awarded the national title by the coaches in 1997, NU finished second to Michigan in the AP poll.

In 1970, Nebraska was awarded the AP national title, but not the coaches (Texas was first, Ohio State second and NU third) as the final poll was released before the bowl games were played. In the coaches poll (since 1950), NU is tied for fourth with Miami and Texas with four titles, behind Alabama (9), Oklahoma (6) and USC (5).

CONFERENCE CROWNS

Nebraska has won 46 football conference championships in school history. The Huskers won 13 conference titles under Tom Osborne and eight under Bob Devaney.

During its 15-year history in the Big 12 Conference, Nebraska won league titles in 1997 and 1999, and also appeared in the Big 12 Championship Game in 1996, 2006, 2009 and 2010. Nebraska was one of just three teams to capture two or more Big 12 titles in the first 15 years of the league, joining Oklahoma and Texas. Nebraska's six Big 12 title game appearances were second only to Oklahoma's eight. Nebraska made its first appearance in the Big Ten Championship Game in 2012.

A HOLIDAY TRADITION

Nebraska participated in its 52nd all-time bowl game with its appearance in the 2015 Foster Farms Bowl.

Nebraska is one of only five programs with 50 or more bowl appearances, and its 52 bowl appearances are third all-time, trailing only Alabama (62) and Texas (53).

- The Huskers have played in the postseason in 45 of the past 47 seasons.
- Nebraska appeared in an NCAA-record 35 straight bowl games from 1969 to 2003.
- NU owns a 26-26 all-time bowl record, and the 26 bowl victories rank seventh nationally.

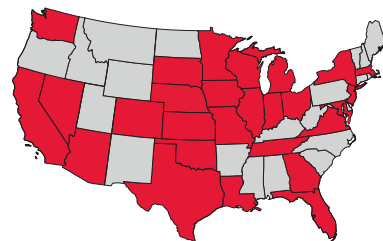
2016 SEASON NOTEBOOK

SCHEDULE NOTES

- The Big Ten Conference moves to a nine-game conference schedule in 2016. Nebraska and the other six members of the Big Ten West Division will play four home games and five road games.
- The Huskers' games against Maryland and Indiana will mark Nebraska's first conference matchups with those schools. The meeting with Maryland will mark the first-ever matchup between the teams.
- The Huskers' non-conference schedule is highlighted by the start of a home-and-home series with Oregon. The Ducks will visit Memorial Stadium on Sept. 17, completing a three-game homestand to open the season. Nebraska will make a return trip to Eugene in the 2017 season. The two meetings are the first between the schools since Oregon played in Lincoln in both 1985 and 1986.
- Nebraska will play seven games against teams that played in a bowl game last season, including New Year's Six participants Iowa (Rose) and Ohio State (Fiesta). The Big Ten Championship Game is scheduled for Saturday, Dec. 3, at Lucas Oil Stadium in Indianapolis.

COACHING STAFF NOTES

- The Nebraska coaching staff has one new full-time face for the 2016 season, but it is a familiar one to Husker fans. Mike Riley hired John Parrella as the Huskers' defensive line coach in February. A former Nebraska and NFL standout, Parrella returned to his alma mater after two seasons on the defensive staff at Northern Michigan.
- Parrella was an All-Big Eight defensive tackle for Nebraska and played 12 seasons in the NFL, including appearances in three Super Bowls.
- Defensive coordinator Mark Banker did not coach a position in his first year at Nebraska in 2015. This fall, Banker is coaching the Huskers' safeties, allowing Brian Stewart to focus solely on the cornerbacks.
- The Husker full-time coaching staff has numerous ties to the National Football League, led by Coach Riley. The Huskers have also added new faces in support roles with links to the NFL. Former St. Louis Rams General Manager Billy Devaney is the Huskers' Executive Director of Player Personnel and Special Assistant to the Head Coach. Roman Sapolu is in his second season as a graduate assistant with the program and is the son of Jesse Sapolu a member of four World Championship teams with the San Francisco 49ers. Chase Haslett is an offensive assistant in 2016 and is the son of long-time NFL coach Jim Haslett. James Rodgers, who played under Mike Riley at Oregon State, spent time in the NFL with the Atlanta Falcons. Rodgers has joined the program as a personnel assistant.



ROSTER NOTES

- Nebraska has a long history of attracting players from all parts of the United States, and the 2016 roster is no different. Nebraska has players from 27 states and Canada on its 137-player roster.
- The Huskers have 57 homegrown Nebraska players on the 2016 roster.
- The roster includes seven additional states with at least five players. Nebraska has 10 players from California, eight each from Florida, Louisiana, Missouri and Texas, and five each from Colorado and Illinois.
- Nebraska's 2016 signing class featured 21 players from 14 states, including multiple signees from California (4), Nebraska, Colorado and Missouri (2).

ACADEMIC NOTES

- Four Huskers are playing this season as graduate students. **Charles Jackson** (May, 2016), **Alonzo Moore** (August, 2016), **Michael Rose-Ivey** (August, 2016), and **Corey Whitaker** (August, 2016) have all earned their degrees. In addition, punter **Sam Foltz** (May, 2016) had earned his college degree before his passing in July.
- Nineteen additional members of the senior class are expected to pick up their undergraduate degrees in December.
- Nebraska posted a football Graduation Success Rate of 85 percent in 2015 to rank second in the Big Ten. Nebraska's GSR is the ninth-best among all FBS schools and third among public schools in the FBS ranks.
- Husker football players have combined for 107 CoSIDA Academic All-America awards. Nebraska football has produced more academic All-Americans than any other sport in NCAA history, while Nebraska leads the nation with 325 academic All-Americans across all sports.

Lincoln (Sept. 3) ---
On an emotional night for the Husker football program, Nebraska honored Sam Foltz in a 43-10 victory over Fresno State in the season opener.

On Nebraska's first series of the season, NU went three-and-out and was forced to punt, and lined up without a punter, as they honored Foltz, Nebraska's 2015 Big Ten Punter of the Year who died in a car crash in July. The sellout crowd of 90,013 roared as the play clock expired and Fresno State players applauded the Husker tribute, and declined the delay of game penalty.



Tommy Armstrong and Devine Ozigbo rushed for two touchdowns apiece, as Nebraska took control in the second half to give Mike Riley his 100th collegiate win.

Devine posted his first career 100-yard game, finishing with 103 yards on 17 carries, including first-half touchdown runs of 1 and 6 yards, while Armstrong scored twice in the second half and connected with Alonzo Moore on a 57-yard touchdown pass. The Huskers outscored the Bulldogs 29-0 in the second half. Armstrong rushed for 42 yards on 11 carries while also throwing for 108 yards and a TD. Moore was the biggest beneficiary, hauling in three passes for 92 yards while rushing for 34 yards on two carries.

Leading 14-10 at halftime, Nebraska's defense took over, forcing a three-and-out. The Huskers went 57 yards in nine players, capped by Armstrong's nine-yard scoring run, to push their edge to 21-10 on the opening drive of the half. The Blackshirts, who forced a trio of 3-and-outs in the second half, set up the Huskers' next score after a Kieron Williams interception. Two plays later Armstrong hit Moore in stride for a 57-yard scoring strike to give NU a 28-10 lead on the first play of the fourth quarter.

Williams totaled a career-high 10 tackles for the Huskers, while Ross Dzuris had a pair of sacks, as Nebraska limited Fresno State to just 128 second-half yards with 71 of those coming on the final drive after NU built a 43-10 cushion late in the fourth quarter.
