UW Harriers Set for Showdown in Bozeman

The University of Wyoming cross country team is back in action on Saturday, Sept. 17 at the Montana State-Bozeman Running Company Invitational after a two-week break from competition. Saturday's field features a number of regional foes while the next two events on Wyoming's schedule, the Roy Griak Invitational and Pre-Nationals, will include teams from across the nation.

Utah State will be Wyoming's lone conference opponent in Bozeman. The Aggies are ranked eighth in the USTFCCCA Mountain Region on the women's side, while USU's men's squad falls outside the top 15. Weber State is the highest regionally ranked opponent in both the men's and women's fields on Saturday, with the Wildcat men checking in at No. 10 in the USTFCCCA Mountain Region while the women are ranked fourth.

2016 Wyoming Notes

Head Coach Bryan Berryhill



Bryan Berryhill enters his fifth season as head coach of the University of Wyoming track and field/cross country programs in 2016-17.

During the 2015 cross country season, the former professional runner led the Cowboys to a fourth-place finish in the Mountain

West, tying the highest finish in program history. The men's harriers collected 89 points at the conference championships, just four points more than Wyoming's lowest total at a MW championship meet. Berryhill led the Cowgirls to a fifth-place finish at the MW championships despite having no seniors and just one junior in the team's top five.

Berryhill coached senior harriers Aaron Derner and Amos Bowen to USTFCCCA All-Region honors after each finished in the top 25 at the NCAA Mountain Regional meet. During the indoor track & field season, Wyoming collected eight individual All-MW honors while the women's squad earned All-MW status in the Distance Medley Relay. Hurdler Jordan Charles went on to become an Honorable Mention All-American in the 60-meter hurdles. Outdoors, the team earned four more All-MW honors and seven athletes advanced to the NCAA West Preliminary Round. Under Berryhill, Wyoming's studentathletes have notched 156 top-10 individual and relay marks in school history, including 11 school records.

Before Wyoming, Berryhill served as the head cross country and assistant track coach at Colorado State from 2006-2012. He was named the 2007 Women's NCAA Regional and Mountain West Conference Women's Cross Country Coach of the Year after the CSU women won their first ever team titles at the Mountain West championships and the NCAA Mountain Region championships in the same season.

He had a stellar collegiate career at CSU, earning 10 All-America honors in cross country and track. A national champion in the indoor 1-mile run and outdoor 1,500-meter run in 2001, Berryhill holds five individual and three relay records at CSU. He competed as a professional track athlete from 2001-04 and 2005-07.

The CSU women finished second or better at the MW Cross Country Championships in four of the six years of Berryhill's tenure. During his time with the Rams, he coached student-athletes to six school records and coached the only CSU woman to win a Mountain West cross country individual title with April Thomas' win in 2007.

Berryhill received his bachelor's degree in forestry from CSU in May 2001. He and his wife, Toni, have three children: Libby, Eli and Lainey.

Last Time Out: Women's Harriers Take Fourth, Men Fifth at CSU Invite

The University of Wyoming cross country team began its 2016 campaign Friday as the Cowgirls placed fourth and the Cowboys took fifth at the CSU Invite. Freshman Kacey Doner started her collegiate cross country career with a bang, crossing the finish line as the top Cowgirl, while junior Jonah Henry was the Cowboys' top finisher.

Doner, a Fort Collins native, finished 19th overall and 12th among collegiate competitors in the women's 5-kilometer race at the Hughes Stadium Cross Country Course. She was the top freshman finisher, crossing the line in 18 minutes, 28 seconds. Junior Quinn DeStefano finished just behind Doner at 18:35, good for 23rd place overall and 16th among collegiate competitors. Senior Megan Brunette was the Cowgirls' third finisher, taking 27th at 18:40, while sophomore Isabella Pape was close behind in 29th at 18:49. True freshman Calbi Ausmann showed promise as well, making the Cowgirls' top five after taking 33rd at 19:03. Overall, the Cowgirls contributed a solid pack split of 35 seconds en route to a fourth-place team finish behind Air Force, Colorado and Colorado State.

"I thought the younger kids raced pretty well. When we plug our top runners back into the equation, things are going to look really good," said head cross country coach Bryan Berryhill of the women's squad. "I think it was a solid start for a pretty young and inexperienced squad, and I think it'll be exciting when we plug those veterans back in."

Doner was rightfully pleased with her finish. "I was pretty nervous, and the start was kind of intimidating, but my teammates really helped with that," she said after the race. "I was really happy with how I finished. It was a good confidence booster."

Meanwhile, familiar faces lined the Cowboys' top five on Friday. Jonah Henry placed 16th overall and 12th among collegiate competitors, finishing the 5-kilometer course in 15:17 as he crossed the line wedged in a pack of nine runners that finished within a three-second window. Mike Seas was next for the Cowboys, taking 21st overall at 15:21 in what Berryhill said may have been the best race of his collegiate career.

"I thought he had a good race," Berryhill said of the redshirt senior. "I'm just proud of how hard he worked over the summer. He's in a good spot."

Seas mostly agreed with his coach's sentiments. "It was the best start to a season I've ever had," he said following the race. "It was an 11-second PR on the course, so I'm happy with it. I'm excited for things to come this season."

Sophomore star Ricky Faure crossed the line third for the Cowboys, clocking 15:24 for the 5K to finish 22nd overall. Freshman and New Zealand native Harry Ewing had a solid first showing at high altitude, finishing as the Cowboys' fourth runner with a time of 15:54. Sophomore Calum Kepler rounded out the Cowboys' top five, finishing in 16:12.

Berryhill is excited for the year to come, but knows his athletes have more to prove. "Overall, I leave here content with the day," he said Friday. "I definitely know we're still better than what we showed. Good news is, it's the first race and November's a long way away."

Fresh Leas

UW's freshman harriers contributed impressive collegiate debuts at the CSU Invite on Sept. 2, highlighted by Kacey Doner's team-leading performance for the Cowgirls. Doner was the top freshman in the women's field, outpacing the next-best freshman finisher by a whopping 27 seconds while finishing in 18 minutes, 28 seconds. She was one of only two freshmen in the women's field to finish as her team's lead runner. Freshman Calbi Ausmann also made the Cowgirls' top five, finishing the 5-kilometer course in 19:03.

Meanwhile, freshman Harry Ewing was the Cowboys' fourth finisher in his first collegiate race after coming to UW from New Zealand. Ewing finished the 5-kilometer course in 15:54, taking 32nd among collegiate competitors.

Sticking Together

The Wyoming Cowgirls posted the lowest pack split of any women's team at the CSU Invite, with just 35 seconds ticking off the clock between the finishes of Kacey Doner (UW's No. 1 finisher) and Calbi Ausmann (UW's No. 5 finisher). Northern Colorado had the next-best pack split at 43 seconds, while Air Force and Colorado State each recorded 56-second spans between their first and fifth runners crossing the finish line.

Cowboys Ninth, Cowgirls 11th in USTFCCCA Week 1 Mountain Region Rankings

The Wyoming men's and women's squads remained stationary in the USTFCCCA Week 1 Mountain Region Rankings, with the Cowboys checking in at No. 9 and the Cowgirls coming in at No. 11. The men's Mountain Region rankings were entirely unchanged from the preseason rankings, while the women's rankings featured a couple of minor shake-ups after the first week of meets. Weber State, who the Cowgirls will compete against in Bozeman this weekend, dropped to fourth in the Mountain Region after being ranked third in the preseason.

Memory of the 8 Race Set for Sept. 16

The sixth annual Memory of the 8 Run & Walk, held in honor of the eight University of Wyoming cross country athletes who tragically passed away in an automobile accident in September 2001, will take place in Gillette, Wyo., on Friday, Sept. 16. The event will be held on the 15-year anniversary of the tragedy. Former UW runner Morgan McLeland, one of the eight who died, was from Gillette.

Participants have the option to take part in an 8-mile run or a 5-kilometer walk or run, each beginning at M&K Oil in Gillette. Registration will take place from 4:30 to 5:30 p.m. and is free to the public. The 5K run and walk starts at 5:00 p.m. MT, while the 8-mile run is scheduled to begin 30 minutes later. A barbeque and social will be held for participants after the conclusion of the races.

Six of the eight victims of the 2001 accident were Wyoming natives. The eight Cowboys who passed away on Sept. 16, 2001 were Cody Brown of Hudson, Colo.; Kyle Johnson of Riverton, Wyo.; Joshua Jones of Laramie, Wyo.; Justin Lambert-Belanger of Timmons, Ontario, Canada; Kevin Salverson of Cheyenne, Wyo.; Shane Shatto of Douglas, Wyo. and McLeland.
