COLORADO STATE - THE TEAMS AT A GLANCE - WYOMING

- Under the direction of second-year head coach Mike Bobo, who previously spent 14 seasons at Georgia, including the final 8 as OC.
- Returns 43 letterwinners and 13 starters from last year's team that went 7-6.
- 2015 Ray Guy Award finalist Hayden Hunt, an All-America P who has had 9 of his last 12 punts land inside the 20-yard line.
- After starting 3 different QBs in 3 weeks, freshman Collin Hill has emerged after going 36-of-57 for 497 yards and 6 total touchdowns in 2 starts.
- DB Braylin Scott has 3 interceptions in his last 3 games. He is 1 of 11 FBS players with 3 picks this season.
- LB Kevin Davis is the only FBS player with 40 tackles, 3.0 sacks and 2 forced fumbles.
- Is a perfect 14-of-14 when reaching the red zone.
- Has a three-headed rushing attack of Dalyn Dawkins, Izzy Matthews and Marvin Kinsey, Jr. Dawkins and Matthews combined for 1,678 rushing yards and 8 total scores in 2015.
- K Wyatt Bryan is 6-of-7 on field-goal attempts, including a career-long 53-yarder vs. UNC.
- 24 players have made their CSU debuts so far this season, including 7 true freshmen.
- Is 2-2 on the season, defeating Northern Illinois and UC Davis and falling at Nebraska and Eastern Michigan.
- RB Brian Hill, a junior, is 79 rushing yards shy of Wyoming's all-time record.
- On the season, Hill has 463 rushing yards (11th in FBS) and 6 touchdowns (8th).
- WR Tanner Gentry leads the Mountain West with 388 receiving yards (97.0 per game).
- QB Josh Allen leads the Mountain West with 6 passing touchdowns and 2nd with 866 passing yards and a .619 completion percentage.
- The Cowboys rank 10th nationally with 6 interceptions, including 4 vs. Eastern Michigan - 2 of which were returned for touchdowns. Every starter in their defensive backfield now has an interception.
- Conner Cain and Logan Wilson each have a fumble recovery on the season.
- Craig Bohl is in his 3rd season with the Cowboys, going 8-20, including 2-10 in 2015.
- RB Brian Hill, OL Chase Roullier and DB Andrew Wingard were all 2015 All-Mountain West selections.

BORDER WAR MOMENTS

- CSU and Wyoming share the longest continuous rivalry west of the Mississippi, with an unofficial 108th Border War meeting on tap this week. The teams' first meeting in 1899 was a CSU forfeit win, making this week officially the 107th meeting. CSU does not recognize forfeits in all-time won-loss records.
- The first meeting between CSU and Wyoming was Thanksgiving 1899 and ended in a dispute over rules. The Cowboys forfeited and the game never counted in the official record. The bad blood of 1899 spilled over into 1900 and again the two schools had a disagreement, this time over the eligibility of players. Although the rivalry continued to be cordial until after WWII, the first two meetings between the border schools signaled the beginning of the Border War.
- The 1924 game never occurred because Wyoming Governor William Ross died the week of the contest. Out of respect, both schools decided not to play that Saturday and due to scheduling conflicts were not able to make up the game. Since 1929, CSU and Wyoming have only missed playing one another three times, all during WWII.
- In 1949 and 1958, Colorado Field was the site of two near riots between fans from Fort Collins and Laramie. When the 1949 game ended, Wyoming fans tried to tear down the goalposts mainly because Colorado A&M fans had done so after the 1948 game in Laramie. When Aggies fans tried to prevent the posts from coming down, fights broke out and tear gas was unleashed on the crowd. In 1958, fans from both schools poured onto the field as they disputed a non-touchdown call that made the difference in the game. Again, tear gas had to be used to disperse the crowd.
- CSU Coach Sark Arslanian vowed to his Rams after the 1973 Wyoming game that they (the players in the room that day) would never lose to the Cowboys again. The Rams beat Wyoming in 1974, '75 and '76, winning the Bronze Boot for the first times since the traveling trophy was established in 1968.
- In 1990, the Pokes came to Hughes Stadium as a nationally ranked 9-0 team. The Rams were in the hunt for their first bowl bid in 42 years, and needed a win to keep their hopes alive. On that cold November day, CSU beat Wyoming, 17-8, in what has been called the greatest game ever at Hughes Stadium. CSU also became bowl eligible in 2008, by beating Wyoming in Laramie during the regular-season finale.

- CSU won the Border War for the third consecutive season, the first time the Rams have won in three straight years since winning four in a row from 1999-2002.
- CSU shut out Wyoming for the first 57:35 of the contest. The last time the Rams held an opponent scoreless into the fourth quarter was during a 58-13 victory over Air Force on Nov. 30, 2013.
- CSU scored on its first four possessions to jump out to a 23-0 advantage, never trailing in the game.
- CSU out-gained Wyoming, 348-239 (273-80 in the first half), including 228-130 on the ground.
- Wyoming RB Brian Hill entered Saturday ranked No. 2 in the NCAA FBS with 140.2 rushing yards per game. The Rams limited Hill to 65 yards on 21 carries.
- Senior safety Trent Matthews was in on three turnovers, recovering two fumbles and intercepting a pass.
- Sophomore RB Dalyn Dawkins rushed for a career-most 140 yards (25 carries, 5.6 average), including four consecutive rushes for 30 yards during the Rams' first scoring drive.
- Freshman RB Izzy Matthews had 16 carries for 55 yards and two touchdowns. He had a two-yard rush to give CSU a 7-0 lead and a 9-yard carry to put the Rams on top, 17-0.
- CSU had three sacks, including a career-most two by junior LB Kiel Robinson. The first caused a fumble and the second ended the Cowboys' final drive of the first half, sacking QB Nick Smith for a seven-yard loss on 4th-and-5 from the Rams' 28.
- CSU won the turnover battle (4-1) for the third time this season:
- During Wyoming's opening drive, LB Deonte Clyburn forced his second fumble of the season, with S Trent Matthews recovering the loose ball. The turnover set up a CSU field goal.
- Late in the second quarter, LB Kiel Robinson had a strip sack (career first), with DL Terry Jackson recovering the ball at the Cowboys' 17 (also a career first).
- On the first play of the fourth quarter, Matthews intercepted QB Nick Smith's pass. On the next defensive drive, Matthews recovered his second fumble of the game, which was forced by DB Tyree Simmons (second of the season).
- Freshman K Wyatt Bryan made two field goals (33, 31), extending his streak to seven consecutive makes.
- CSU went for it on fourth down twice in the first half, converting both times.
- Wyoming was 2-of-9 on third down. CSU entered the game ranked 21st nationally, allowing conversions on just 31.8 percent of opponent opportunities.
- CSU held possession of the ball for 37:20 (62.2 percent), including 21:01 (70.0) in the first half.

Colorado State University President Tony Frank announced the appointment of Mike Bobo as head coach of the Rams' football program on Dec. 23, 2014. Bobo is the 22nd head coach in the history of the program, and came to Fort Collins from the University of Georgia, where he had spent the previous 14 seasons, including the last eight as his alma mater's offensive coordinator.

In 2015 Bobo became the only head coach in program history to win seven regular season games in his first season at the helm. Bobo's Rams won four games in a row, and five out of six, to close the 2015 regular season season, securing CSU's third consecutive bowl invitation en route to a 7-6 record. CSU's four wins in the season's final month marked

the first undefeated November by a Rams team since 1948, and included three road wins—at Wyoming in his first "Border War," at New Mexico and at Fresno State. Five CSU players earned All-Mountain West honors under Bobo, including punter Hayden Hunt, who was one of three finalists for the Ray Guy Award. CSU ranked fourth in the FBS in net punting average (42.0) and 17th in kickoff return average (25.1). Bobo's Rams were one of only two FBS schools to have three running backs each record at least one game with 140 or more rushing yards (Dalyn Dawkins, Izzy Matthews and Jasen Oden, Jr.) and quarterback Nick Stevens set passing records for a CSU sophomore with 2,679 yards through the air and 21 touchdowns (fifth-most in school history).

Bobo's 14-year stint at Georgia, where he had starred at quarterback in the late 1990s, began in January, 2001, when head coach Mark Richt hired him as quarterbacks coach, for his second

stint with the school. He was promoted by Richt to offensive coordinator in 2007. During his time at UGA, Bobo helped lead the Bulldogs to 135 victories, including two Southeastern Conference championships, five SEC Eastern Division titles and eight bowl victories. The 2012 Broyles Award finalist held the offensive coordinator spot for 92 games with the Bulldogs, scoring 30-plus points 57 times, 40-plus points 29 times and more than 50 points 13 times.

In 2014 Bobo led a Bulldogs offense that averaged 41.3 points per game, which ranked eighth nationally, and racked up 457.8 yards of total offense per game. Against teams ranked in the Top 25, UGA compiled a 3-2 record while scoring 34.4 points per game. Additionally, the 2014 Bulldogs' offense ranked in the top 15 nationally in rushing offense, team passing efficiency, completion percentage, fewest interceptions, third-down conversion percentage and fourth-down conversion percentage. The 537 points scored in 2014 established a Georgia single-season record. The previous single-season record was set in 2012 while Bobo was offensive coordinator.

Bobo guided several talented quarterbacks at Georgia, including Aaron Murray, who played from 2010-13. Murray, who was chosen in the fifth

The 2016 season marks the third season Craig Bohl will lead the Wyoming Football program as head coach and marks his 14th year as a college head coach. Over the past two years, Bohl has focused on building Cowboy Football for the long term.

Bohl, who was part of building National Championship teams at North Dakota State and Nebraska, was introduced by University of Wyoming Athletics Director Tom Burman as the new head football coach of the Wyoming Cowboys on Sunday, Dec. 8, 2013. Bohl became the 32nd head football coach in University of Wyoming history.

He came to Wyoming after building a national power at North Dakota State as a head coach for 11 seasons from 2003-13. His teams won three consecutive National Championships at the NCAA Football Championship Subdivision (FCS) level in 2011, '12 and '13. NDSU became only the second FCS school in NCAA history to win three consecutive national football titles, tied the FCS record for consecutive wins (24 from 2011-13) and became the first undefeated FCS National Champion since 1996.

Not only has Bohl won three national titles at the FCS level, but he was the linebackers coach at his alma mater, Nebraska, when the Huskers won the 1995 and 1997 National Championships. Bohl concluded his career as head coach of the NDSU Bison, with a 104-32 (.765) record. He guided the Bison to the FCS Playoffs each of his final four seasons, posting a 14-1 record in the FCS Playoffs. His last three teams posted records of 14-1 (2011), 14-1 (2012) and 15-0 (2013) for a combined record of 43-2 (.956) on way to their three consecutive FCS national titles.

By winning the 2013 FCS National Championship, North Dakota State extended its winning streak to 24 consecutive games, which tied both the NDSU and FCS records for consecutive victories. The Bison teams from 1964-66 originally set the school record with 24 straight victories. The University of Pennsylvania set the FCS record of 24 consecutive wins from 1992-95. That record was later tied by Montana from 2001-02. The 2013 NDSU team also set a North Dakota State single-season record for wins, posting a perfect 15-0 record. The Bison became the first undefeated FCS National Champion since Marshall went 15-0 to win the 1996 FCS title.

The Bison had great success against FBS teams to go with their elite status at the FCS level. In each of his last four seasons at NDSU, Bohl's Bison defeated all four of the FBS teams they faced, and captured all of those wins on the road. NDSU won at Kansas in 2010 (by a score of 6-3), at Minnesota in 2011 (37-24), at Colorado State in 2012 (22-7), and at Kansas State in 2013 (24-21). Overall during his 11 years at North Dakota State, Bohl's teams built a 7-3 record against FBS teams.

In 2012 and '13, Bohl received both The Sports Network Eddie Robinson FCS National Coach of the Year Award and the American Football Coaches Association (AFCA) FCS National Coach of the Year Award. He became the first coach in the first 27 years of the Eddie Robinson Award to win it in consecutive seasons. In 2013, he also received the Liberty Mutual FCS Coach of the Year Award, which is presented in partnership with the National Football Foundation and College Football Hall of Fame. His other National Coach of the Year honor came in 2006, when he was recognized by the Football Gazette as the FCS National Coach of the Year and the Northwest Region Coach of the Year.

He was also a finalist for The Sports Network Eddie Robinson Award in 2011, 2007 and 2006, and was the 2011 and 2013 AFCA Region 4 FCS Coach of the Year. Bohl was selected to the American Football Coaches Association Board of Trustees by a vote of the membership at the 2012 AFCA national convention.

His North Dakota State teams were built on an exciting West Coast offense and a physical, aggressive defense. In the 2013 season, North Dakota State's offense ranked No. 7 in the nation in rushing offense (257.3 yards per game), No. 10 in scoring offense (38.7 points per game) and No. 14 in total offense (457.5 ypg). The Bison defense ranked No. 1 in the nation in scoring defense (11.3 points allowed per game), No. 2 in the nation in pass defense efficiency (97.59 rating), No. 3 in rushing defense (91.3 yards allowed per game) and were No. 3 in total defense (255.9 yards allowed per game). The Bison led all FCS teams in scoring defense three consecutive seasons (2011-13).

In addition to his 14 years of experience as a head coach, Bohl has 19 years of experience as a full-time assistant coach at the collegiate level and three seasons as a graduate assistant. His last eight years as an assistant coach were spent at Nebraska. He was the linebackers coach under head coach Tom Osborne for five of those seasons and was part of the 1995 and '97 Nebraska National Championship teams. Bohl's final three seasons (2000-02) at Nebraska, he served as the Cornhuskers' defensive coordinator under head coach Frank Solich, before accepting the head-coaching job at North Dakota State in 2003. Bohl was part of 11 bowl-game appearances while at Nebraska -- eight as an assistant coach from 1995 to 2002 and three as a graduate assistant coach for the Huskers from 1981-83.

As the defensive coordinator and linebackers coach at Duke in 1994, he helped coach the Blue Devils to the Hall of Fame Bowl in his only season at Duke.

Bohl's North Dakota State teams were ranked in The Sports Network or FCS Coaches Top 25 polls for 107 weeks since beginning FCS play in 2004, and earned the No. 1 ranking in both the final 2011, 2012 and 2013 polls, including being named a unanimous No. 1 following the 2013 campaign. The Bison's record versus FCS Top 25 ranked teams under Bohl's direction was 30-8.

From 2004-2007, Bohl helped lead North Dakota State through its transition to the NCAA FCS level. During that transition period, his teams posted back-to-back 10-1 seasons in 2006 and 2007, but weren't eligible for postseason play due to NCAA rules regarding teams moving up a division.

Bohl grew up in Lincoln, Neb., and went on to attend the University of Nebraska where he was a reserve defensive back from 1977 to 1979 under head coach Tom Osborne. Bohl was part of Nebraska's 1979 Orange Bowl and 1980 Cotton Bowl teams.

Born July 27, 1958, Bohl will be 58 years old when the 2016 season kicks off. He earned his bachelor's degree in business administration from Nebraska in 1982. Bohl's family includes wife Leia, and children Mallory and Morgan, Aaron and Elijah.

round of the 2014 NFL Draft by the Kansas City Chiefs, set more than 25 UGA records and four SEC marks. The NFL's No. 1 draft choice in 2009, Matthew Stafford, also blossomed under Bobo's tutelage. The Detroit Lions' starting quarterback was second-team All-SEC and earned All-America recognition in 2008 for Georgia and was MVP of the 2009 Capital One Bowl. In Bobo's time at Georgia he also mentored quarterback David Greene (2001-04), who was the winningest quarterback in NCAA Division I history at the time (42), wide receiver A.J. Green, running back Todd Gurley and many others. In all, Bobo helped mold four first-round NFL draft choices at Georgia: Stafford (No. 1 in 2009), running back Knowshon Moreno (No. 12 in 2009), Green (No. 4 in 2011) and Gurley (No. 10 in 2015).

Prior to joining Richt's staff in Georgia, Bobo served one year as an assistant coach at Jacksonville State, after working as an administrative assistant and graduate assistant from 1998-99 at UGA. Bobo was a quarterback for the Bulldogs from 1994-97, earning four letters, and led the team in passing in 1996 and '97. Among all UGA quarterbacks, Bobo ranks first in single-season completion percentage (65% in '97), single-season passing efficiency rating (155.8 in '97), second in career touchdown passes (38) and third in career pass completions (445), season passing yards (2,751 in '97), career passing yards (6,334) and single-season touchdown passes (19). In his career Bobo threw for 6,334 yards, which is third-most all-time by a Georgia quarterback.

Bobo and his wife, Lainie, have five children, a son Drew (12), triplets Olivia, Jake and Ava Grace (10); and Kate (8).

BORDER WAR

The Rams and Cowboys will play for the 107th time on Saturday (in addition to a 1899 Wyoming forfeit), a series that dates back to 1899. Not only is it the longest continuous rivalry west of the Mississippi River – playing every season since 1946 – but it is also the Rams' longest active series. CSU has played – and beaten – Wyoming more than any other opponent.

Series Notes:

- CSU and Wyoming have met on the gridiron 106 times (in addition to a Wyoming forfeit in 1899 in the series' first meeting).
- All-time, the Rams hold a 57-44-5 advantage over their rivals to the north, including a 31-21-1 mark in Fort Collins.
- Since the start of the Sonny Lubick Era in 1993, CSU has won 15 of 23 meetings in the series.
- The teams are 24-24 since the Bronze Boot became the official traveling trophy in 1968.
- CSU has won the rivalry game each of the past three seasons, out-scoring Wyoming 123-60, and totaling 1,415 yards of offense. The Rams have not trailed during their three-game winning streak in the series.

Several Rams have had notable games against the Cowboys:

- In his first Border War, RB Dalyn Dawkins rushed for a career-best 140 yards in 2015.
- Spelling Dawkins, freshman Izzy Matthews rushed for 55 yards and two touchdowns.
- DB Tyree Simmons had 13 career tackles in three games against Wyoming, in addition to a forced fumble.
- LB Kiel Robinson had two sacks and a forced fumble in the Rams' 2015 victory.
- Wyatt Bryan is 2-for-2 on field-goal attempts vs. the Cowboys.
- In 2014, WR Xavier Williams caught three passes for 39 yards and a touchdown.
- LB Bryan Ohene-Gyeni recorded his first career sack vs. Wyoming, in the 2014 meeting.

UP FOR GRABS

Since 1968, the Bronze Boot has become possibly the most famous piece of footwear in college football history. This U.S. Army combat boot, gilded in bronze, is the traveling trophy that goes to the winning football team every year when CSU and Wyoming square off. In the 48 years the boot has been exchanged, the series is tied 24-24.

Few fans of both schools realize the history behind this famous boot before it became the trophy both schools live for each and every football season. It started as a United States-issued Army combat boot to Captain Dan Romero. Romero, a native of Colo-



rado and 1955 graduate of Pueblo Central High School, attended Pueblo Junior College for two years before he graduated from Adams State College. While at Adams State, he met his wife and played varsity basketball and baseball.

As the war in Vietnam heated up and a draft was imminent, Romero joined the Army before he was drafted. He then attended Officer Candidate School (OCS), where he received his commission to become an officer. Romero was then sent to Vietnam for a tour of duty and in the spring of 1968 he returned to the U.S., where he was assigned to the Colorado State University ROTC Military Science Department as an assistant professor. Since he was at CSU as an assistant professor, Romero enrolled as a graduate student as expected when officers are assigned to ROTC duty.

In 1968, CSU Army ROTC cadre member Major Vic Fernandez came up with the idea of having a trophy fitting of the rivalry between CSU and UW, an authentic, battle-tested combat boot. Romero, by then a CSU Army ROTC graduate and cadre member, donated a combat boot he wore during his 1966-67 tour in the Vietnam conflict. Romero had the boot bronzed and mounted on a walnut base in 1968. The base bears a plaque that holds the history of the Bronze Boot series. Close inspection of the boot will reveal small tears and cuts – scars of battle that have remained on the 50-year-old boot through the bronzing process and 48 years of travel between the rival universities.

Romero's son, Jeff, is a Rocky Mountain High School graduate and walked onto the CSU football team in 1982 before following in his dad's footsteps in the Army. Jeff now is an FBI agent.

BRONZE BOOT RUN

Every year Army ROTC cadets from CSU and UW run the game ball from the visiting team's stadium to the site of the Border War game and guard the trophy until the game is over.

This year's Border War pits Colorado State against Wyoming for the 107th meeting (CSU doesn't recognize the 1899 forfeit win, or any forfeit in its all-time records), and extends the battle for the Bronze Boot in its fifth decade. On Friday, the Wyoming Army cadets will run the game ball from Memorial Stadium 26 miles to the Colorado-Wyoming border on U.S. Highway 287. The cadets will then hand the ball off to CSU ROTC cadets, who will run the remaining 39 miles to Sonny Lubick Field at Hughes Stadium.

HOME SWEET HOME

CSU won its final home game of the season in 2015 – part of a four-game win streak overall – and has started its final season at Hughes Stadium with back-to-back wins. All-time, the Rams are 141-111 (.560) at Hughes Stadium, winning 13 of their last 16 games dating back to the 2013 season.

SEEING RED

CSU was a perfect 3-for-3 in the red zone at Minnesota (9/24), scoring three touchdowns. On the season, the Rams are also perfect, scoring all 14 times they've reached the opponent's 20-yard line (10 touchdowns, 4 field goals).

BRAYLIN THE BALL MAGNET

Sophomore DB Braylin Scott is one of 10 players nationally with three interceptions this season, picking off one pass in each of the

last three games. His first career interception came late in the Rams' victory over UTSA (9/10), ending the Roadrunners' last-minute drive and sealing CSU's victory. A week later vs. Northern Colorado (9/17), Scott ended the Bears' opening drive with an interception that was returned 36 yards and led to a CSU touchdown.

After punting late in the first half at Minnesota, the Gophers' drive lasted just two plays, with Scott intercepting Mitch Leidner's pass near midfield. With 53 seconds left until halftime, the Rams had an opportunity to cut the Gophers' lead to a single score, but Wyatt Bryan's field-goal attempt went wide left on the final play of the half.


WATSON GETS THE MESSAGE

After recording just a single tackle in the season opener vs. Colorado (9/2), starting linebacker Josh Watson was told by defensive coordinator Marty English that he would need to earn his starting job back. Junior Patrick Elsenbast started in Watson's place in Week 2 vs. UTSA (9/10), but while splitting snaps with Elsenbast, Watson proved he belonged in the starting lineup again, posting eight tackles including a half sack.

Starting again vs. Northern Colorado (9/17), Watson set a career high with 10 stops, two being for lost yards. That total lasted one week, as he posted 12 at Minnesota, again with two tackles for lost yards. His biggest plays came late in the first half when the Gophers had 1st-and-goal from the 2-yard line. On first down, Watson and senior LB Kevin Davis stuffed Minnesota RB Rodney Smith for no gain, and after a 1-yard loss on second down, Watson tackled QB Mitch Leidner for a seven-yard loss on third down, forcing the Gophers into a field goal.

HUNT CAN PUNT

All-America P Hayden Hunt, a 2015 finalist for the Ray Guy Award, continues to impress when the Rams need to flip the field. It happened seven times against UTSA (9/10), with Hunt averaging 46.7 yards per boot, placing five inside the Roadrunners' 20-yard line and two inside the 10. A pair of punts went 50-plus yards, including a 59-yarder that



went out of bounds on the fly at the 6-yard line. For his performance, he was named the Ray Guy Award Punter of the Week – his second career weekly honor. Against Northern Colorado, he was needed just once – on the Rams' first drive of the game – but it was perhaps his best punt of the season, traveling 51 yards and touching down at the 2-yard line before bouncing up, being fielded by a teammate and marked down at the 1. On the season, Hunt's 44.5 net punting average ranks 19th in the NCAA FBS.

As a junior in 2015, he ranked fifth nationally, averaging 46.0 yards per punt, while the Rams' team net punting average of 42.0 ranked fourth in all of college football. Of Hunt's 52 punts as a junior, 15 went at least 50 yards (28.8%), 24 (46.2%) were marked down inside the 20-yard line, 18 were fair caught (34.6%) and just one was a touchback (1.9%). Among the 10 initial semifinalists for the award, Hunt ranked first for percentage of punts inside the 20 and fewest touchbacks, second for net average and fourth for gross average. He entered his senior season as the nation's top punter, according to ESPN and Sporting News, and is also a member of the 2016 Ray Guy Award watch list.

HUNT CAN THROW

During the Rams' annual media day in August, All-America punter Hayden Hunt joked with writers that he was the team's 16th-string quarterback. He may have moved up after Saturday's game vs. Minnesota (9/24), converting a fake punt for a 29-yard gain. Hunt received the snap, but instead of punting, threw it across the middle to DB Braylin Scott – who hauled in his first career reception. The play came at a critical time in the game. Trailing by 14 in the fourth quar-



ter, CSU faced 4th-and-5 from its own 30-yard line. Six plays after the fake punt, the Rams scored to cut the deficit to a single score with 6:24 to play.

BRYAN REMAINS RELIABLE

Sophomore K Wyatt Bryan missed his first field goal of the season at Minnesota (9/24) – a 46-yard attempt – but rebounded with a 41-yard make later in the game. He is now 6-of-7 on the season, including three makes over 40 yards and a career-long 53-yarder vs. Northern Colorado (9/17). His .857 success rate is the 20th-best percentage in the country.

Dating back more than a year, to Sept. 26, 2015, Bryan has made 18 of his last 21 field goal attempts.

NEW TARGETS

Of CSU's 12 touchdowns this season, six have been scored by players who were not on the Rams' roster a year ago, including two apiece by freshman RB Marvin Kinsey, Jr. and junior college WR Michael Gallup. Another touchdown has been scored by WR Marcus Wilson – a converted safety who made his collegiate debut this season – and another by senior WR Robert Ruiz – who missed last season with an injury and had zero career receptions entering 2016. WRs Elroy Masters, Jr. and Olabisi Johnson also have touchdown receptions; they entered the year with one career touchdown apiece. Additionally, all six touchdown passes have been thrown by newcomers.

STAYING DISCIPLINED

CSU ranked 113th nationally in 2015, averaging 69.1 penalty yards a game. The Rams were flagged just three times at Minnesota (9/24), and four weeks into the season rank 20th nationally with just 5.00 penalties averaged per game.

DAVIS AMONG NATION'S BEST

Senior LB Kevin Davis led the Rams with 101 tackles and 14.0 tackles for loss in 2015 – figures that both ranked in the top 10 in the Mountain West. He was encouraged to take the next step, however, especially after fellow linebacker Deonte Clyburn went down with a likely season-ending illness.



Davis has risen to the occasion through four weeks, totaling 41 tackles, 3.0 sacks and two forced fumbles. In the opener against Colorado (9/2), he posted a career-most 19 tackles – the most by a Rams defender since Max Morgan (20) at Utah State in 2013. A week later vs. UTSA (9/10), Davis stole the show by being in on four sacks, including three in the fourth quarter alone – one of which was a strip sack.

His 10.3 tackles-per-game average ranks 18th nationally, while his 25 solo stops rank 12th. Davis is one of 11 players nationally to average at least 0.75 sacks and force at least two fumbles this season.

KINSEY ADDS TO THE MIX

The Rams returned RBs Dalyn Dawkins and Izzy Matthews in 2016 – a duo that combined for 1,457 rushing yards during their debut seasons in 2015. Both have been reliable this fall – totaling 168 and 171 rushing yards, respectively, in addition to a touchdown run apiece – but have also been slowed by injuries.

Enter freshman Marvin Kinsey, Jr., who has 165 rushing yards and the first two scores of his career, averaging 4.3 yards per carry. Kinsey led all Rams with 97 rushing yards in a win over Northern Colorado (9/17).

BAUTA'S ROLE

Senior QB Faton Bauta's role as the Rams' signal caller may have lessened after being replaced during a Week-2 start vs. UTSA (9/10), but head coach Mike Bobo continues to find packages for the dual-threat quarterback. Bauta rushed eight times for 78 yards through the Rams' first two games, and during Week 4 at Minnesota (9/24), he had more opportunities to move the ball with his feet, rushing six times for 33 yards, including three carries of at least nine yards.

Bauta ignited the Rams' second-half opening drive, rushing for nine yards on the first play – a drive which ended with a touchdown. He also had a nine-yard rush during the Rams' next drive – also a score.

DEFENSIVE STOPS WHEN NEEDED

Despite being criticized for missed tackles during a loss at Minnesota (9/24), the Rams' defense rose to the occasion and made plays when the team needed them most. After the Gophers took a 14-7 lead, they were limited to just 44 total yards and three points over their next four drives, a span of more than 28 minutes. The three points could have been more, but facing 1st-and-goal from the 2-yard line, the defense stopped RB Rodney Smith twice for no gain and a lost yard before QB Mitch Leidner was tackled for a seven-yard loss on third down.

Again, the defense was at its best in the fourth quarter when CSU needed a stop after scoring to cut the Gophers' lead to a single score with 6:24 to play. Minnesota was limited to just three plays and zero yards, and had to punt right away.

COSTLY TURNOVERS

CSU's season turnover margin of minus-2 isn't where the Rams want it to be, but it's four turnovers better than it was at this point last season, and also includes a game vs. UTSA (9/10) in which the Rams did not lose the ball at all. The problem, however, is the result of the turnovers. Opponents have scored 30 points off of the Rams' seven miscues, including 10 in a seven-point loss at Minnesota (9/24). CSU has scored seven points off of opponents' five turnovers.

ROAD WARRIORS

CSU's loss at Minnesota (9/24) was its first road loss in nearly an entire calendar year, last falling in a true road game at Utah State on Oct. 3, 2015. Still, CSU has won 10 of its last 15 true road games dating back to the 2013 season – its best stretch since also accomplishing the feat during the 2001-03 seasons. Prior to the Rams' current run, they had lost 10 true road games in a row and 21 of 23.

FIRST-TIME ACTION

One player made his collegiate debut at Minnesota (9/24), upping the team's season total to 24 first-year players: DB Robert Awunganyi, DB Jack Bares, WR Detrich Clark, TE Dalton Fackrell, LB Justin Falls, WR Michael Gallup, LB Anthony Giusti, K Tavis Guerra, WR Anthony Hawkins, QB Collin Hill, DL O'Shea Jackson, LB Arjay Jean, DL Richard King, RB Marvin Kinsey, Jr., LB Deshon Mayes, DL Toby McBride, LB Max McDonald, DL Justin Nunez, FB Nate Ryken, OL Jeff Taylor and WR Marcus Wilson have made their collegiate debuts; transfers QB Faton Bauta and OL Paul Thurston made their CSU debuts vs. Colorado.

HILL'S HISTORIC DEBUT

After inconsistent quarterback play through the first two games, head coach Mike Bobo named true freshman Collin Hill the Rams' quarterback for their game vs. Northern Colorado. Hill was phenomenal completing 21-of-27 passes for 315 yards and four touchdowns. He added a fifth touchdown on the ground, rushing 51 yards into the end zone.



- His 315 passing yards were the most ever by a CSU quarterback making his first career start.
- His 51-yard rushing touchdown was the longest rush by a CSU quarterback since Bradlee Van Pelt (79-yard touchdown run vs. Fresno State, 10/4/02).
- Hill's four touchdown passes – to four different receivers – are the third-most ever by a CSU quarterback.

SHUT-DOWN DEFENSE

CSU's defense did not allow a point for four consecutive quarters from the second half vs. UTSA (9/10) to halftime vs. Northern Colorado (9/17). The stretch, which lasted 65:04 and 16 drives, was the longest since 2011, when the Rams' defense shut out New Mexico in the second half before blanking Northern Colorado through the first half the next week.

GOING LONG

Through two weeks of play, the Rams' offense had just one play that went for more than 25 yards, but in the first quarter alone vs. Northern Colorado (9/17), CSU had three plays over 45 yards – the three longest plays of the seasons. In addition to quarterback Collin Hill's 51-yard touchdown run, he threw a 45-yard pass to junior Michael Gallup and a 50-yard pass to junior Xavier Williams.

X-FACTOR

Junior Xavier Williams, CSU's top-returning wide receiver with 231 yards in 2015, made his season debut vs. Northern Colorado (9/17), hauling in four catches for a team-most 91 yards. The biggest play was a 50-yard catch in the first quarter – the longest pass play of the season so far – which set up the Rams' first score.

ORANGE IS THE NEW GREEN

CSU honored its Aggie heritage during its game against Northern Colorado (9/17), as fans and the team wore orange in honor of the school's annual Ag Day celebration. Formerly the Colorado A&M Aggies (prior to 1957), CSU's uniforms represented the school's original colors of pumpkin and alfalfa.

Since 1981, Ag Day, which is hosted by CSU's College of Agricultural Sciences and Department of Intercollegiate Athletics along with Colorado Agricultural organizations and associations, is a non-profit event with proceeds furnishing scholarships to CSU agricultural science students. Prior to the game, Colorado

agricultural growers and producers prepared Colorado's premier outdoor barbecue from quality Colorado food products. While donning the orange uniforms in Orange Out, CSU is 7-0.

STREAKING IN HOME OPENERS

With CSU's win over UTSA (9/10), the Rams have now won four home openers in a row and eight of their last nine dating back to 2008. During CSU's four-game win streak in home openers, it is out-scoring its opponents, 171-65.

SECOND-HALF SHUTOUT

The Roadrunners (9/10) had seven drives in the second half with very little to show for them. In fact, they were held off the board, marking CSU's first second-half shutout since blanking New Mexico in the second half in 2011. UTSA's drives consisted of four punts, two turnovers on downs after getting stopped on 4th-and-2 and a late Braylin Scott interception to secure the victory.

ELROY'S BACK

After missing the final 11 games of 2015 with a broken collarbone, junior WR Elroy Masters, Jr. recorded his first catch in nearly a year vs. UTSA (9/10). He hauled in three receptions for 67 yards in the win, including a 45-yard leaping catch with 2 seconds left in the first half – CSU's longest play of the season at the time. After UTSA cut the Rams' lead to 17-14 with 20 seconds left in the half, CSU aired it out and it paid off. Masters' grab set up a field goal to give CSU a six-point lead at intermission.

One week later, vs. Northern Colorado, he earned his second career start and caught two more passes for 19 yards, including the second touchdown of his career.

JUST KEEP RUNNING

While UTSA (9/10) was limited to -1 rushing yards – the third-best rush defense in CSU history – the Rams piled on 220, including 193 in the first half. It was the largest first-half total since 2014, when CSU put up 209 first-half rushing yards vs. Tulsa. Against the Roadrunners, the Rams averaged 4.7 yards per carry and had four different players rush for at least 35 yards.

STOUT DEFENSE

CSU graduated all four of its defensive linemen from 2015, but fans wouldn't know that based off of the team's performance against UTSA (9/10). Coupled with an experienced linebacking corps, CSU limited UTSA's offense to:

- 14 total points, including zero in the second half.
- -1 rushing yards on 34 attempts, the third-lowest total in school history.
- CSU's six sacks contributed to UTSA's low rushing total, including a career-most 3.0 by senior LB Kevin Davis and the first career sacks by LB Evan Colorito and DB Justin Sweet and a sack for the second consecutive week by DL Jakob Buys.
- Just 235 total yards of offense, including 63 in the second half.
- Sophomore DB Braylin Scott's first career interception, a pick that sealed the Rams' victory in the final minutes.

NEW DEFENDERS STEPPING UP IN OPENER

CSU replaced eight starters on defense, in addition to its defensive coordinator. The Rams also switched their base front from a 4-3 to a 3-4. In total, six of CSU's 11 starters vs. Colorado (9/2) were making their first career starts, plus Jake Schlager who was making his second. Of the 20 defenders who saw playing time in the Showdown, 15 recorded career highs for tackles: Kevin Davis (19), Jake Schlager (11), Justin Sweet (8), Evan Colorito (6), Demontrie Taylor (5), Josh Lovingood (5), Jordon Vaden (4), Toby McBride (4), Johnny Schupp (4), Deshon Mayes (4), Jakob Buys (4), Patrick Elsenbast (2), Richard King (2), Shun Johnson (1) and Darnell Thompson (1).

In addition to tackles, Buys recorded his first career sack – a six-yard loss in the second quarter – while Davis, Mayes and Sweet forced their first career fumbles and Taylor recovered his first loose ball. Schlager had his second fumble recovery.

This Week in Hughes Stadium History Sept. 26-Oct. 1 | #FarewellHughes

September 26, 1998 – The Rams take on the UNLV Rebels and limp away with a 38-16 victory. Running back Damon Washington is sidelined with a foot injury, and despite an injured shoulder, Kevin McDougal takes on the bulk of the rushing duties and racks up 117 yards on the day.

September 27, 1969 – The Rams face Wichita State and crush the Shockers, 50-21, for the first win in Hughes Stadium history. Quarterback Chip Maxwell passes for two touchdowns, but it is sophomore Lawrence McCutcheon that impresses everybody. McCutcheon rushes for 213 yards on 13 carries setting a school record at the time, which today remains the ninth-best total by a Ram in Hughes Stadium.

September 28, 1968 – The Rams open up brand new Hughes Stadium against North Texas before an estimated crowd of 22,000. The new stadium replaces Colorado Field, which served as the home of the Aggies and Rams from 1912 to 1967. The new \$2.9 million facility is deemed "Showcase of the Rockies" for its location and new facilities. The Rams lose, 17-12, and would not have a home win until 1969.

September 29, 2005 – The Rams face Air Force and come away with a 41-23 victory over the Falcons. Running back Kyle Bell rushes for 197 yards and three touchdowns as the Rams cruise to victory over their in-state rivals.

September 30, 1995 – BYU comes to Fort Collins and their quarterback Steve Sarkisian is too much to handle as CSU loses 28-21 in a tough loss.

October 1, 1983 – The Rams hold on for a 31-28 victory over Utah in a game that sees 501 yards of total offense, including a then-record-setting 402 passing yards by quarterback Terry Nugent. The game comes down to the wire after Steve Bartalo scores with 3:34 left on the clock. Utah then takes over on the ensuing kickoff and drives the ball 77 yards to the Rams 3-yard line. On 4th and goal, CSU defenders stop the Utes on a play-action pass and take home their first victory in seven games.

HOT TICKET

A total of 69,850 fans attended the 2016 Rocky Mountain Showdown at Sports Authority Field at Mile High, home of the Denver Broncos (9/2). It was the largest attendance in the series since 2003 and fifth year in a row that the crowd has grown. CSU sold 34,167 tickets, the fourth year in a row that the school's total has risen and nearly double its total from just four years ago (18,169 in 2012).

4 IN A ROW?

The Rams aim to build upon last season's success at the end of the year and qualify for a bowl game for the fourth consecutive season – something that hasn't been done since doing it five years in a row from 1999-2003. All-time, CSU has played in 15 bowl games, including 14 since 1990, in addition to the 1949 Raisin Bowl.

The Rams qualified for the inaugural NOVA Home Loans Arizona Bowl in 2015 after winning their final four regular-season contests.

NEW FACES

Bobo and his staff signed one of the Rams' largest-ever recruiting classes this spring, featuring 23 players who are now wearing the Green and Gold. The class was ranked second-best in the Mountain West by Rivals, and features six JUCO players, two graduate transfers from Power-5 schools and 15 prep stars. The list spans players from 14 states and includes four players who enrolled in January and spent spring practices with the team. Bobo praised several of the players during fall camp, with 12 playing so far including six true freshmen.

In addition to the players, in February, Bobo named Jamie Bryant as the Rams' special teams coordinator. Bryant was most recently at Delaware State, and has nearly two decades of college experience, including nine seasons at Vanderbilt. During the offseason, Bobo also promoted Marty English to defensive coordinator (was previously CSU's linebackers coach) and named Joe Cox as tight ends coach (formerly an offensive graduate assistant). English served as CSU's co-defensive coordinator from 2012-14.

FRESH UNIS

During a fall training camp livestream, the CSU Rams debuted their new Under Armour uniforms, which include the athletic department's new letterhead and a Ram horn on the shoulder pads – an accent chosen by the players. The player's favorite threads were the green tops and green pants, a combination that hasn't been worn since 2008. Bobo mentioned that the new jerseys are made from a cutting-edge material and that CSU is one of just a handful of schools to wear it.

In December, CSU announced a long-term partnership with Under Armour, extending its current agreement with the global performance brand to be the exclusive outfitter for CSU's athletics programs through 2021. As part of the new long-term agreement, Under Armour will continue to exclusively design and supply the gameday uniforms, as well as footwear, apparel and training equipment for each of CSU's 16 men's and women's athletics teams. It includes alternate gameday uniforms that Under Armour will supply for the Rams, expanding upon the special Orange Out uniforms Under Armour has supplied for CSU's annual Ag Day game.

AWARDING SCHOLARSHIPS

During his brief tenure at CSU, head coach Mike Bobo has repeatedly said that if a player is working hard and making an impact on the team, he deserves to be on scholarship. The coach backed up his words during fall training camp, awarding four players with scholarships: DL Jakob Buys, FB Adam Prentice, WR Robert Ruiz and DB Eric Williams.

"A scholarship is something that is earned, and it's not something that we give away or take lightly," Bobo said. "You want to reward guys who work hard and are going to play a role on your team. Those players, not only do they work hard, but they're moving up on the depth chart and are continuing to improve. We wanted to show that we notice that."



#FAREWELLHUGHES

CSU is playing its 49th and final season at Hughes Stadium in 2016. The program will transition to its \$220-million on-campus stadium in 2017, located in the heart of CSU's main campus. Prior to saying goodbye to its home for the past five decades, however, the athletics department is celebrating the venue during its final season.

Fans are encouraged to use #FarewellHughes in their social media posts and to share user-generated content across all of CSU Athletics' social media channels, as well as through the Farewell Hughes microsite (www.CSURams.com/farewellhughes). Special features will be introduced both online and through social media to highlight all of the historic moments and the figures who played a key role in making that history. Select fans' memories and content will be shared on social media and on the video board on gamedays.

Each of the six home games at Hughes Stadium in 2016 commemorates a specific decade of the stadium's history.

The game-by-game breakdown:

- Sept. 10, vs. UTSA — Celebration of the 1960s and Military Appreciation Day
- Sept. 17, vs. Northern Colorado — Celebration of the 1970s and Ag Day/Orange Out
- Oct. 1, vs. Wyoming — Celebration of the 1980s and Border War/Bronze Boot
- Oct. 8, vs. Utah State — Celebration of the 1990s and Homecoming & Family Weekend
- Nov. 5, vs. Fresno State — Celebration of the 2000s and Take a Kid to the Game promotion
- Nov. 19, vs. New Mexico — Celebration of the 2010s and Final Game Commemoration

PORTER AMONG PRO FOOTBALL HALL OF FAME NOMINEES

The Pro Football Hall of Fame's selection process for the Class of 2017 has begun, and includes first-year eligible player Joey Porter. The 94 players and coaches will be reduced to 25 semifinalists in November and 15 finalists in January.

COLORADO STATE FOOTBALL



From 1995 to 1998 there were few players more feared in college football than CSU defensive end Joey Porter. In his four seasons in Fort Collins, Porter recorded 20 quarterback sacks, 28 tackles for loss, eight fumbles forced and one interception. As a senior in 1998, he was named first-team All-WAC. He went on to be drafted in the third round of the 1999 NFL Draft and played 13 years in the League, earning four Pro Bowl selections and a Super Bowl XL title. He became the first player in NFL history to record 10 career interceptions and 70 career sacks, and additionally, became the first player to register at least five sacks in 11 consecutive seasons. After a year as an undergraduate student assistant at CSU, he is now in his third season with the Pittsburgh Steelers, serving as outside linebackers coach.

COMING HOME IN 2017

After five decades of playing at Hughes Stadium, the Rams will bring football back to campus beginning in 2017. The new, \$220 million on-campus stadium will have a capacity of 41,000, and is located in the heart of campus, at the intersection of Pitkin and Meridian (Hughes Stadium is located approximately three miles west of campus). The state-of-the-art, multi-purpose stadium will have the ability to be used by multiple sports teams and will have an alumni center and academic space built in.

Site prep began in May 2015, and a groundbreaking ceremony took place prior to the Rams' contest against Minnesota last September. More than a year before kickoff, all Indoor Club and Outdoor Club premium seats were sold out, with a very limited number of other premium seating options still available. While stadium naming rights are still

The one-hour show is hosted by Voice of the Rams Brian Roth, and fans are invited to join Coach Bobo in person each week at the new C.B. & Potts location at the Foothills Mall. Fans also may submit questions via social media using the Twitter account @CSURamsRadio.

The show will run every week at the same time and location, with the exception of the bye week (Oct. 26) and the season’s final show, during Thanksgiving week, when it will take place on Tuesday, Nov. 22.

CATCH COACH BOBO ON TV

Thursday Night Football will take a backseat for Rams fans this fall. Each Thursday, from 6:30-7 p.m., the Rams Report is back for its fourth season on ROOT SPORTS, hosted by Kevin McGlue and featuring interviews with head coach Mike Bobo, highlights and analysis, and an inside glimpse into CSU football.

#NEXTLEVELRAMS

Colorado State has had multiple NFL Draft picks in each of the past three seasons and had nine former players on opening-week rosters. Weston Richburg returns as the Giants’ starting center and one of the best in the entire NFL. In 2015, he allowed just one knockdown and 12 combined pressures, the second-highest pass protection grade in the NFL. Fellow 2014 Draft pick Crockett Gillmore is poised for another strong season for the Ravens. He has 45 receptions and six touchdowns in 27 career games.



Shaquil Barrett played a significant role for the Super Bowl champion Denver Broncos, a team that also featured Kapri Bibbs, Ty Sambrailo and several additional CSU connections. After spending his first two seasons on the practice squad, Bibbs earned a spot on the Broncos’ 53-man roster last week, similar to Barrett a year ago. Sambrailo, coming off of injury after starting the Broncos’ first three games of 2015, is slated as Denver’s No. 2 left tackle and right tackle. Cory James is listed as a second-string linebacker for the Raiders, while Rashard Higgins (Cleveland) and DeAndre Elliott (Seattle) have opportunities to play during their first seasons in the League.

Additionally, 10-year NFL veteran Erik Pears spent camp with the 49ers after starting on their offensive line a year ago, and 2007 Draft pick Shelley Smith spent time training with the Bears. Recent graduates Sam Carlson (Tennessee/Denver), Kivon Cartwright (Tampa Bay) and Joe Hansley (Oakland) also played for their respective teams during the preseason.

RETURNING TO THE FIELD IN 2016

2016 COLORADO STATE RAMS

The Colorado State football team is fresh off of a third consecutive bowl game appearance, and returned 43 lettermen and 12 starters from its 2015 roster that posted a winning record for the third year in a row. While the Rams graduated two NFL Draft picks in 2015, plus four others who signed free-agent deals, they returned a nucleus of last year's success, especially in key positions on offense. Among those returning are second-team All-Mountain West recipients Hayden Hunt (punter), Nick Stevens (quarterback) and Fred Zerblis (offensive line).

BOBO'S DEBUT

Mike Bobo in 2015 became the Rams' only first-year head coach to win seven regular-season games. Overall, only Julius "Hans" Wagner (4-3 in 1942), Bob Da-vis (5-4-1 in 1947), Steve Fairchild (7-6 in 2008) and Bobo have led their teams to winning first-year records, with Fairchild and Bobo the only two to advance to a bowl game during their initial season.

STRONG RUN GAME

The Rams were one of two schools nationally to have three different running backs rush for at least 140 yards in a game in 2015, and two of them return in 2016. Dalyn Dawkins led CSU with 867 rushing yards (5.1 per carry), including an average of 111.5 per game over the Rams' final four regular-season contests. Dawkins also added 178 receiving yards, and against Colorado, became the first Ram since Raymond Carter in 2010 to rush for 100 yards and add 50 receiving yards in a single game.

Izzy Matthews, a true freshman in 2015, wasn't called upon early, but quickly forced himself into the regular rotation through his consistent production on the field. Matthews rushed for 590 yards on 97 carries (6.1 average), finding the end zone five times. The 590 rushing yards were the fifth-most ever by a CSU freshman. Perhaps his biggest strength, however, was his ability to run out the clock. Leading by 3 at Fresno State, he rushed for three first downs in the final 5:02 of play to secure the Rams victory.

Adding to the mix, CSU signed several young backs in February, including freshman Marvin Kinsey, Jr., who has rushed 12 times for 32 yards in his first two collegiate contests.

HOLDING THE LINE

CSU brought back four of its starting offensive linemen from 2015, a group that ranked 10th nationally by allowing just 4.6 tackles for loss per game, and 22nd with just 17 total sacks allowed. Aside from Sam Carlson (starting right tackle) and Kevin O'Brien (backup center), every member of the Rams' offensive line returned, including all-conference left guard Fred Zerblis, who is on the Outland Trophy Watch List, and center Jake Bennett, who is among those considered for the Rimington Trophy. Both were named to multiple publication's preseason all-conference teams.

In addition to the four returning starters, the Rams added veteran lineman Paul Thurston, a Colorado native who spent the first four seasons of his collegiate career at Nebraska. Thurston started the season opener vs. Colorado (9/2) at left guard.

KEY DEFENDERS

CSU graduated the majority of its defensive line and secondary, but its linebacking corps again can be a strength. Aside from losing NFL Draft pick Cory James, the linebackers are once again deep, led by senior Kevin Davis. Davis, an All-MW honorable mention, led CSU for tackles (101) and tackles for loss (14.0), and had a fumble recovery for a touchdown in the team's season opener. Joining Davis among the Rams' defensive leaders from 2015 are Tyree Simmons (team-most nine passes defended including an interception and two forced fumbles) and Kiel Robinson (4.0 sacks, one forced fumble).

SOPHOMORE SENSATION

First-year starter Nick Stevens broke a 31-year-old record in 2015, passing Kelly Stouffer for most passing yards by a Rams sophomore quarterback. Stevens had 2,679, in addition to 21 passing touchdowns – fifth-most ever by a CSU quarterback, regardless of class. Stevens' 21 touchdown passes led the Mountain West (36th in NCAA FBS).

The All-MW second-team selection also ranked second in the MW for passing yards, third for passing yards per game (206.1) and fourth for pass efficiency (138.7) and completion percentage (60.8). He had a career-most 310 passing yards in the 2015 finale, against Nevada in the Arizona Bowl (12/29).

2015 HIGHLIGHTS

- CSU had a winning record and advanced to play in a bowl game for the third consecutive season. The Rams faced Nevada in the inaugural NOVA Home Loans Arizona Bowl, which was played in Tucson, Ariz.
- Head coach Mike Bobo became CSU's only first-year head coach to win seven regular-season games during his debut season.
- After beginning the year 3-5, the Rams rallied to win their final four regular-season contests and become bowl eligible.
- CSU was 4-1 in true road contests, and since the 2013 season has won 10 of its past 14 on the road. It marks the Rams' best stretch since 2001-03. Prior to the current run, the Rams had lost 10 true road games in a row and 21 of 22.
- The Rams won two of their three rivalry games, earning back the Ram-Falcon Trophy with a Homecoming victory over Air Force and securing the Bronze Boot for the third year in a row with a dominating defensive performance at Wyoming.
- Punter Hayden Hunt earned All-America honors by several publications and attended the College Football Awards Show in Atlanta, Ga., as a finalist for the prestigious Ray Guy Award.
- 2014 Biletnikoff Award finalist Rashard Higgins concluded his CSU career after choosing to forego his senior season and enter the NFL Draft. The All-America wide receiver led the nation for touchdown receptions and receiving yards as a sophomore in 2014 and left CSU with eight school records to his name, including career receptions (239), receiving yards (3,649) and touchdown catches (31).

- Colorado State dropped its opening game for the first time since 2013. The Rams had previously won four of their past five openers dating back to 2011.
- A total of 14 players made their CSU debuts on Friday, including three freshmen and 12 players making their Division I debuts.
- CSU forced three fumbles in the game, recovering a pair. In the second quarter, Deshon Mayes forced a fumble recovered by Jake Schlager, and in the third Justin Sweet stripped the ball loose, recovered by Demontrie Taylor. Kevin Davis forced a fumble in the end zone in the first quarter, but CSU could not pounce on the loose ball, resulting in CU's second score.
- Both playing in their first game for CSU, QB Faton Bauta found WR Marcus Wilson for a 5-yard strike on fourth down on the first play of the fourth quarter. It was both player's first career touchdowns.
- Senior LB Kevin Davis had a career-most 19 tackles (17 solo), the most by a Rams defender since Max Morgan in 2013.
- Of CSU's 20 defenders to play Friday, 15 set career highs for tackles, including Kevin Davis (19), Jake Schlager (11), Justin Sweet (8) and Evan Colorito (6).
- DL Jakob Buys had his first career sack, a six-yard loss.
- RB Dalyn Dawkins rushed for 88 yards (6.3 average). In his two Rocky Mountain Showdowns, he is averaging 103 yards. Dawkins' one kickoff return went for 35 yards.
- WR Michael Gallup led CSU with 38 receiving yards on four catches.
- All-America P Hayden Hunt punted six times for an average of 43.3 yards, including two punts over 50 yards.
- In CSU's 14 Rocky Mountain Showdown losses since 1995, the Rams have finished with a winning record in 10 of those seasons.
- Nick Stevens started the game at QB, completing 6-of-20 passes for 31 yards and two interceptions. Faton Bauta had one series in the first quarter and took over for most of the second half, leading CSU to its only score. He finished 6-of-9 for 32 yards and one touchdown.
- CSU committed just two penalties for 15 yards.
- CSU was forced to punt after just three plays each of its first five drives. The Rams didn't record a first down until 5 minutes into the second quarter.
- Friday's attendance was 69,850 the highest total in the series since 2003 (76,219).

- CSU has now won four home openers in a row, and eight of nine dating back to 2008.
- The Rams improved to 2-0 all-time against UTSA.
- CSU held UTSA off the board in the second half, the first time that has happened since shutting out New Mexico in the second half on Sept. 3, 2011. In the second half, the Roadrunners were limited to 63 total yards over 33 plays.
- CSU trailed for just 5:05, taking a 10-7 lead two-thirds of the way into the first quarter and leading for the remainder of the contest.
- After not scoring until the second half of last week's opener, and not recording a first down until nearly 5 minutes into the second quarter, CSU got off to a hot start Saturday by recording a first down on its second play from scrimmage and a field goal on its first drive.
- CSU's 3-0 lead was the Rams' first lead of the season.
- CSU did not turn the ball over, winning the turnover battle 1-0 thanks to a late Braylin Scott interception – the first of the sophomore DB's career.
- The Rams out-rushed the Roadrunners, 220 to -1.
 - The Rams' 193 net rushing yards in the first half were the most since rushing for 209 in the first half vs. Tulsa (10/4/14).
- Senior LB Kevin Davis had 3.0 sacks on the day, including a strip sack, six tackles, two quarterback hurries and a pass breakup.
- Sophomore K Wyatt Bryan went 3-for-3 on field-goal attempts. He has made 15 of his last 17 field-goal attempts dating back to Sept. 26, 2015.
 - Bryan's 46-yard make with 2:24 remaining in the contest was a career long and gave the Rams a two-possession lead.
- All-America punter Hayden Hunt had seven punts, averaging 46.7 yards per punt. He had two that went 50 yards (long of 59) and five that were downed inside the 20-yard line.
- Junior WR Elroy Masters, Jr. led CSU with 67 receiving yards (three receptions), his first since Week 2 last season (Masters missed the majority of the 2015 season with a broken collarbone).
- True freshman QB Collin Hill entered the game early in the fourth quarter, completing an 11-yard screen pass to WR Olabisi Johnson on his first pass attempt.
- True freshmen DB Robert Awunganyi, QB Collin Hill and DL Arjay Jean made their collegiate debuts Saturday.

- CSU wore orange uniforms in honor of the school's original colors of pumpkin and alfalfa. The Rams improved to 7-0 in Orange Out games.
- CSU and Northern Colorado played for the first time since 2011. With the win, the Rams improved to 20-0-1 in the series.
- Making his first career start, freshman QB Collin Hill was 21-of-27 for 315 yards and four touchdown passes - to four different receivers - plus a 51-yard touchdown run.
 - Hill's 315 passing yards were the most by a CSU QB making his first career start.
- CSU's second score of the game came on a 51-yard keep up the middle by freshman QB Collin Hill. It was the longest rush by a CSU QB since Bradlee Van Pelt (79-yard touchdown run vs. Fresno State, Oct. 4, 2002).
- Hill's four touchdown passes are tied for the sixth-most in a single game in school history. They went to four different receivers, including the first career touchdown by WRs Michael Gallup and Robert Ruiz, and the second by WRs Olabisi Johnson and Elroy Masters, Jr.
- CSU's defense did not allow a point for four complete quarters (16 consecutive drives), dating back to the third quarter of last week's win vs. UTSA and into the third quarter Saturday.
 - The last time CSU kept its opponents off the board for four consecutive quarters was in 2011 (second half vs. New Mexico, Sept. 3; first half vs. Northern Colorado, Sept. 10).
- CSU's offense, which entered the game ranked 123rd in FBS averaging 276.5 yards of offense per game, more than doubled their season average by posting 569 (324 passing, 245 rushing).
- Wyatt Bryan connected on two field goals, including a 53-yard make as the first half expired. It was a career long, surpassing the 46-yard make on his most-recent attempt. The field goal was the tied for the ninth-longest in CSU history, and the longest since Jared Roberts (53) in 2014.
- Freshman RB Marvin Kinsey, Jr. scored his first career touchdown with a nine-yard rush midway through the fourth quarter. It capped an 80-yard drive in 4:34 - the longest and second-longest of the season, respectively.
 - Kinsey finished the game with 18 carries for 97 yards (5.4 average), the most this season by a CSU RB.

- The loss snapped CSU's three-game winning streak in true road contests. It was the Rams' best stretch since 2002. Overall, CSU has still won 10 of its last 15 true road contests, its best since also doing so from 2001-03.
- Sophomore DB Braylin Scott intercepted a pass in the final minute of the first half. He has now recorded an interception in three consecutive games.
- Junior WR Michael Gallup had a career-most six catches for 53 yards and his second career touchdown. The score cut the Rams' deficit to 7, 31-24, with 6:24 remaining.
- Four different receivers had multiple catches, including three grabs for 40 yards - both career highs - by senior TE Danny Nwosu.
- Two Rams defenders had double-digit tackles: Sophomore LB Josh Watson (career-most 12 tackles, 2.0 TFL) and senior DB Jake Schlager (10 tackles).
- Junior DL Darnell Thompson had a sack, the first of his career. The seven-yard sack forced Minnesota to punt with 4:19 to play in the game, giving the Rams the ball back down just one possession.
- CSU had 11 offensive plays go for more than 15 yards (7 pass, 4 rush).
- The Rams were 3-for-3 inside the red zone, improving their season figure to 14-for-14.
- CSU scored on its first three drives to open the second half.
- CSU's two turnovers resulted in 10 points for the Gophers.
- CSU's first score was a six-play, 75-yard drive - all carries - in just 2:10. Featured on the drive were three rushes of at least 18 yards, including Marvin Kinsey Jr.'s carry to the left side for his second touchdown in as many games.
- Late in the first half, Minnesota had 1st-and-goal from the 2-yard line, but was limited to a field goal after three defensive stops (-8 yards).
- After starting the second half with a solid defensive series, the Rams marched down the field for an eight-play score. All but four yards were on the ground, including the touchdown, a 2-yard rush by WR Detrich Clark, his first touchdown as a Ram.
- The Rams got to within one score (41-yard field goal by K Wyatt Bryan), 24-17, late in the third quarter, behind a 16-play drive that lasted 6:18 - both season highs.
- After Minnesota took a 14-7 lead with 8:59 remaining in the second quarter, CSU's defense allowed just 44 total yards over the Gophers' next four drives (28:47 in time).

2016 CSU FOOTBALL MEDIA COVERAGE GUIDELINES

We appreciate your coverage of Colorado State Athletics, and look forward to working with you to accommodate you and your organization within the framework of the following media policy. The policies are jointly established by Head Coach Mike Bobo and the Athletics Communications office. For your own benefit, please take a few minutes to read through the policies. Violations of these policies could result in revoked credentials or limitations on access. Please feel free to contact Asst. A.D. for Communications Paul Kirk at (970) 491-4672 or via email at paul.kirk@colostate.edu, at any time with any questions.

Interview access to players and coaches throughout the calendar year is as follows:

General policies

- All interviews with any member of the football program, including Mike Bobo, the coaching and football staffs, and student-athletes, must be coordinated through the Athletics Communications office.
- True freshmen and other student-athletes in their first year in the program are not eligible to be included on the regular interview list.
- Regarding unique subject matter, such as human-interest angles, members of the media are welcome to approach the Communications office at least 48 hours in advance with requests to interview any member of the program, provided the requested individual is not a true-freshman player. Requests approved by Coach Bobo will be granted.
- Members of the media are strictly prohibited from directly contacting any coach, staff member or student-athlete by any means, including text messages, e-mail, phone calls (cell, office or home) or social media, such as Facebook and Twitter, without first approaching the Athletics Communications office.
- For all practices, no live reporting of practice details is permissible, nor live streaming of any method. Upon conclusion of practice, questions based on observations made during the media viewing period may be asked of Coach Bobo, and reported on as answered by the coach.
- Designated student-athletes from the interview list will be made available on specified days during the spring and preseason practice periods (see schedule), and on Tuesdays and Wednesdays during the regular season.
- Head Coach Mike Bobo will be available following most practices. Exceptions include, during preseason camp, night practices on two-practice days.
- All interviews take place inside the McGraw Center/Moby Arena hallways located just inside the southwest Moby Arena doors near the weight room, or the media workroom. Media are not permitted in the football offices, or in the training room, locker room or meeting rooms unless arrangements have been made with the Communications office.
- Media may not photograph or report on individuals or groups participating in workouts outside of organized team sessions within campus practice or competition locations.

Spring practice

- Assistant coaches are available one time each, following practice, on the day designated in the media schedule issued by the Communications department.

Preseason camp

- Coordinators will be made available on Media Day, Aug. 10. No other assistant coach access is available during preseason camp.

Regular-season game weeks

- On Mondays, Head Coach Mike Bobo will conduct a weekly press conference on campus. Bobo will begin speaking at 12 p.m., followed by Offensive Coordinator/Offensive Line Coach Will Friend and Defensive Coordinator/Linebackers Coach Marty English at approximately 12:35 and 12:45.
- Following practice on Tuesday and Wednesday, student-athletes on the interview list will be made available, with either offensive or defensive players being available Tuesday and those from the other side of the ball on Wednesday. Regarding unique subject matter, such as human-interest angles, members of the media are welcome to approach the Communications office at least 48 hours in advance with requests to interview any member of the program, provided the requested individual is not a true-freshman player. Approved requests will be granted, but those interviews need to take place on Tuesday following practice.
- On Wednesday, Bobo will be available following practice.
- Following Wednesday availability, there is no further access to members of the program until the end of the game Saturday, except for contractual broadcast obligations.

Gameday

- Every member of the program must report to the locker room following the game before conducting interviews. Other than network TV and radio obligations, CSU does not allow on-field interviews in the minutes following the game's conclusion.
- Head Coach Mike Bobo and requested players will be available

to the media after a reasonable cooling-off period. Head Coach Mike Bobo will conduct his postgame press conference after a brief cooling-off period, and requested players from the interview list will be made available following Coach Bobo's press conference. Assistant coaches or true freshmen players are not available.

Recruiting period

- Access to Head Coach Mike Bobo will be less regular during this time, from the end of the regular season through signing day, the first Wednesday in February, due to recruiting responsibilities. Assistant coaches are not available during this period.

All other times

- Head Coach Mike Bobo is available either in-person or by phone, by appointment through Assistant A.D. for Communications Paul Kirk (paul.kirk@colostate.edu).
- All assistant coaches are unavailable other than the designated coach at the Monday press conference during regular season game weeks and on each coach's designated day during spring practice. That schedule will be issued prior to the start of spring ball.
- Phone calls (cell, office or home) to any coach, staff member, or student-athlete are strictly prohibited, unless previously arranged through the Athletics Communications office.
- Media should contact the Athletics Communications office, rather than the individual coaches and/or student-athletes, when needing personal contact information, such as phone numbers or e-mail addresses, or contact information for family members and friends where such interviews will enhance a feature story.

Injuries

- At all times throughout the calendar year, including spring practice, Head Coach Mike Bobo will serve as the sole source for injury information. All questions related to injuries should be directed to Bobo, and not to any other member of the program, including athletic trainers, doctors, the injured student-athlete, or his teammates.
- If Bobo is unavailable, please contact Paul Kirk.

Practice guidelines

- All Colorado State football practices are open for the first few periods unless otherwise noted. At a designated time after individual drills have concluded, the remainder of the session will be closed to the media.
- Videography, provided it is not live-streamed, is allowed during the media viewing period, but no sound may be recorded.
- No live reporting of practice details is permissible, nor live streaming of any method. Upon conclusion of practice, questions based on observations made during the media viewing period may be asked of Coach Bobo, and reported on as answered by the coach.
- During the spring, some scrimmages are open to the media. Fall scrimmages are not open.
- All media should remain on the sidelines, standing a safe distance from the boundary to prevent collisions. Also for safety reasons, media are asked to stand rather than sit or kneel, and should either hold personal bags or set them behind a barrier, so they are not a potential injury source for players or the media.

Photography/videography guidelines

- Cameras are restricted from shooting/filming any 11-on-11 period, as well as selected other periods (Athletics Communications staff will notify). Photography must be tight, "iso" shots that do not reveal alignments or strategy.
- No sound may be captured during the shooting of practice video.
- Photographers are allowed to shoot individual drills and group activity as directed by the Athletics Communications staff. No photography is allowed of players receiving treatment from medical staff, or of injured players, whether participating in individual workouts or observing practice.
- Photographers and videographers are not allowed to bring tripods onto the practice field.
- Photographers and videographers should remain on the sidelines, or behind the end lines. They are not permitted in any drill or in close proximity to any team or position-group huddles at any time.
- Photographers should stand a safe distance from the boundary to prevent collisions. Also for safety reasons, photographers are asked to stand rather than sit or kneel, and should either hold personal bags and/or camera equipment, or set them behind a barrier, so they are not a potential injury source for players or the media.
- All posed photo shoots must take place at times arranged prior to the beginning of practice, working through the Athletics Communications office. Posed photo shoots are not permitted during any practice.

Telephone interviews

- Head Coach Mike Bobo is available for phone interviews as time permits. Media should call to make an appointment through Paul Kirk (paul.kirk@colostate.edu).
- Phone calls (cell, office or home) to any coach or student-athlete

are strictly prohibited, unless previously arranged through the athletic Communications office.

- Media should contact the Athletics Communications office, rather than the individual coaches and/or student-athletes, when needing personal contact information, such as phone numbers or e-mail addresses.

- The official Web site of Colorado State athletics is CSURams.com, featuring the latest news, information, statistics, and rosters for all of the Rams' 16 athletic programs. Rams fans worldwide can also listen to the live play-by-play coverage offered by the Colorado State Sports Network through the website, and can watch livestreamed video of most home events. Fans can click on www.CSURams.com, then click on the schedule pages to access the radio broadcast for live radio coverage of football, volleyball and men's and women's basketball. For video, click "Watch Online." News also will be disseminated via the Colorado State football program's official twitter account, @CSUFootball, as well as the general athletics account, @CSUathletics, and Asst. A.D. for Communications Paul Kirk (@PaulKirk_CSU).

Media credentials

- Credentials must be requested through Paul Kirk in writing at least seven days in advance of an event. Approved requests will be mailed or can be picked up in the Communications office, or at the game.

Photographer credentials

- Photo credentials are issued only to accredited photographers. Passes must be displayed at all times. All photographers must remain outside the 25-yard lines on both sides of the field.

Game-day services

- A pregame luncheon is served 90 minutes prior to kickoff in the press box. In-game services include statistics and play-by-play information following each quarter and notes and statistics following the conclusion of the game.
- Hughes Stadium offers complimentary wireless Internet access. Check the seat-assignment label on press row for access information.
- The south tunnel contains a small photographer workroom with a table, chairs and several hard-line, high-speed Internet connections.

Parking

- Media parking is available at Sonny Lubick Field at Hughes Stadium in selected lots. Please contact the CSU Communications office to request a Hughes Stadium parking pass.
- Access to the parking lot immediately west of the McGraw Center will require an "A" permit from 7:30 a.m. to 4 p.m. weekdays. A limited number of single-day passes are available through the Communications office. Annual permits can be purchased through the Office of Parking Management Web site: <http://pts.colostate.edu>.
- The CSU Communications office will provide complimentary annual passes to this lot for select media organizations and members of the press who demonstrate a consistent willingness to cover the Rams. Those passes are not replaceable and should be treated like cash.

Stadium directions/will call

- Sonny Lubick Field at Hughes Stadium is located three miles west of the central campus at the base of the Rocky Mountain foothills, below the "Aggie A." The stadium is just south of Prospect on Overland Trail. From I-25, media should take the Prospect exit west to the mountains, then turn left on Overland Trail. Press box access is on the west side of the stadium via elevator to the fourth level.
- Ticket will call is located at the southwest corner of the south tunnel parking lot. There is no separate media will call. Provided arrangements are made in advance, passes will be left at the ticket will-call location.

- Please contact the CSU Athletics Communications office to request video highlights. Broadcast-quality video highlights and soundbites will be emailed to media frequently throughout the year by the Athletics Communications staff.
