Media Information

SIMPLE GUIDELINES: Ease of access that prioritizes each cadet's educational pursuits and rehabilitative treatment; make sure freshmen and sophomores have ample chance during the first half of the semester to acclimate with their class schedules and military squadrons; and simple to follow cadets during intramural and intercollegiate athletic practices and games.

MEDIA AVAILABILITY:

Football Practices: Air Force prefers open football practices. Frequently opening practices allow faculty, followers and service members a chance to be in the midst of drills led by coaches and performed by the cadets. In the bigger scope this access provides the opportunity to observe the training of officer candidates during an Academy mission element. Open practice guidelines include refraining of scouting for an opponent or reporting during practices to include injuries or tactics.

Cell Phone Use: Out of respect for those attending or participating in practices, while on the practice field during workouts please silence cell phones. If you need to take or make a call, please exit the field before doing so.

Video/Photography: Video and photography during practices can be done by those who are first cleared through the Air Force media relations staff. Starting August 29, video and photographers cleared through the media relations staff may shoot film during pre-practice and periods 1-5 on Mondays and Tuesdays.

Player and Coaches Availability: Open practices make it very easy to observe team members during athletic activities at the Air Force Academy. Player interviews prioritize each cadet's academic, military, squadron and leadership obligations in addition to any needed physical rehabilitation/treatment. Because treatment time may be necessary, players must physically complete the previous practice or game.

Seniors and Juniors: Starting August 29 eight junior and senior cadets will be accessible on Mondays on the field immediately after practice. Tuesdays eight others will be available before practice from 1-1:30 pm. in the media room.

Sophomores and Freshmen: Sophomores and freshmen are available following each game and every Tuesday starting October 11 (after middle of semester) before practice from 1-1:30 p.m. in the media room.

Coaches: Assistant coaches are available immediately on the field after practice from Aug. 29 to Sept. 19. Air Force Head Coach Troy Calhoun is available on Mondays immediately after practice on the field. He is also be available during his weekly media teleconference on Tuesdays from 12:30-1:00 p.m. in the Air Force Academy media room. Media should contact media relations for the call-in number to join the teleconference.

LAST SEASON

(Oct. 10, 2015) Air Force defeated Wyoming, 31-17, to snap a two-game losing streak to the Cowboys. Shayne Davern rushed for a career-high 130 yards and two touchdowns, including 101 yards in the second half, to lead Air Force. He scored his first touchdown to give the Falcons a 7-0 lead. Wyoming added a field goal to make it 7-3 at the half. The Falcons got a Karson Roberts touchdown run and a Jalen Robinette to Garrett Brown touchdown connection to make it 21-3 early in the fourth. Davern added his second touchdown on a season-long 46 yard run to make it 28-3. The Cowboys added two late touchdowns and Drew Oehrle added a field goal to make up the final margin. Air Force finished with 379 total yards, including 299 rushing. The Cowboys finished with 307 total yards. The Air Force defense was led by Claude Alexander, who had nine tackles and three sacks. Brodie Hicks added eight tackles, two interceptions and a fumble recovery.

THE LAST TIME IN LARAMIE

(Sept. 6, 2014) Wyoming defeated Air Force, 17-13, in Laramie in the Mountain West opener for each school. The Cowboys scored in the final minute to complete a come-from-behind win and become the first home team to win in the series in five seasons. Will Conant opened the scoring for Air Force with a 50 yard field goal and Jacobi Owens scored the first touchdown of his career on a three-yard run to give the Falcons a 10-0 lead midway through the second quarter. Wyoming got on the board with a Colby Kirkegaard touchdown pass to Jalen Claiborne to cut the lead to 10-7 at halftime. The Cowboys tied it with a field goal early in the fourth quarter, but Conant hit a 32 yard field goal to put the Falcons ahead, 13-10, with 3:25 remaining. Following Kirdegaard's second TD pass of the game to make up the final margin, the Falcons drove inside the Wyoming 20 before time ran out. Wyoming had 333 total yards while the Falcons had 377. Kale Pearson led the way with a career-high 226 yards passing. Owens added 76 yards rushing. The defense was led by Jordan Pierce's eight tackles and three tackles for loss.

LAST WEEK

Air Force defeated Navy, 28-14, to extend its school-record home winning streak to 15 games and take the first leg of the Commander-in-Chief's Trophy race. Brodie Hicks blocked a punt to set up a Luke Strelbel field goal to give the Falcons a 3-0 halftime lead. Air Force broke it open in the second half, extending the lead to 20-0 early in the fourth quarter. Tim McVey scored a rushing touchdown, Nate Romine and Jalen Robinette connected on a 75 yard scoring toss and Strelbel added his second field goal to make up the scoring. Following a Shawn White TD run for Navy, the Falcons extended the lead to 28-7 when Romine hit McVey for a 62-yard score. The Midshipmen scored a touchdown in the final seconds to make up the final margin. Air Force had 430 total yards, including a career-best 257 yards passing by Romine. Navy was held to 317 total yards, including 57 rushing. Air Force's defense was led by Grant Ross, who had 11 tackles. Haji Dunn, Jr., added seven tackles and 2.5 sacks while Ryan Watson chipped in with 2.0 sacks. Air Force had six sacks and eight tackles for loss.

LAST GAME'S NOTES

Team Notes

- Air Force scored first for the third time in four games this season.
- Air Force blocked a punt to record the 30th blocked kick (13 FG, 13 PAT, four punts) under head coach Troy Calhoun (since 2007). Since 2013, Air Force's 13 blocked kicks are the fourth most in the nation.
- Air Force leads the overall, 29-20. The Falcons are 17-7 against Navy in Falcon Stadium.
- Air Force is now 30-19 against non-conference opponents under head coach Troy Calhoun, including a 20-3 mark at home
- Air Force extended its home winning streak to a school record 15 straight games dating back to 2014. Air Force is 45-14 in Falcon Stadium under Troy Calhoun.
- Navy entered the game ranked fifth nationally in rushing, averaging 316.3 yards per game. The Falcon defense held the Midshipmen to 57 yards.
- Air Force is 4-0 for the first time since 2003. The 2003 team started the season 5-0.
- Air Force held Navy to 14 points. Under head coach Troy Calhoun, Air Force is 38-2 when allowing less than 20 points in a game.

Individual Notes

- The team captains were Nate Romine (QB), Haji Dunn, Jr. (LB) and, Jacobi Owens (TB)
- For the second straight week, Haji Dunn, Jr., had a sack, forced fumble and fumble recovery on the same play. Dunn finished the game with 2.5 sacks and a pass break up.
- Steve Brosy's 58-yard punt is a season long
- Brodie Hicks' blocked punt in the second quarter was the first of his career.
- PK Luke Strelbel hit two field goals and has now hit 17 straight, the longest active streak in the nation.
- WR Jalen Robinette had five catches and moved into fourth place on the career receptions list with 96. He moved past Matt Farmer (1997-99) who had 92.
- Robinette moved into second place on the career receiving yards list as he moved past Mike Kirby (1980-83). Robinette had 163 yards and now has 2,023 for his career. Ernie Jennings (1968-70) holds the career record with 2,392 career receiving yards.
- DB Weston Steelhammer had two interceptions and now was the 13 for his career, moving him into fourth place on the career interceptions list. He moved past Anthony Wright who had 12 from 2008-11.
- The 75-yard touchdown reception from Nate Romine to Jalen Robinette ties as the 11th longest in school history and ties as the longest since 2005 when Adam Fitch hit Greg Kirkwood with an 84-yard touchdown vs. Washington.
- QB Nate Romine has led the Falcons to a victory in seven straight starts, tying the school record set by Blane Morgan in 1998. Romine has won four this season, two last season and one as a sophomore.
- Romine passed for a career-high 257 yards. His preview high was 188 vs. New Mexico in 2013.

Senior DB Roland Ladipo joins Steelhammer on the Jim Thorpe list, marking the first time in school history teammates have been on the same watch list. Senior receiver Jalen Robinette joins Steelhammer on the Senior Bowl list.

ALEXANDER SEMIFINALIST FOR CAMPBELL TROPHY

Air Force senior linebacker Claude Alexander III is one of 156 semifinalists for the National Football Foundation 2016 William V. Campbell Trophy, presented by Fidelity Investments®. The award recognizes an individual as the absolute best football scholar-athlete in the nation and is prominently displayed inside its official home at the New York Athletic Club. Nominated by their schools, which are limited to one nominee each, candidates for the awards must be a senior or graduate student in their final year of eligibility, have a GPA of at least 3.2 on a 4.0 scale, have outstanding football ability as a first team player or significant contributor and have demonstrated strong leadership and citizenship. Alexander has a 3.4 grade point average and has held several leadership positions at the Academy.

STEELHAMMER RETURNS IN STYLE; NOW RANKS FOURTH

Senior Weston Steelhammer missed the first half of the Navy game Oct. 1 due to a targeting call at Utah State the previous week. Steelhammer made an immediate impact on the game when entering in the third quarter. He finished the game with three tackles and two interceptions. Steelhammer ranks fourth in Air Force history in career interceptions with 13. He has led the Falcons in interceptions the last two seasons with six in 2014 and five last season. Steelhammer tied a school record with three interceptions against Boise State in 2014. He has 16 career turnovers (13 INT, 3 FR).

ROBINETTE MOVING UP

Senior receiver Jalen Robinette leads the Falcons in receiving and ranks fifth in the Mountain West with 11 catches for 285 yards and two touchdowns. He is averaging 25.9 yards per reception. He had season highs of five catches for 163 yards and scored on a career-long 75 yard reception vs. Navy.

He ranks fourth in school history with 96 career catches and second in career receiving yards with 2,023. He needs four catches to become only the fourth receiver in Air Force history with 100 catches. He is one of two players in school history to record 2,000-plus receiving yards. Robinette needs 370 yards receiving to break the career record held by All-American Ernie Jennings (1968-70), who had 2,392. Robinette is second in school history with 14 career touchdown receptions. Robinette led the team in receiving yards with 641 and was second in catches with 26 last season. He averaged a team-best 24.7 yards per reception which is the second-best single-season mark in Air Force history. He trailed only Craig Hancock's school-record 31.0 mark set in 1994.

Robinette had one of the best days in school history in Air Force's win over Utah State Nov. 14. He had career highs with seven receptions and 210 receiving yards. His 210 yards are the most-ever in the option era (1980-present), the third-most overall in school history and most since 1978. He hauled in a 74-yard touchdown catch which is the 12th longest in school history and longest since 2005.

Robinette proved his all-around ability, hitting both pass attempts last season for 76 yards and two TDs. Robinette has hit three of five passes for 130 yards and three TDs in his career. He is on the 2016 Senior Bowl watch list.

Strebel is perfect in 15 extra point attempts and seven field goals this season. He opened the 2016 season with a solid effort vs. Abilene Christian, hitting all four PATs, a 26 yard field goal and posting six touchbacks on seven kickoffs. He hit all six PATs, hit field goals from 31 and 18 yards and had four touchbacks in eight kickoffs vs. Georgia State. Strebel hit a pair of field goals (28, 33) and all three PATs against Utah State. Strebel hit two more field goals vs. Navy, connecting from 36 and 22 yards. Strebel is 17 of 18 for his career in field goals and has hit all 52 of his PAT tries. He is tied for first in school history in career PAT percentage at 1.000 and is one of just three to be perfect for his career. Strebel is the career leader in field goal percentage with his .944 mark. Strebel was the team's starting kicker the last eight games last season. He hit 10 of 11 field goals and was perfect in 37 extra point attempts. He was third on the team in scoring with 67 points. He hit a career-best three field goals, including a long of 45 yards in the final two minutes to seal the game at Boise State.

Junior kicker Luke Strebel has the nation's longest active field goals made streak with 16 straight dating back to last season. LADIPO SOLID

Senior Roland Ladipo earned first-team all-Mountain West honors in his first season as a starter at cornerback last year. He finished second on the team in tackles with 79 overall and had a sack and 4.5 tackles for loss. He was second on the team in interceptions with three. Ladipo led the conference and ranked 17th nationally in pass breakups with 17 and recorded a career-best four at Boise State. Ladipo had a career-best 12 tackles and a tackle for loss at Colorado State. He had his first-career pick in the season opening win over Morgan State, returning it 22 yards for the first touchdown of his career. Ladipo is on the Jim Thorpe Award watch list for 2016. He returned to the field in last week's Mountain West opener at Utah State and finished with two tackles and a pass breakup. He did not play vs. Navy due to injury.

TOUCHDOWN TIM LEADS THE NATION IN KICKOFF RETURNS

Junior running back Tim McVey leads the nation in kickoff returns with an average of 40.3 yards per return. He had one return for 18 yards vs. Navy and two returns for 82 yards with a long of 59 yards at Utah State. The 59-yard return is the second-longest of his career. He became the first Falcon since Jonathan Warzeka vs. Colorado State in 2010 to return a kickoff for a touchdown with his 99 yard TD return vs. Georgia State. He also rushed for 62 yards and a touchdown on four carries. McVey is averaging 34.6 yards per return in his career which is tops in Air Force history. He has 11 returns for 381 yards.

McVey is seventh in the Mountain West in all-purpose yards with a 107.8 per-game average. He has rushed for 121 yards and has 68 yards receiving. McVey has 242 yards on kickoff returns. He has scored five touchdowns this season and ranks 10th in the MW in scoring and seventh in scoring TDs.

McVey made the most of his first-career start at New Mexico last season, becoming the first player in Air Force history to record 100-plus yards rushing and receiving in the same game. McVey rushed for 105 yards and two touchdowns on 12 carries and scored on a career-long run of 61 yards. He also had five catches for 157 yards and a career-best three touchdowns. He recorded a career-long 75 yard touchdown catch which is the 11th longest in school history and third-longest for a running back. The pass play is the longest overall since 2005 and longest by a running back since 2000.

McVey rushed for 48 yards and three touchdowns on nine carries at San Diego State in the Mountain West championship game. He scored nine of Air Force's last 13 touchdowns over the last three games, including the first eight. McVey led the team in scoring on the season with 78

Senior Jacobi Owens is on the Doak Walker (best running back) and Maxwell Award (player of the year) watch lists this season. He opened the 2016 season with his 10th-career 100-yard rushing performance with a team-best 121 yards on 13 carries vs. Abilene Christian. He added 56 yards on six carries vs. Georgia State to move into the top 10 in career rushing at the Academy. He has led the Falcons in rushing the last two seasons. Owens went over the 1,000-yard mark for the season and the 2,000-yard mark for his career at San Diego State in last season's conference championship game. Owens rushed for a season-high 156 yards on 17 carries and recorded a career-long run of 65 yards. Owens led the team and ranked eighth in the conference in rushing with 1,096 yards in 2015.

He is just the fourth player in Air Force history with two 1,000-yard seasons. He joins Beau Morgan (1995, 96), Dee Dowis (1987, 89) and Asher Clark (2010, 11). Air Force Head Coach Troy Calhoun

Troy Calhoun is in his 10th season as head coach at Air Force where he has a 71-50 overall record and a 36-29 mark in Mountain West play. He has led Air Force to eight bowl games, including a school-record six straight from 2007-12. Calhoun led the Falcons to an 8-6 overall record in 2015 and the Mountain Division championship and first-ever MW title game appearance. The Falcons were 6-2 in conference play.

Calhoun is the only coach in the 100-plus year history of service academy football to lead teams to at least seven wins and a bowl game in each of his first five seasons. Calhoun has twice been semifinalist for the National Coach of the Year award for his efforts on and off the field (2007, 2010).

His players have also been amazingly successful finishing their academic and leadership responsibilities. The Air Force football team's most recent NCAA APR is an astounding 980 which once again places the Academy amongst the nation's best in the sport of football. The team has received recognition seven straight seasons.

Calhoun came to his alma mater in 2007 and took over a program that had three straight losing seasons. Air Force finished the 2007 season 9-4 overall and placed second in the Mountain West Conference with a 6-2 mark in Calhoun's first year. The Falcons earned their first bowl bid in five seasons, advancing to the Bell Helicopter Armed Forces Bowl in Fort Worth, Texas. The five-game turnaround from the previous season was the largest in the nation by a first-year head coach and tied as the third-largest overall in the nation.

Calhoun was named the conference's coach of the year for his efforts. In addition, he was named coach of the year in Region 5 by the American Football Coaches Association and was one of eight finalists for national coach of the year honors. Calhoun followed with back-to-back 8-5 overall records and fourth place conference finishes with 5-3 marks in 2008 and 2009. The team earned bids to the Armed Forces Bowl each season and posted the school's first bowl victory since 2000 with a 47-20 win over Houston in 2009.

In 2010 the Falcons posted a 9-4 overall record and recorded their fourth straight top four conference finish with a 5-3 mark. The Falcons were nationally ranked for the first time since 2003 and posted a victory as a ranked team for the first time since 2002. The team capped the season with a 14-7 win over George Tech in 2010 Independence Bowl to earn a second-straight bowl victory.

Air Force posted a 7-6 record in 2011 and qualified for the Military Bowl. The Falcons were 6-7 in 2012 while finishing fourth in the conference with a 5-3 mark. Air Force played in its fourth Armed Forces Bowl to extend the school's record of consecutive bowl games to six dating back to 2007.

Calhoun led the Falcons to new heights in 2014, posting a 10-3 overall record and a fourth place finish in the Mountain Division with a 5-3 mark. The eight-game turnaround from a 2-10 mark in 2013 is a school record and tied as the best in the nation. The Falcons capped the season with a record 19th Commander-in-Chief's Trophy and a victory over Western Michigan in the Famous Idaho Potato Bowl.

Calhoun brought a wealth of experience and impressive resume at the collegiate and professional levels that is flooded with success at every stop to the Academy. Calhoun came to the Academy after serving as offensive coordinator and quarterbacks coach for the Houston Texans in 2006. The Texans were one of only two NFL teams to triple their number of wins from the previous year.

Calhoun became a well-rounded NFL coach, working as a defensive assistant, special teams assistant and offensive assistant with the Denver Broncos from 2003-05. He began his NFL coaching career by serving as the defensive assistant under defensive coordinator Larry Coyer in 2003. Prior to the NFL, Calhoun was an offensive coordinator for six seasons on the collegiate level. He began his coaching career at Air Force, where he worked as a graduate assistant from 1989-90. He started at quarterback for the Academy in 1986 and was one of only two freshmen to letter for the 1985 team that finished fifth in the final polls with a 12-1 record that included wins over national powers Notre Dame and Texas.

Calhoun served his country from 1989-95 as an active duty officer in the Air Force. He was the Falcons' recruiting coordinator and the junior varsity offensive coordinator in 1993-94. He moved to Ohio University in 1995 where he served as the quarterbacks coach for two seasons. Calhoun was promoted to offensive coordinator in 1997. Calhoun moved to Wake Forest in 2001 and remained there prior to his stint with the Broncos.

Groomed on the basics of integrity and passion, Calhoun is a native of Roseburg, Ore., and was raised in a home where both kids graduated from the Air Force Academy and were varsity letter winners on nationally-ranked teams. He and his wife, Amanda, live in Colorado Springs and have two children, Tyler (14) and Amelia (12).
