PACK HOSTS WYOMING FOR HOMECOMING GAME

Nevada returns to Mackay Stadium to face Mountain Division foe Wyoming in its fourth Mountain West contest on Saturday, Oct. 22 ... Kickoff is set for 7:30 p.m. PT at Mackay Stadium between the Wolf Pack (3-4, 1-2 MW) and Cowboys (2-4, 2-0 MW) ... The game can be seen on ESPN2 with Dave LaMont (play-by-play) and Tom Ramsey (analyst) on the call ... The Wolf Pack Radio Network will call the game on 94.5 FM, 630 AM with Ryan Radtke (play-by-play) and Kevin Grimes (analyst) in the booth ... The all-time series stands at six games and each team has won three games ... Wyoming snapped a two-game losing streak to the Pack last October with a 28-21 win in Laramie, one of the team's two wins last season ... Nevada enters week eight with a 3-4 record and is 1-2 in league play after coming out on the losing end of a close game in San Jose last Saturday, 14-10 ... Wyoming is undefeated through two conference games and is coming off of its bye week ... The Wolf Pack is 3-0 this season when playing inside Mackay Stadium ... Despite the loss last week, Nevada senior QB Tyler Stewart went over the 1,000-yard mark in passing yards and still ranks in the top 40 in the nation in completion percentage ... The Pack's passing defense has quietly been one of the best in the country, ranking 22nd in the nation by giving up just 179.7 passing yards per game, which is second in the MW ... On the other side the Wyoming defense has scored four touchdowns on the year, which is second-most in the country ... The Cowboys also boast one of the top rushers in the league in Brian Hill, who is third in rush yards per game

INTERVIEW POLICY

All interview arrangements must be made through the Nevada Communications office. Please check with the athletic communications office for any changes to the weekly schedule, including practice times. Student-athletes are generally not available for telephone interviews unless pre-arranged through the Nevada Communications office.

Coach Brian Polian and selected student-athletes will be available on a weekly basis at a press conference on Tuesdays, beginning at 12 p.m. Requests for student-athletes for the press conference must be submitted no later than 3 p.m. on Mondays to the Nevada Communications office.

Generally, the Nevada Communications office will live-stream the Tuesday press conference via the Mountain West Network and archives will be available shortly after the conclusion of the press conference.

CREDENTIALS

All requests for credentials & parking passes for Wolf Pack football games should be made through the Nevada Communications Office no later than 48 hours before game time. Please email credential requests to Jack Kuestermeyer (jkuester@unr.edu). Media can reach the Mackay Stadium press box (second level on the west side of the stadium) by using the elevator or the stairways on the north and south ends of the building.

WEEKLY RADIO SHOW

Brian Polian's weekly radio show with Ryan Radtke is on Wednesday evenings from 7-8 p.m. It is available in Northern Nevada on ESPN Radio 94.5 and an archive will be posted on the Mountain West Network within 24 hours. In addition to Polian, Radtke will interview assistant coaches and players on the show.

POSTGAME INTERVIEWS

In general, no coaches or student-athletes are available to media on the field or en route to the locker room, with the exception of the live, originating television broadcast if pre-arranged. Nevada's locker room is closed to the media.

Interview requests should be submitted to Chad Hartley of the Nevada Communications office no later than the five-minute mark of the fourth quarter. Assistant coaches are not available after games. Generally, the Nevada Communications office will live-stream the post-game press conference via the Mountain West Network and archives will be available shortly after the conclusion of the press conference.

HOME GAMES

Postgame interviews will be conducted in the Petersen Athletic Academic Center (which will also serve as a photographer work area during games). Coach Polian will be available to media after the NCAA's 10-minute cooling off period, followed by selected student-athletes.

ROAD GAMES

Polian and selected student-athletes will be available outside the visiting locker room or in the designated visiting media interview area after the cooling off period.

MEDIA WORK AREA

The Paul R. Stuart Press Box in Mackay Stadium has wireless, ethernet and phone lines available during the game and up to one and half hours after the conclusion of each game. The postgame interview area at the Petersen Athletic Academic Center is similarly equipped. Media may work in either location but are asked to work in the Petersen location if working more than 90 minutes post-game. The Mackay press box will also serve as a game and media operations location post-game so the Petersen location will likely be a quieter work environment after the conclusion of the press conference.

THE BLITZ

Nevada head coach Brian Polian and two players will be available at the Wolf Pack's Blitz luncheon. Four luncheons will take place throughout the season starting on Sept. 12. The first lunch and lunches on Oct. 10 and Nov. 14 will be held at the Eldorado. There will also be a lunch on Oct. 24 at the Carson Valley Inn. Doors open at 11:30 a.m. and the cost is \$20. This luncheon is open to the media and general public.

PARKING

Media parking permits for gameday are available via the Nevada Communications Office are generally for level two of the West Stadium Parking Complex. Local television satellite trucks have designated parking near the main (southwest) entrance to the stadium. These trucks must be in place at least two hours before game time and cannot leave while crowds are present outside the stadium.



HEAD COACH BRIAN POLIAN (@BrianPolian)



After guiding Nevada to consecutive bowl games and unheralded academic honors, head coach Brian Polian's blueprint for the program continues to yield positive results both on and off the field. Polian enters his fourth season at the helm with optimism for the future and a drive to bring a Mountain West championship to Reno.

Polian has guided Nevada to back-to-back bowl games, continuing the Wolf Pack's elite bowl streak; Nevada is one of 18 teams in the FBS, and one of just four teams from outside the Power Five, to play in 10 bowl games in the past 11 seasons. Nevada won the inaugural 2015 NOVA Home Loans Arizona Bowl in thrilling fashion last season, as Polian guided the team to its fifth bowl win in program history. In three seasons, Polian has led Nevada to 18 wins, two bowl appearances and 21 individual All-Mountain West honors.

Nevada's academic prestige under Polian's guidance has been just as noteworthy. After the bowl victory, Nevada had a program-record 21 student-athletes earn Academic All-Mountain West honors. Senior Jordan Dobrich was inducted to the 2015 NFF National Scholar-Athlete Class, which is the most prestigious scholar-athlete award in college football. Nevada also earned a team GPA of 3.05 in the 2015 spring semester, setting a new team record. Polian has helped guide Nevada to 41 Academic All-MW honors in his tenure.

Excitement surrounds the program for the upcoming season. Nevada will be playing at a newly renovated stadium and returns a talented and veteran squad. Returning from last year's bowl victory are 15 starters and five All-MW players. The Polian era of Nevada football was ushered

in on Jan. 11, 2013 as he became the 25th head coach in program history. At 41 years old, Polian is still one of the youngest head coaches at the FBS level. He brought to Nevada an impressive football pedigree that includes coaching stops at Notre Dame, Stanford and Texas A&M as part of an 18-year coaching career.

In his third season at Nevada, Polian earned his first bowl victory as a head coach, leading the Wolf Pack to a title in the inaugural 2015 NOVA Home Loans Arizona Bowl. It marked Nevada's fifth bowl victory in program history and its first since 2011, while Polian became the fourth Nevada coach all-time to win a bowl game.

Nevada posted a 7-6 overall record with a 4-4 mark in league play in 2015, marking consecutive seasons Polian has led Nevada to a winning record and bowl appearance. Nevada notched nonconference wins against Buffalo and UC Davis before defeating New Mexico, Hawai'i, Fresno State and San Jose State in MW play. Among the season's most memorable highlights were a thrilling Senior Day victory against the Spartans in overtime and a game-winning touchdown with just 66 seconds remaining to win the Arizona Bowl.

Polian led a lethal ground-and-pound offense in 2015, as sophomore James Butler and senior Don Jackson each eclipsed 1,000 yards rushing. Nevada was one of just three teams in the nation with a pair of 1,000-yard rushers, while the Wolf Pack ranked 25th in FBS with 211 rushing yards per game. On defense, Nevada lowered its points allowed average for the second straight season. Senior Ian Seau earned first team All-MW honors, was named MVP of the Arizona Bowl and led the conference with 10 sacks on the season. Polian's decision to play true freshman DB Dameon Baber also paid dividends, as Baber ranked seventh in the nation with six interceptions and earned second team All-MW accolades.

MACKAY STADIUM RENOVATIONS



The Nevada athletics department put the finishing touches on an \$11.5 million renovation of Mackay Stadium this summer.

The project, which was approved by the state's Board of Regents in December of 2014, initially began in the summer of 2-15 with the construction of a two-story, 2,800-square foot women's restroom facility that was completed in time for the start of the 2015 season.

The bulk of the renovation project began at the end of the 2015 season and was completed this summer.

The renovation features the addition of an 8,000-square foot stadium club on the west side and the installation of loge boxes, club seats and chairback seating on the east and west sides of the stadium.

The plans also called for new ADA accessible seating areas and the widening of aisles with the installation of handrails to increase safety and fan experience at the stadium.

In terms of seating, the project included 38 new four-seat loge boxes, 238 club seats and 3,880 chairback seats. A new elevator was installed on the west side of the stadium as part of the stadium club project.

The new video board and sound system should enhance the gameday experience for fans in every section of the stadium.

The project has been in the planning stages for more than four years as athletics department officials have worked directly with fan focus groups and analyzed data collected in fan surveys. The additional amenities created new price points for the stadium.

Nevada remains one of the top values in the Mountain West Conference as its most expensive seat is in the bottom half of a comparison of the 12-team league.

Features for 2016

- 4,156 total new seats were added to the stadium, including 2,860 chair backs on the west side and more than 1,000 on the east side, while 7,513 bleacher seats were removed.
- An 8,000 square-foot Stadium Club was constructed and serves as the focal point of hospitality at Mackay. The members-only, full-service hosting area includes a full-service bar and kitchen.

- 38 brand new loge boxes were added to Mackay Stadium.
- Aisles were widened and handrails were installed.
- 12 east side boxes were converted to indoor/ outdoor seating.
- A two-story, 2,800-square foot restroom facility was built in the southwest corner of the stadium and was available for the 2015 season.
- A cutting edge video board and sound system were added, along with graphics ribbon board on the east side.

LAST TIME THEY MET

The Cowboys handed Nevada a 28-21 setback at War Memorial Stadium for their first win of the season last October. The Wolf Pack scored 14 unanswered points in the second half but couldn't overcome a slow start in a disappointing loss in Laramie.

Former RB Don Jackson scored on a seven-yard rush to tie the game, 7-7, with 6:10 left in the second quarter. Wyoming stormed back with two touchdowns in the last two minutes of the half to seize momentum and lead, 21-7, at halftime.

Nevada pulled within one score in the fourth quarter with a methodical drive, scoring in nine plays and 80 yards. The Pack defense forced a punt on 4th-and-2 at the 36-yard line. The drive started on its own 14-yard line with 3:19 left in the game. On 4th-and-5 with under two minutes to play, the Cowboy defense brought pressure and brought Stewart down with a sack to clinch the victory.

LAST TIME OUT

Despite 186 all-purpose yards from James Butler, the Nevada football team fell on the road to San Jose State, 14-10, last Saturday.

A slugfest for three quarters – San Jose State led 7-3 going into the fourth quarter – turned into a back-and-forth affair down the stretch. Nevada took a 10-7 lead when Butler scored on a brilliant play, a 46-yard screen pass from Tyler Stewart with 6:52 left.

But the Spartans took it down 85 yards on 12 plays and 5:55 to scored on a three-year quarterback keeper with just 50 seconds left. The Wolf Pack got the ball out near midfield with a few seconds left but Stewart's Hail Mary fell incomplete.

With rain falling on and off through the night at CEFCU Stadium, the Pack and Spartans both turned to their ground games. Butler racked up 94 yards on 20 carries and he also had 92 yards receiving on just three catches. He accounted for 186 of Nevada's 257 yards of total offense in the game.

SERIES HISTORY

The Wolf Pack and Cowboys have met previously just six times with each team owning three wins in the all-time series. The series began a while ago with the first game played in 1937, a 9-7 win in Reno for the Pack. These two teams did meet last year with Wyoming sneaking out with a 28-21 home win, which snapped a two-game losing streak to Nevada.

BALL SECURITY

A hallmark in the Polian era has been ball security and the same has been true so far in 2016. Entering this week, Nevada is 24th in the nation in turnover margin at +0.71 per game. That mark puts the Pack second in the conference. The Pack is one of just eight teams nationally that has lost one fumble and it ranks second nationally in turnovers lost with just four. Last year, Nevada was 15th in the nation in turnover margin (21-12, +0.69). In 2014, Nevada was 11th in that category (27-16, +0.85) and also led the conference. In Polian's first season in 2013, Nevada was 23rd nationally in turnover margin (18-11, +0.58).

GET IT TO JERICO

It has been quite sometime since senior WR Jerico Richardson did not catch a pass in a game. To be exact it was Oct. 18, 2014 at BYU when Richardson did not register a reception. That is a string of 26 consecutive games with at least one reception, which is tied for 23rd-longest in the nation. Excluding his freshman season there have only been two games where Richardson did not record a reception (Oct. 18, 2014 at BYU and Sept. 5, 2014 vs. Washington State). Richardson is currently third on the team with 19 receptions on the year and is fourth with 198 receiving yards.

BLITZ LUNCHEON RETURNS

The Blitz luncheons are back! Nevada head coach Brian Polian will be available at the Wolf Pack's Blitz luncheon next week for the third luncheon of four. The next luncheon will be held on Monday, Oct. 24 at the Carson Valley Inn. The final luncheon will be held Monday, Nov. 14 at the ElDorado. Doors open at 11:30 a.m. and the cost is \$20. This luncheon is open to the media and general public.

He passed both John Vicari and Anthony Corley and is currently ninth all-time with 2,799 yards. Butler finished the game with 175 rushing yards on a career-high 37 carries. He will have some work to do now to get up to eighth as he needs 215 yards to tie Luke Lippincott and 201 to reach 3,000 for his career.

THE SILVA LINING

For sophomore DE Jordan Silva, joining the starting defensive lineup has been a blessing in disguise. Silva has started the last two contests and has totaled 10 tackles, two of which were for a loss and a pass break up. His six tackles last week at San Jose State and 2.0 TFL were both career-high marks.

THE RUFUS ON FIRE

Sophomore FS Asauni Rufus may not have the flashy interception stats to his credit thus far, but he has been quietly wreaking havoc on opposing offenses. Rufus got in on 10 tackles during the win over Fresno State, a season-high, and recovered a fumble for a second straight game. Rufus was the cause of two fumbles by the Purdue offense in week four. He now ranks in the top 30 in the nation in solo tackles, averaging 5.4 per game, which is third in the conference. More impressive are his three forced fumbles this season, 16-most in the country. His two recovered fumbles has him seventh in the nation.

OPPOSING OFFENSES, MEET MALIK REED

Sophomore DE Malik Reed is on a tear the last three games and is not making it easy for opposing offenses. Reed forced a fumble for a second straight game against Fresno State and has recorded a sack in three straight games now. He now ranks in the top 20 in the nation with teammate Asauni Rufus in forced fumbles. In the past three games, Reed has recorded 22 total tackles, 17 of which were unassisted, 5.0 tackles for loss, 3.0 sacks and forced three fumbles.

FUMBLE!

The Nevada defense is quickly becoming one of the most potent in terms of causing fumbles and recovering them. The Wolf Pack has caused 13 fumbles through seven games, which is the most by a Mountain West team this season. With those 13 causes, the Pack has recovered seven of them which is tied for the most in the league.

GET AHEAD EARLY

In all of Nevada's wins this season, the Pack has won the scoring battle in the first quarter. The team is outscoring its opponent 42-16 in the opening 15 minutes. Week six vs. Fresno State was the first time during a win that Nevada had not scored first as Fresno State got ahead with a field goal, but the Pack won the quarter, 7-6.

COMING OUT PARTY FOR DEMPS

Junior WR Wyatt Demps, who earned a starting job this fall, has made the most of his more prominent role this season, but turned heads in a win over Fresno State. Demps set career highs in nearly every receiving category, including receptions (9), receiving yards (124) and receiving touchdowns (3). He was the first Nevada receiver to go over 100 yards on the year and the first to make three touchdown receptions since December of 2011. He has become a reliable target for Wolf Pack quarterbacks with six touchdown catches, which is 15th in the nation and tops in the conference.

LINEBACKING CORE

The linebacking core for Nevada went through many changes in the offseason with the departure of Jordan Dobrich, Matthew Lyons and Bryan Lane Jr. It seems like the new crop of starters at linebacker haven't missed a beat however. Senior LB Alex Bertrando currently leads the team and ranks in the top 25 in the nation with 9.6 total tackles per game. He established a new career-high with 14 total tackles against Fresno State. Additionally Bertrando's 5.1 solo tackles per game is 50th-best in the nation and ranks eighth in the Mountain West.

BOY OH BOY

Senior punter Alex Boy launched a career-long punt during the Cal Poly game, a 71-yard punt in the third quarter that started the next Cal Poly drive from the 20. For the year he has punted 32 times and is averaging 44.7 yards per punt, which ranks 15th in the nation and is third in the Mountain West.

- Boy's 2,732 punting yards last season is the third-most in a single season in Nevada program history. The all-time best single season mark for punting yards is 3,331, captured by Tom Kolesar in 1974.

- For his career, Boy now has 6,777 career punting yards, passing David Heppe (6,649) for third all-time. He trails Bret Dales for second by 1,190 yards. The all-time mark in career punting yards is 10,652 set by Derek Jones (2000-03).

When you rank second in the nation in anything, that's pretty good. Nevada's starting sophomore SS Dameon Baber is near the top of the list in fumbles recovered, scooping up three. He shot to the top following the Purdue weekend after recovering two fumbles during that game. He has also forced two fumbles this year, stripping his second against Fresno State. Baber is the team's fourth-best tackler, averaging 5.5 tackles per game.

YOUTHFUL DEFENSE

At the heart of the Wolf Pack defense is a fairly young lineup. Between the front seven lie two seniors and the other four consist of one junior, three sophomores and one redshirt freshman. The defensive backfield starters include one senior, one junior and two sophomores. Aside from Alex Bertrando, the team's leading tackler and a senior, the following three leading tacklers on the team are Gabe Sewell, a redshirt freshman, Dameon Baber and Asauni Rufus, both sophomores.

HENDERSON APPROACHING 2,000 CAREER YARDS RECEIVING

Senior WR Hasaan Henderson is closing in on eclipsing 2,000 receiving yards for his career. With a 15-yard touchdown reception in the first quarter at Purdue, he went over 1,700 yards for his career. At Hawai'i, Henderson caught two passes for 23 yards which gave him enough to pass Tim Fleming for 18th in career receiving yards at Nevada. He needs just 249 receiving yards, which he has gotten in each of the past two seasons, to reach 2,000 for his Wolf Pack career. In addition, he needs 95 yards receiving to pass Treamelle Taylor for 17th all-time.

Nevada's offense posted four explosive plays (20+ yard passes, 15+ yard rushes) during the loss to San Jose State last week. The team registered three pass plays of 20 or more yards and one run play of more than 15 yards. The long run of the game came on Nevada's first possession of the second half, an 18-yard rush by junior RB James Butler up the middle. The long pass play also had Butler involved as senior QB Tyler Stewart dumped off a screen pass to him and with good blocking Butler raced 46 yards up the sideline and into the endzone for the team's lone touchdown.

At Hawai'i Stewart threw to eight different receivers, including a new face, senior TE Austin Carrow, who hauled in his first career reception. All together 11 players have caught at least one pass this season.

RENO, Nev. – James Butler raced untouched from five yards out in overtime, lifting Nevada to a 30-27 win over a feisty Cal Poly in the season opener Friday night.

Butler, who finished with 123 yards on 21 carries, opened the game with a burst up the middle for 50 yards, staking Nevada to a 7-0 lead less than three minutes in. The Wolf Pack led 21-7 after a quarter and 24-10 by halftime.

Cal Poly's Dano Graves rushed for two TDs in the fourth quarter, including a plunge from the 1 that forced OT with 1:20 remaining.

Nevada opened the newly renovated Mackay Stadium – which debuted in front of nearly 20,000 fans – with a pair of quick-strike touchdowns. On the Pack's game-opening drive, Nevada lined up for third-and-1 at midfield. Butler ripped off a 50-yarder, breaking free to the left side all the way to pay dirt.

Cal Poly fumbled on the ensuing drive as Dameon Baber pounced on a botched pitch. Four plays later, Stewart found Wyatt Demps in the corner of the end zone and Demps made a stunning one-handed catch for the score.

Cal Poly answered two drives later to cut it to 14-7 but Nevada tacked on one other score before the first quarter was up as Stewart

hit Jerico Richardson from nine yards out to make it 21-7. The teams traded field goals in the second quarter and went into the break with Nevada leading 24-10.

The Mustangs used the possession to crawl back into the game, scoring a pair of fourth-quarter touchdowns – the last one with 1:20 left – to tie the game at 24.

In the extra frame, Nevada's defense stepped up, notching a pair of one-yard losses to force Cal Poly into third-and-long. The Mustangs settled for a 37-field goal. Stewart hit Richardson for a 12-yard gain to open Nevada's possession. Three plays later, Butler punched it in for the game-winner.

How It Happened: Nevada built a 21-7 lead early, only to see Cal Poly claw back into it and force overtime. James Butler scored on Nevada's fourth play of overtime for the game-winner.

Play of the Game: Wyatt Demps made a remarkable one-handed catch for his first career touchdown in the first quarter.

Player of the Game: James Butler. The junior running back gained 123 yards on 21 carries, ripping a 50-yard touchdown run in the first quarter and then winning it with a five-yard score in overtime.



SOUTH BEND, Ind. (AP) – DeShone Kizer threw two touchdown passes and ran for another score, Josh Adams rushed for 106 yards and Notre Dame’s defense rebounded from their loss a week ago to help the 18th-ranked Fighting Irish beat Nevada 39-10 on Saturday.

After being held scoreless in the first quarter by Nevada (1-1), the Irish (1-1) took control with a 25-point second quarter. Kizer was 15 of 18 for 156 yards with one interception and Equanimeous St. Brown led Irish receivers with six catches for 85 yards with Torii Hunter Jr. out with a concussion sustained against Texas.

Stewart, who almost was sacked for a safety in the end zone, also later threw a pass intercepted by defensive lineman Jarron Jones at the 8 that he returned 4 yards to set up a touchdown catch by Kevin Stepherson. C.J. Sanders also had a TD catch set up by his own 24-yard punt return. Tarean Folston and Dexter Williams added rushing touchdowns.

The Wolf Pack avoided the shutout when Wyatt Demps caught a 44-yard pass from Stewart in the third quarter to set up a 27-yard field goal by Brent Zuzo. Jaxson Kincaide added a 6-yard TD run against Notre Dame’s reserves late in the fourth quarter. Stewart was 10 of 23 passing for 113 yards and James Butler, who rushed for 1,342 yards last season, was held to 50 yards on 17 carries.

Malik Zaire, who lost the quarterback competition with Kizer, entered the game late in the third quarter and completed 4 of 9 passes for 49 yards

How It Happened: Notre Dame used 25 second quarter points to put the game out of reach. The Fighting Irish scored three touchdowns in the quarter and got some help from Nevada’s special teams to post a big quarter.

Play of the Game: True freshman Jaxson Kincaide scored the lone Wolf Pack touchdown of the game in the fourth quarter. On 2nd and five, Kincaide took the handoff from backup quarterback Ty Gangi and ran six yards up the sideline into the endzone for his first collegiate touchdown.

Player of the Game: Alex Boy. Nevada’s senior punter was a bright spot for the Wolf Pack, punting seven times for 311 yards. He averaged 44.4 yards per punt and backed up the Irish inside the 20 on four of his seven punts. He even booted a game-best 68-yarder, which tied his second-longest career punt.

RENO, Nev. - Nevada's junior RB James Butler put on a show Saturday night and lit up the scoreboard as Nevada rolled Buffalo 38-14. Butler finished with 28 carries for 174 yards and a career-high three touchdowns. Butler moved into 14th place on Nevada's career rushing list, passing Otto Kelly (2,284 yards, 1981-83). His 174 rushing yards were the third most of his stellar career thus far.

The 24-point margin was the second-largest in the Brian Polian era and the most since his first win, a 38-7 victory over UC Davis in 2013.

Nevada scored in every quarter, building a 24-0 lead at halftime and opening the second half with a score to go up 31-0. The Bulls got on the board with a touchdown with 3:01 left in the third.

Tyler Stewart orchestrated the strong output offensively. He completed 16-of-21 for 160 yards and a touchdown - a 2-yard pass to Wyatt Demps in the fourth quarter. He also ran for 31 yards and another score. Freshman Jaxson Kincaide rushed for 99 yards on 18 carries.

The Pack used sophomore quarterback Ty Gangi in packages and also had sophomore safety Asauni Rufus take a snap in the triple option. The Pack defense never broke in the first quarter. Buffalo notched 115 yards in the first 15 minutes but came away with zero points as the Pack forced a punt, a missed field goal and stopped

the Bulls short on fourth-and-1 on Buffalo's first three possessions.

Nevada's second score of the game - a 23-yard field goal by Brent Zuzo - was set up with an electrifying 48-yard run by freshman Kincaide. That made it 10-0 and the Pack wasn't finished. Butler made it 24-0 with a pair of second-quarter touchdown runs, two and four yards, respectively and Nevada went into halftime with its largest lead at an intermission since a 28-0 lead in 2011.

How It Happened: Nevada built up a 24-0 lead at halftime and did not allow its opponent to score until the 3:01 mark of the third quarter. The Pack collected 521 yards of total offense and 352 yards on the ground.

Play of the Game: Senior QB Tyler Stewart opened the scoring of the game with a nine-yard rush into the endzone on Nevada's first possession of the game. Even though that only gave the Pack a 7-0 lead, it provided Nevada with momentum that it carried out through the entire game.

Player of the Game: James Butler. The junior RB rushed for a career-best three touchdowns and posted 174 yards on the ground, third-most of his career. He passed Otto Kelly for 14th on Nevada's all-time leading rushers list.

WEST LAFAYETTE, Ind. (AP) - Tyler Stewart threw touchdown passes of 15 yards to Hasaan Henderson and 6 yards to James Butler as Nevada lost to Purdue 24-14 Saturday.

Purdue, which turned the ball over four times, was trailing Nevada 14-10 at the half.

The Wolf Pack had an opportunity to pull even at 17 with 4:16 remaining in the fourth, but Brent Zuzo hooked a 27-yard field-goal attempt wide left.

Purdue's David Blough threw for 300 yards and two touchdowns, Markell Jones had a go-ahead score on the ground.

How It Happened: The Wolf Pack scored all of its 14 points off of turnovers and all 14 in the first half. Nevada led 14-10 at the half. After a touchdown put Purdue ahead, Pack senior PK Brent Zuzo missed a 27-yard field goal that would have tied the game at 17 with just over four minutes remaining. On Purdue's next possession the Boilermakers marched down the field and scored a touchdown to put the game out of reach for the Wolf Pack.

Play of the Game: An interception by junior LB Jaden Sawyer halted Purdue in its tracks on the first drive of the game. The Boilermakers began the drive at their own 47 yard line and marched 49 yards to the Nevada four yard line. Needing a big stop, Sawyer stepped in front of the Purdue receiver and picked off the pass and returned it for 35 yards.

Player of the Game: Asauni Rufus. The sophomore free safety forced two fumbles during the game which led to recoveries by the Pack defense. His two forced fumbles helped Nevada force Purdue into turning the ball over four times. Rufus also was second on the team with nine tackles, eight solo.

HONOLULU, Hawai'i - James Butler ran for 168 yards but the Nevada football team came up short against Hawaii, 38-17 in the Mountain West opener for both teams at Aloha Stadium.

Butler recorded his 13th 100-yard rushing game of his career – and third of the season – as the Pack moved the ball well at times, but missed a couple of first-half scoring opportunities. Leading at half by 14, Hawaii broke the game open with 21 third-quarter points against a Nevada team making its third three-time zone trip in the past four weeks.

Quarterback Tyler Stewart was 19-of-33 through the air for Nevada. He hit Wyatt Demps for a nine-yard score in the fourth quarter. Jaxson Kincaide notched his second career touchdown – Nevada's second of the game – in the fourth quarter on a two-yard run.

Nevada had chances in the first half but came out with just three points as Hawaii took a 17-3 lead into the break. On its opening drive, the Pack marched down the field, in part to a 55-yard run by James Butler – to a goal-to-go situation. On fourth-and-goal from the five, Nevada was stopped short, turning it over on downs.

UH answered with a field goal and then the Rainbow Warriors scored a touchdown two drives later to go up 10-0. The Pack came back with a 14-play drive in the second quarter in which Brent Zuzo

capped with a 27-yarder to get Nevada on the board.

UH answered just before half with a quick scoring drive to push it to 17-3. Nevada tried to answer as Elijah Mitchell took the ensuing kickoff back 52 yards – his longest since taking one 96 yards for a touchdown in the NOVA Home Loans Arizona Bowl last year – to give Nevada position. But Zuzo's 48-yard attempt missed left just before halftime.

How It Happened: Hawai'i led at halftime 17-3 after Nevada missed a couple of chances to score in the first half. The Rainbow Warriors put the game out of reach with 21 unanswered points in the third quarter.

Play of the Game: A 55-yard run by junior RB James Butler on the Pack's opening drive. This run led Nevada to a goal-to-go situation where it was stopped on fourth down.

Player of the Game: James Butler. The junior RB totaled 168 yards on the ground on 21 carries. It marks the 13th game of his career where he has rushed for more than 100 yards. During the game he passed both Don Jackson and B.J. Mitchell in career rushing yards. He now sits 11th all-time.

RENO, Nev. - The Nevada football team saw standout performances from James Butler, and a career game from Wyatt Demps. But at the end the Wolf Pack defense stood up and took four shots from Fresno State inside the 5-yard line and never broke.

The goal-to-go stand sealed a 27-22 bounce-back win for the Wolf Pack over Fresno State. Butler ran for 175 yards on a career-high 37 carries while Demps caught nine passes for 124 yards and three touchdowns – all career-highs.

Coming out of halftime, Fresno State scored late in the third quarter and then added a field goal with 13:37 left in the fourth to cut it to 21-16. Nevada answered with a 14-play scoring drive that featured 13 straight run plays before Stewart hit Demps with a brilliant 8-yard fade in the corner of the endzone for the score.

Fresno State would answer, however, to make the score at 27-22. Nevada was then forced to punt on the ensuing drive and the Bulldogs took over with 2:55 left in the game at their own 40. With under a minute to go, the Bulldogs had first-and-goal from the Nevada 4.

The Pack dialed up the pressure, forcing two straight incompletions. On third down, Fresno State completed a pass in the flat and Asauni Rufus made the stop for no gain to force fourth down. On the final

play, the Pack flushed Fresno State quarterback Chaison Virgil from the pocket and the pass attempt was incomplete to seal the win.

How It Happened: Nevada took a 21-6 lead into halftime after scoring a touchdown just before the end of the second quarter. Fresno State outscored the Pack in the second half but the Nevada defense posted big stops when they needed to.

Play of the Game: On Nevada's second possession of the game, the Pack pulled some tricks out of its bag and pulled off a successful reverse play. Stewart reversed the ball back to Celis who heaved a 36-yard pass to a wide open Demps to give Nevada the lead.

Player of the Game: Wyatt Demps. The junior wide out set career highs in nearly every receiving category including receptions (9), receiving yards (124) and receiving touchdowns (3).

SAN JOSE, Calif. - Despite 186 all-purpose yards from James Butler, the Nevada football team fell on the road to San Jose State, 14-10.

A slugfest for three quarters - San Jose State led 7-3 going into the fourth quarter - turned into a back-and-forth affair down the stretch. Nevada took a 10-7 lead when Butler scored on a brilliant play, a 46-yard screen pass from Tyler Stewart with 6:52 left.

But the Spartans took it down 85 yards on 12 plays and 5:55 to scored on a three-year quarterback keeper with just 50 seconds left. The Wolf Pack got the ball out near midfield with a few seconds left but Stewart's Hail Mary fell incomplete.

With rain falling on and off through the night at CEFCU Stadium, the Pack and Spartans both turned to their ground games. Butler racked up 94 yards on 20 carries and he also had 92 yards receiving on just three catches. He accounted for 186 of Nevada's 257 yards of total offense in the game.

The Spartans got on the board after a rare Pack turnover. The Spartans took the short field and went down and scored, with quarterback Kenny Potter taking it in from three yards out.

The Pack struggled to get much going offensively in the first half, save for Butler. The junior had 11 touches for 82 yards in the first 30

minutes, while the Pack overall tallied 86 yards on 24 plays. Defensively, the Pack bottled up the Spartans as Jarid Joseph recorded a pair of first-half sacks and Patrick Choudja got another one as the Pack nearly equaled its season total (four) in the first half alone.

It matched the season sack total in the second half when Malik Reed got another sack - his third of the season and third in as many games - and appeared to force a fumble. But the Spartans were able to get the snap off before a challenge could be made.

Nevada got on the board in the third quarter when Spencer Pettit made his collegiate debut with a 28-yard field goal.

How It Happened: San Jose State took a 7-0 lead into halftime and a 7-3 lead into the final quarter. The Spartans scored late in the fourth to put the game away, 14-10.

Play of the Game: A 46-yard screen pass from Stewart to Butler in the fourth quarter, Nevada's only TD of the game.

Player of the Game: James Butler. The junior RB totaled 186 all-purpose yards, 94 on the ground and 92 through the air. He had receptions of 30 and 46 yards, and hauled in the lone Pack touchdown reception of the game.
