

University of Wyoming Postgame Notes

Following a 77-67 home win vs. South Dakota State on Nov. 19, 2016, in the Arena-Auditorium in Laramie, Wyo.

Team Notes

- Today's game marked the fourth meeting between the schools and the first since 2009.
- The Pokes move to 3-1 all-time against the Jackrabbits.
- The Cowboys are 3-1 in Laramie against South Dakota State.
- Head coach Allen Edwards moves to 3-0 on the season. It was the first 3-0 start by a Cowboy coach since Larry Shyatt in 1997-98.
- Wyoming recorded five blocks on the night. They came into the game leading the MW at 6.5 per game.
 - The Pokes bench has been solid all year. Against SDSU, the bench added 32 points.
- Wyoming shot 44 percent (24-of-54) from the field and held the Jackrabbits to 35 percent (20-of-58).
- The Jackrabbits hit 12 three pointers. That is the most this season for an opponent and more than the previous two games combined, which is 10.
 - The Pokes turned the ball over seven times, which is a season low.

Individual Notes

- Sophomore guard Justin James led the Cowboys with 18 points, one shy of his career high.
- Senior guard Jason McManamen poured in 16 points for his second game in double-figures this season and the 30th time in his career.
- McManamen hit three triples on the night, and now has 131 in his career. He also logged a game-high three steals, tying his career best.
 - Junior guard Alexander Aka Gorski netted 15 points, including three long-range buckets.
- Junior forward Hayden Dalton grabbed a team-high seven boards on the night. He came into the game averaging 8.0 per game leading the Pokes.
- Dalton and Aka Gorski tied for a Wyoming-best four assists. It was Dalton's season high and tied for Aka Gorski's season high.
 - Redshirt freshman Cody Kelley recorded a career-high five points off the UW bench.
