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University of Wyoming Postgame Notes

Following a 82-70 home win vs. Denver
on Nov. 30, 2016, at Arena-Auditorium in Laramie, Wyo.

Team Notes

- Tonight's matchup marked the 154th meeting between the two schools in a series that dates back to 1915.
- The Cowboys lead the all-time series 104-50 following tonight's 82-70 win.
- The Pokes have now won three-straight against the Pioneers. The longest winning streak in the series since UW won four-straight from 1999-02.
- Tonight's matchup marked the third time this season that first-year head coach Allen Edwards has coached against a fellow first-year head coach. He is 2-1 in those games.
- The Pokes played 11 players on the night. Eight of those players scored on the evening.
- The Cowboy bench contributed a season-best 45 points, compared to 25 points from Denver's bench.
- Wyoming gathered just seven offensive rebounds, but converted a season-high 12 second-chance points.
- The Pokes blocks six shots, the most since recording nine blocks in their season-opener against Western State
- Wyoming shot a season-high 84.0 percent from the free throw line (21-of-25).
- The Cowboys were strong inside, netting a season-high 32 points in the paint. The Pokes have scored 30 or more points in the paint three times this season and are 3-0 when out scoring the opposition in the paint.
- The Cowboys scored 17 points off of turnovers including 14 in the first half. Wyoming is scored 17 or more points off of turnovers in their last three games.
- The Pokes are now 2-0 against the Summit League and are 3-0 in the Arena-Auditorium this season.

Individual Notes

- Senior guard Jason McManamen record 13 points on the night. He hit three long-range buckets on 11 attempts and was a perfect 4-of-4 from the free throw line.
- McManamen now has 137 threes in his career ranking eighth at UW. He passed Bradley Mann (136) who played for UW from 1997-00.
- Junior forward Alan Herndon scored 12 points on the night for his fourth game in double figures this season and third-straight. He scored 10 points in the opening half.
- Herndon has scored in double-figures in three-straight games. He accomplished the same feat last season for the longest streak in his career.
- Herndon also tied his career-high with three blocks. He had two blocks in the closing minutes of the game.
- Sophomore guard Justin James led all players were with a game-high 21 points. He has scored in double figures in five-straight games.
- James has scored at least 20 points in back-to-back games. James is averaging 21 points per game over his last three contests.
- Junior guard Louis Adams recorded a career-high 16 points in his first consistent play time after an injury at Montana.
- Adams was 6-of-9 from the field and 4-of-5 from the line.
- Junior forward Hayden Dalton led all rebounders with eight boards. He came into the game leading the Pokes at 7.0 boards per game.
