University of Wyoming Postgame Notes

Following a 73-78 loss against Colorado State
on Feb. 14, 2017, in the Arena-Auditorium in Laramie, Wyo.

Team Notes

- Wednesday's game was the 226th meeting between the two schools.
- Wyoming leads the all-time series 133-93.
- Wyoming is now 77-36 all-time at home against Colorado State.
- Wyoming played its 26th game on Valentine's Day and moves to 16-10 all-time on Feb. 14.
- Wyoming opened the contest hitting six of their first nine three point attempts, but missed their last eight of the first half.
- Colorado State shot 50 percent from the field in the first half, they are the only opponent to do so in the Arena-Auditorium this season.
- Wyoming's bench outscored that of Colorado State, 31-11. It's the seventh time the Cowboy bench has scored at least 20 points more than the opponent's bench this season.
- Wyoming has swatted away 133 blocks this season, the ninth-most in Wyoming single-season history.
- Wyoming has made double-digit three pointers in four-straight games as UW hit 10 on the night.
- Junior forward Alan Herndon recorded UW's 13th double-double of the season, the most since the Cowboys had 16 in the 2012-13 season. Leonard Washington had 12 of those double-doubles.
- Wyoming used the starting lineup of junior guard Louis Adams, junior guard Jeremy Lieberman, senior guard Jason McManamen, junior forward Alan Herndon and sophomore forward Jordan Naughton. The Cowboys are 7-5 on the year with that starting group.

Individual Notes

- Senior Jason McManamen hit three triples, and is now just seven shy of becoming the all-time leader in three-pointers made. He has 187 three pointers in his career two shy of second place and Josh Adam's 189.
- Sophomore guard Justin James led all scorers with 23 points, including 13 straight in the first half. He has scored 20 points or more in seven games this season.
- James knocked down nine field goals, tying his career high.
- Junior forward Alan Herndon recorded his third double-double of the season with 15 points and 12 rebounds. His 12 boards matched his career high.
- Herndon's also recorded three blocks on the night, moving his season total to 57, the seventh-best mark in Wyoming history.
- Herndon moved into the top-10 in career blocks, now tied for ninth with 95 in his Cowboy career. He is tied with Fennis Dembo.
- Redshirt freshman Andrew Moemeka played a career-high 18 minutes. He tallied three points, two rebounds and one steal.
- Junior forward Louis Adams sank a career-best 12 free throws, scoring all his points at the charity stripe.

UW Head Coach Allen Edward's Postgame Quotes

Quotes From University of Wyoming Head Coach Allen Edwards

"I thought the second half our players did a better job of executing the game plan. In the first half, our guys looked like they were waiting for something good to happen and they didn't have the energy I expect from them.

"I've continued to tell them throughout this season that they can't worry so much about what is happening on the offensive end of the court. We have to go out and play hard from the start of the game, and if we do that we'll be fine.

"I thought Justin (James) did some great things offensively, but I also thought he had a solid game on the defensive end and that is why he played more minutes tonight. He is a kid who has a good future if he continues to work hard and understand what it is going to take to become the player he is capable of becoming.

"Alan (Herndon) made some big shots. The drive for the and-one down the stretch was a big play. He was effective and he did that fighting a cold."

Regarding the play of Emmanuel Omogbo of Colorado State

"When the shot goes up, he (Emmanuel Omogbo) sees that as an offensive opportunity. He finds a way to get the basketball off the glass. One hit or one bump is not going to stop him from coming after the ball.
