Logan Wilson Joins Allen and Wingard on Preseason All-MW Team, Only Sophomore Selected :

In addition to Cowboy juniors **Josh Allen** and **Andrew Wingard** being selected the Mountain West Preseason Offensive and Defensive Players of the Year, respectively, in voting by conference media members, Cowboy linebacker **Logan Wilson** was the third Cowboy voted to the Preseason All-MW team. Wilson was the only sophomore in the league to be selected.

Cowboys Have Big Non-Conference Opportunities/Challenges Early in 2017

Season: The Wyoming Cowboys are coming off one of their most successful seasons in recent history. UW captured the Mountain West Conference Mountain Division title, earned the right to host the 2016 Mountain West Championship Game as the highest rated team in the conference and earned a berth in the 2016 San Diego County Credit Union Poinsettia Bowl. The Cowboys accomplished all that against the 19th most difficult schedule in the country and the second most difficult schedule among all Group of Five schools.

The 2017 season will offer the Cowboys two key opportunities against the University of Iowa in the season opener, Sept. 2 in Iowa City, and versus the Oregon Ducks in Week 3 in a game that will be played in Laramie.

For a man who has been part of five national championship teams during his coaching career -- two as an assistant coach at his alma mater Nebraska and three as the head coach at North Dakota State -- Wyoming head coach **Craig Bohl** knows the challenges of keeping a team focused when coming off a successful season.

"It will be important to make sure our football team recognizes we have a long ways to go," said Bohl. "Consistency is going to be really important. The days of us sneaking up on some opponents are long gone. There is an awful lot of parity in the Mountain West. We'll need to have a great fall camp and get off to great start in our non-conference schedule."

In terms of facing Iowa and Oregon in the first three weeks of the season Bohl sees it as both a challenge and an opportunity.

"It's always great to open up with a nationally-recognized opponent like the University of Iowa," said Bohl. "Coach (Kirk) Ferentz and the Iowa Hawkeyes have been an outstanding program for a long, long time. To go to Iowa City will be a combination of a big challenge and a great opportunity for us.

"Having Oregon at our place should create a fantastic atmosphere in War Memorial Stadium, and will be a great game for our fans.

"But it's going to be more important for the growth of our program that we develop as a football team throughout the entire year. Facing the quality of opponents we will early in the season, we're going to learn more about some of our unproven guys. We've been encouraged by what we've seen, but with that said we have some question marks."

Wyoming Attracted the Second Most Fans in School History in 2016:

Wyoming fans turned out in great numbers in 2016. A total of 148,860 Cowboy fans attended games last season. That ranks second only to 149,625 fans who attended games in 1990. Both the 2016 and 1990 seasons included seven home games.



Exciting Home Schedule Featured in 2017, Including a Rare Seven Home Games:

An exciting schedule is on tap for University of Wyoming football fans in 2017, highlighted by the first-ever appearance by the Oregon Ducks in Laramie. The annual "Border War" game versus Colorado State will be played in War Memorial Stadium in 2017. Three conference home games will feature teams that earned bowl bids a year ago in Colorado State, Hawai'i and New Mexico. The other home games will feature Fresno State, Gardner-Webb and Texas State. Wyoming's 2017 schedule will include a rare seven home games. The only other seasons Wyoming has played a seven-game home schedule were in 1990 and 2008.

Scoring on Defense, Cowboys Ranked No. 3 in the Nation in Defensive TDs Scored in 2016:

The Wyoming Cowboys tied for No. 3 in the nation in defensive touchdowns in 2016, scoring five defensive TDs. Only Alabama and Ohio State scored more. The Crimson Tide has scored 11 defensive touchdowns this season, and the Buckeyes scored seven. Wyoming tied with Central Florida, Florida, Houston and San Diego State for third place, with five defensive TDs.

Forcing Turnovers -- Pokes Ranked No. 10 Nationally in 2016:

The Wyoming defense forced 27 turnovers -- 15 interceptions and 12 fumble recoveries in 2016. That ranked the Cowboys No. 2 in the MW and No. 10 nationally in most turnovers gained.

2017 Wyoming Cowboys Return MW Coach of the Year Craig Bohl and All-Conference Performers Andrew Wingard, Josh Allen and Logan Wilson:

The Mountain West Conference released its 2016 All-Conference Football Team on Tuesday and two of the top honors went to members of the Wyoming Football program. Head coach **Craig Bohl** was voted the Coach of the Year and redshirt freshman linebacker **Logan Wilson** was named Freshman of the Year. Wyoming will return First Team All-MW safety **Andrew Wingard** in 2017, along with Second Team honoree **Josh Allen** at quarterback,

Wyoming's 2016 Conference Championship Game Was Its First Since 1996:

Last season, the Cowboys hosted the Mountain West Championship game on Dec. 3 vs. San Diego State and narrowly lost that game, 24-27, to the Aztecs.

The last time the Wyoming Cowboys played in a conference championship game was 1996. That year, the Cowboys played BYU in the inaugural Western Athletic Conference Championship Game in Las Vegas. Wyoming lost to the Cougars by a score of 25-28 in overtime.

Cowboys' 2016 Success Came Against the 19th Toughest Schedule in the Nation, According to NCAA Statistics:

Wyoming's successful 8-6 record last season was accomplished against the 19th toughest schedule in the nation and the second most difficult schedule of any Group of Five school, according to NCAA Statistics.

The NCAA measures the toughest schedules based on the winning percentage of a team's FBS opponents for the season. The opposing FBS opponents that Wyoming played last season had a winning percentage of 56.9 percent against FBS schools.

Two Top 25 Wins in Same Season for First Time Since 1999:

The Wyoming Cowboys defeated then No. 13 ranked Boise State, 30-28, Oct. 29, 2016, and captured a second Top 25 win when they defeated No. 24 ranked San Diego State, 34-33, on Nov. 19.

Prior to 2016, the last time Wyoming defeated two Top 25 teams in the same season was in 1999 when the Pokes defeated No. 24 Air Force (10-7) and No. 15 BYU (31-17).

Wingard Posts 10th Best Single-Season Tackle Total in School History,

Approaching Top 10 in Career Tackles: Current Wyoming junior safety **Andrew Wingard** recorded 131 tackles as a sophomore in 2016, which ranks as the 10th best single-season tackle total in school history. That performance, combined with his 122 tackles as a true freshman in 2015 (16th best single-season total), gives him 253 tackles heading into his junior season.

Wingard is within 71 tackles of breaking into Wyoming's Career Top 10 list in tackles. If he has a season in 2017 similar to 2016, he could move into third place all-time at UW.

One of the most experienced areas of the 2017 Wyoming Football team will be the safety position. Now juniors, safeties **Andrew Wingard** and **Marcus Epps** have started the last 24 consecutive games together. Wingard has actually started the last 25 games as a Cowboy. The only game he didn't start was the first game of his true freshman season in 2015. Epps didn't start the first two games on his redshirt freshman season of 2015.

Wingard and Epps Record 100-Tackle Seasons in 2016, Both Among Top 25 Best Single Seasons in School History:

Wyoming's returning safety tandem of **Andrew Wingard** (131) and **Marcus Epps** (111) recorded 100-tackle seasons in 2016. Wingard's 131 tackles ranked as the 10th best single season in school history. Epps 111 tackles ranks 25th.

2017 Wyoming Team Notes University of Wyoming Football

Scoring Offense Much Improved in 2016:

The Wyoming Cowboys rank No. 25 in the nation in scoring offense in 2016. Wyoming averaged 37.1 points per game, ranking No. 2 in the conference and No. 24 nationally. That is a dramatic improvement from the 2015 season when the Cowboys averaged only 19.0 points per game to rank No. 11 in the Mountain West.

Pokes Score 503 Points in '16, Second Best Single-Season Total in School History:

Wyoming scored the second most points for a single season in school history in 2016. The Cowboys scored 503 points in 14 games. The most points a Wyoming team scored in a single season was 511 points in 13 games in 1988. In terms of scoring average, the 2016 Cowboys ranked fourth in school history at 35.9 points per game

Cowboys Celebrate Win Over Boise State

FWAA Selected Wyoming Cowboys National Team of the Week for Win Over Boise State:

Quarterback **Josh Allen** led a fourth-quarter touchdown drive, including a two-point conversion to tie the game, and the Wyoming Cowboys forced a safety with 1:25 left for the winning points in a 30-28 win over previously-unbeaten Boise State. For beating a ranked team for the first time since 2002, and topping the Broncos for the first time in 11 all-time games, the Cowboys earned the Football Writers Association of America National Team of the Week honor for games of the weekend of Oct. 29.

Allen hit **Tanner Gentry** in the back of the end zone with 6:42 left, then dodged the Boise State rush and hit **Jake Maulhardt** for a two-point conversion for a 28-28 tie. Minutes later, punter **Ethan Wood** pinned Boise State at its own 10-yard line, his fourth punt inside the Broncos' 20-yard line, that set up the decisive series. On second down, nose tackle **Chase Appleby** came free on a defensive line stunt and hit Boise State quarterback Brett Rypien, knocking the ball loose. The ball bounced out of the back of the end zone for a safety, and Wyoming took its first lead of the day.

"If a win could help define a program this one did," said Bohl. "We have a lot of respect for Boise State and Coach (Bryan) Harsin. I want to say thanks to our fans and students. A couple of years ago, I had someone take a photo of the crowd and it was bleak, but tonight it was neat to see the students and people around the state rally around the team. A lot of great plays and effort, and coming in we knew it was going to be down to a play here or there. It shows resolve and belief with our coaches and players. A lot of hard work went in to this win and it's victory number six."

This is Wyoming's first time to be selected as the FWAA National Team of the Week since the award's inception in the 2002 season. The other National Team of the Week nominees for the weekend of Oct. 29 were Clemson, who defeated Florida State, and Texas, who defeated Baylor.

Members of the 12-person FWAA All-America Committee – plus one fan vote from Twitter – decide the weekly honor.

The 2017 season will be the 121st season of Wyoming Football. The Cowboys first season was 1893.

Since that first season, there have been only four seasons in which Wyoming has not played football. In 1918, while Wyoming had a team they played no games due to an influenza epidemic. The other three seasons Wyoming did not field a team were 1943, '44 and '45 during World War II.

Wyoming Football's All-Time Record:

The Wyoming Cowboy Football program has played a total of **1,109 games** in its history. Wyoming is 41 games under .500 all-time (520 wins to 561 losses), and has played 49 more road games than home games in its history (522 home games to 571 road games). The Cowboys played their **1,000th game** on Sept. 6, 2008, against Air Force.

War Memorial Stadium Will Host Its 68th Season in 2017:

The 2017 college football season will mark the 68th season of War Memorial Stadium

Wyoming has won **65.6 percent** of its games in War Memorial Stadium.

"The War" first opened on Sept. 16, 1950, with UW recording a 61-13 win over Montana State. War Memorial's original capacity was 20,000 in 1950. It was expanded to 25,500 in 1970, and the seating was increased to a capacity of 33,500 in 1977.

Following reconstruction of the upper deck on the West side of War Memorial Stadium in the summer of 2004, the new capacity of War Memorial Stadium was 30,514. With the construction of the Wildcatter Stadium Club & Suites in 2009-10, the current capacity is 29,181.

Mick and Susie McMurry High Altitude Performance Center Will Benefit All UW Student-Athletes:

The University of Wyoming broke ground Saturday, Oct. 29 on the Mick and Susie McMurry High Altitude Performance Center (HAPC). The HAPC will be one of the preeminent athletic facilities in the country. It will add 71,000 square feet of new space and will expand the current Curtis and Marian Rochelle Athletics

Center to over 118,000 square feet.

The HAPC groundbreaking was held on the same day the Wyoming Cowboys hosted the Boise State Broncos in a battle for first place in the Mountain West Conference's Mountain Division.

"A successful athletics program generates excitement," Wyoming Gov. Matt Mead said in April, when fundraising was announced. "This leads to better student recruitment, better alumni support and stronger schools. I recommended \$20 million in matching funds for the expansion and renovation of the Rochelle Athletics Center for these reasons. I thank Marian H. Rochelle for this generous gift and her continued support of the University of Wyoming."

The project is funded by \$24 million in private donations that were raised by UW Athletics and the UW Foundation and \$20 million in state matching approved by Gov. Mead and the Legislature. Overwhelming interest by donors—55 total—saw the fundraising efforts completed ahead of schedule. Marian Rochelle and her family donated \$3 million as a leadership gift to kick off the project, and the combined gifts of Marian Rochelle and her daughter April Brimmer Kunz have since grown to \$4.1 million.

"Mick and Susie McMurry's generosity and their commitment to making the University of Wyoming a premier university in both athletics and academics will be symbolized by the High Altitude Performance Center that will bear their name," says Tom Burman, UW athletics director. "We also want to thank Marian Rochelle and April Brimmer Kunz for their generous lead gift for this project. And we of course want to thank Governor Mead and the members of the Wyoming State Legislature for making funds available to match the private funds that we raised for this facility."

"The High Altitude Performance Center will be one of the best facilities of its kind in all of college athletics. It will provide the student-athletes in all of our sports the athletic training resources to compete with the best in the nation, and it will provide our academic counseling unit exceptional resources to help our student-athletes achieve their educational and career goals."

"The Mick and Susie McMurry High Altitude Performance Center will redefine Cowboy football," says UW Head Football Coach Craig Bohl. "This facility will play a critical role in our vision of recruiting to what we call the Wyoming Profile. That recruiting effort involves attracting a young man who is committed to earning a meaningful degree from an outstanding academic institution and has a laser-like focus to win Mountain West Conference championships. The High Altitude Performance Center will put us at the top of the league in terms of training and academic facilities, which is where we also aspire to be on the field of competition."

The new facility will focus on the unique advantages of training at an altitude of 7,220 feet. From strength and conditioning training, to nutrition, to recovery and rehabilitation services following injuries, the HAPC will serve the needs of all of Wyoming's 400-plus student-athletes.

The facility's design will stay true to the architectural tradition of iconic sandstone buildings featured throughout the UW campus.

Located just beyond the north end zone, the High Altitude Performance Center will enhance the aesthetics of War Memorial Stadium. Due to its location, the HAPC will be highly visible for national television audiences. It will show the commitment that the state of Wyoming has in ensuring Wyoming Athletics continues to successfully compete at the NCAA Division I level -- the highest level of competition in college sports.

The ground level of the HAPC will house both an Olympic sport weight-training area and a separate strength and conditioning center for the Cowboy football team that will overlook Jonah Field. Also on the first floor will be a sports medicine area that will nearly double the size of its previous space, allowing for more effective and efficient treatment of UW student-athletes. The football locker room, like the football strength and conditioning area, will overlook the field and will include a player lounge.

The second floor will include an expansive academic center to house academic counselors, tutoring areas and a computer lab, as well as enhanced and renovated football offices, meeting rooms, a new recruiting lounge and the nutrition center/training table. The theater-style team meeting room will span both the first and second floors.

Construction on the project will begin after the conclusion of the 2016 Cowboy football season. It is estimated that the project will take 18-20 months to complete.

The original Curtis and Marian Rochelle Athletics Center was opened in 2001 at a total cost of \$9.4 million. Fundraising for the RAC included a historic \$4.2 million gift from the Rochelles, which was the largest donation in school history at the time. A total of 167 donors contributed to the original RAC.





When Craig Bohl was hired as head football coach for the University of Wyoming, he was open in saying that he wanted to bring Cowboy Football back to a place of national prominence. In 2016, his team took the first step toward that goal, defeating two Top 25 ranked opponents, being named the National Team of the Week by the Football Writers Association of America (FWAA) for one of those wins and receiving votes itself in the national polls. Wyoming also captured the Mountain Division title of the Mountain West Conference, earned the right to host the 2016 MW Football Championship Game as the highest ranked team in the conference and was invited to the San Diego County Credit Union Poinsettia Bowl. His Cowboys ended the year as one of the NCAA's top scoring offenses, averaging 35.9 points per game to rank No. 25 in the nation. Bohl was recognized for his turnaround of Cowboy Football by being named the Mountain West Conference Coach of the Year in voting by conference head coaches and media.

Now entering his fourth season at Wyoming and his 15th season as a head coach, Bohl is challenging his team to take another step forward in 2017 -- a step to become a team that consistently competes for and wins conference titles and reaches postseason play.

During Bohl's time at Wyoming, two Cowboys earned All-America honors in 2016 in running back Brian Hill and center Chase Roullier. Linebacker Logan Wilson earned Freshman All-America honors in 2016, joining Andrew Wingard, who earned Freshman All-America honors a year earlier.

Bohl, who was part of building National Championship teams at North Dakota State and Nebraska, was introduced by University of Wyoming Athletics Director Tom Burman as the new head football coach of the Wyoming Cowboys on Sunday, Dec. 8, 2013. Bohl became the 32nd head football coach in University of Wyoming history.

He came to Wyoming after building a national power at North Dakota State as a head coach for 11 seasons from 2003-13. His teams won three consecutive National Championships at the NCAA Football Championship Subdivision (FCS) level in 2011, '12 and '13. NDSU became only the second FCS school in NCAA history to win three consecutive national football titles, tied the FCS record for consecutive wins (24 from 2011-13) and became the first undefeated FCS National Champion since 1996.

"Rarely do you get an opportunity to hire a head coach who has won multiple National Championships and has a reputation as a program builder," said Burman.

"I am absolutely confident we hired one of the best football coaches in the country. All you have to do is look at Craig's record."

"I understand the awesome responsibility to lead this football team," said Bohl. "I also understand how important football is in the fabric of this institution and not only this institution but around the state. Whether you're in Sheridan, Casper or Thermopolis, this is the state team, and I embrace that.

"I'm looking forward to getting to know the people of our great state of Wyoming. It will be an exciting time for us. We understand that the bar is high. I also appreciate the vision that Tom (Burman) has, and I want to thank him for having faith in me to lead this football program. He was able to articulate to me where our football program needs to go and the resources that are going to be provided to allow us to experience success.

"I can't tell you how excited I am to embrace the Cowboy tradition."

Not only has Bohl won three national titles at the FCS level, but he was the linebackers coach at his alma mater, Nebraska, when the Huskers won the 1995 and 1997 National Championships.

Bohl currently serves on the American Football Coaches Association (AFCA) Board of Trustees, having been elected by a vote of the membership at the 2012 AFCA national convention. He was also appointed to the 13-member NCAA Division I Football Competition Committee in January of 2017.

He concluded his career as head coach of the NDSU Bison, with a 104-32 (.765) record. He guided the Bison to the FCS Playoffs each of his final four seasons, posting a 14-1 record in the FCS Playoffs. His last three teams posted records of 14-1 (2011), 14-1 (2012) and 15-0 (2013) for a combined record of 43-2 (.956) on way to their three consecutive FCS national titles.

By winning the 2013 FCS National Championship, North Dakota State extended its winning streak to 24 consecutive games, which tied both the NDSU and FCS records for consecutive victories. The Bison teams from 1964-66 originally set the school record with 24 straight victories. The University of Pennsylvania set the FCS record of 24 consecutive wins from 1992-95. That record was later tied by Montana from 2001-02.

The 2013 NDSU team also set a North Dakota State single-season record for wins, posting a perfect 15-0 record. The Bison became the first undefeated FCS National Champion since Marshall went 15-0 to win the 1996 FCS title.

The Bison had great success against FBS teams to go with their elite status at the FCS level. In each of his last four seasons at NDSU, Bohl's Bison defeated all four of the FBS teams they faced, and captured all of those wins on the road. NDSU won at Kansas in 2010 (by a score of 6-3), at Minnesota in 2011 (37-24), at Colorado State in 2012 (22-7), and at Kansas State in 2013 (24-21). Overall during his 11 years at North Dakota State, Bohl's teams built a 7-3 record against FBS teams.

In 2012 and '13, Bohl received both The Sports Network Eddie Robinson FCS National Coach of the Year Award and the American Football Coaches Association (AFCA) FCS National Coach of the Year Award. He became the first coach in the first 27 years of the Eddie Robinson Award to win it in consecutive seasons. In 2013, he also received the Liberty Mutual FCS Coach of the Year Award, which is presented in partnership with the National Football Foundation and College Football Hall of Fame. His other National Coach of the Year honor came in 2006, when he was recognized by the Football Gazette as the FCS National Coach of the Year and the Northwest Region Coach of the Year.

He was also a finalist for The Sports Network Eddie Robinson Award in 2011, 2007 and 2006, and was the 2011 and 2013 AFCA Region 4 FCS Coach of the Year.

In addition to his 15 years of experience as a head coach, Bohl has 19 years of experience as a full-time assistant coach at the collegiate level and three seasons as a graduate assistant. His last eight years as an assistant coach were spent at Nebraska. He was the linebackers coach under head coach Tom Osborne for five of those seasons and was part of the 1995 and '97 Nebraska National Championship teams. Bohl's final three seasons (2000-02) at Nebraska, he served as the Cornhuskers' defensive coordinator under head coach Frank Solich, before accepting the head-coaching job at North Dakota State in 2003. Bohl was part of 11 bowl-game appearances while at Nebraska -- eight as an assistant coach from 1995 to 2002 and three as a graduate assistant coach for the Huskers from 1981-83.

As the defensive coordinator and linebackers coach at Duke in 1994, he helped coach the Blue Devils to the Hall of Fame Bowl in his only season at Duke.

Bohl grew up in Lincoln, Neb., and went on to attend the University of Nebraska where he was a reserve defensive back from 1977 to 1979 under head coach Tom Osborne. Bohl was part of Nebraska's 1979 Orange Bowl and 1980 Cotton Bowl teams.

The 2016 season will be Bohl's 37th year coaching at the college level. Born July 27, 1958, Bohl will be 59 years old when the 2017 season kicks off. He earned his bachelor's degree in business administration from Nebraska in 1982. Bohl's family includes wife Leia, and children Mallory and

Morgan, Aaron and Elijah.

UW This Season: Josh Allen is one of college football's top returning quarterbacks. He was named to the Maxwell Award Watch List in the summer of 2017. The Maxwell Award has been presented to the College Player of the Year since 1937. Numerous NFL scouts have rated Allen as a potential first round draft pick in the 2018 NFL Draft. He considered entering last year's NFL Draft, but decided to return to Wyoming for his junior season. Since the conclusion of the 2016 season, Allen was invited to and attended the Manning Passing Academy in June 2017. He also attended a special program approved by the NCAA for underclassmen at this past year's NFL Draft Combine in Indianapolis, Ind. 2016: Allen helped lead Wyoming to the 2016 Mountain Division title and a spot in the Mountain West Conference Championship Game. Wyoming hosted that championship game as the highest ranked team in the conference. The Cowboys went on to earn a berth in the 2016 San Diego County Credit Union Poinsettia Bowl. He was a key player in Wyoming's win over two Top 25 ranked teams in 2016, as the Cowboys also earned votes in the national polls. The Cowboy offense ranked No. 2 in the MW and No. 25 in the nation in scoring offense, averaging 35.9 points per game. Wyoming led the conference and ranked 22nd nationally in first downs (312). As a team, UW averaged 15.27 yards per pass completion to rank No. 3 in the MW and No. 8 in the NCAA. The Cowboys converted 90.6 percent of their red-zone opportunities into points to rank No. 2 in the league and No. 14 in the country. As a sophomore, Allen ranked No. 1 in the Mountain West and No. 6 nationally in passing yards per completion (15.33 yards). He also led the MW and was No. 16 in the country in points responsible for (218). Allen threw 28 touchdown passes in 2016, placing him No. 1 in the conference and No. 20 in the NCAA. He was second in the MW and 32nd in the nation in passing yards (3,203). Allen was also No. 2 in conference and No. 40 in the nation in total offense (266.1 yards per game). His 3,203 passing yards in 2016 are the fifth best single-season total in Wyoming school history, and his 3,726 yards of total offense in a single season rank No. 3 in school history. His 36 touchdowns responsible for -- passing (28), rushing (7) and receiving (1) -- rank No. 2 in Wyoming history. Allen's 28 passing TDs rank as the third best single season at Wyoming. He had five games of 300+ yards of total offense. **2015:** Allen saw action in the first two games of the 2015 season for the Pokes before suffering a season-ending injury. He was granted a medical hardship by the NCAA, restoring his sophomore season of eligibility in 2016. **Junior College:** Allen led a Reedley Community College offense that averaged 452.2 yards of total offense per game to rank No. 9 among all California junior college teams in total offense. Reedley averaged 285.3 passing yards per game to rank No. 7 among all California JCs, scored 39.4 points per game to rank No. 10 in the state and averaged 166.9 yards rushing to rank 26th. Individually, Allen's 26 touchdown passes tied him for No. 7 among all California junior college quarterbacks in 2014. He also ranked 20th among California JUCO quarterbacks in passing yards as a freshman, and ranked 42nd in the state in rushing, averaging 66.0 yards per game. He played for head coach Randy Whited at Reedley College. **High School:** Allen played his high school football at Firebaugh High School in Firebaugh, Calif. **Personal:** He is the son of LaVonne and Joel Allen, and is majoring in communication.

He was one of only 16 national semifinalists for the Jim Thorpe Award as a sophomore last season. He will enter his junior season with 253 career tackles and has a streak of starting 25 consecutive games. 2016: Wingard helped lead Wyoming to the 2016 Mountain Division title and a spot in the Mountain West Conference Championship Game. Wyoming hosted that championship game as the highest ranked team in the conference. The Cowboys went on to earn a berth in the 2016 San Diego County Credit Union Poinsettia Bowl. He was a key player in Wyoming's win over two Top 25 ranked teams in 2016, as the Cowboys also earned votes in the national polls. Wyoming's defense led the Mountain West and ranked No. 3 nationally in defensive touchdowns, with five. UW's defense led the league and ranked 15th in the NCAA in fumbles recovered (12), was No. 2 in the MW and No. 22 in the nation in interceptions (15) and was No. 2 in the conference and No. 10 in the nation in turnovers gained (27). He was a First Team All-Mountain West selection as a sophomore in 2016 in addition to being named a semifinalist for the Thorpe Award. He ranked No. 5 in the MW and No. 22 in the NCAA in total tackles in 2016, averaging 9.4 per game, and ranked No. 4 in the league and No. 26 in the NCAA in solo tackles, averaging 5.4 per game. Wingard ended his sophomore season ranked No. 1 among all current active NCAA FBS players in career solo tackles, averaging 6.08 per game, and he ranked No. 2 among all current active FBS players in career total tackles, averaging 9.73 per game. His 131 total tackles in 2016 ranks as the 10th best single season in Wyoming history. Wingard had two interceptions on the season, including one at Nebraska and one in the Poinsettia Bowl versus BYU. He recorded seven double-figure tackle games in 2016, including: a career high 17 tackles at Colorado State, 13 at Nebraska, 12 vs. Northern Illinois and 11 in four other games. **2015:** His true freshman season, Wingard was named a First Team Freshman All-American by the Football Writers Association of America (FWAA), and was one of only 29 freshmen in the nation selected to the team. He also earned Second Team All-Mountain West Conference honors as a true freshman. Wingard led the Cowboys in tackles, with 122, becoming the only freshman in school history to record 100 or more tackles in a single season. Wingard played in all 12 games for the Cowboys with 11 starts. He ranked No. 1 in the Mountain West and No. 4 in the NCAA among all players at all positions in solo tackles in 2015 (6.9 solo tackles per game). Wingard ranked No. 2 in the Mountain West and No. 12 in the nation among all players at all positions in total tackles in 2015 (10.2 tackles per game). He also led all MW defensive backs in tackles. He was named First Team All-State Class 5A as a running back, defensive back and return specialist as presented by the Colorado High School Activities Association (CHSAANow.com). The CHSAA team was selected by Colorado high school coaches. Class 5A is the largest classification in the state of Colorado. Wingard was ranked as the 15th best overall recruit in the state of Colorado by 247Sports.com. His senior season, he recorded 96 tackles, including 52 solo tackles, intercepted three passes, recovered two fumbles and forced one fumble. He rushed for 1,653 yards on 190 carries his senior season and averaged 127.2 yards per game and 8.7 yards per carry, while recording 10, 100-yard rushing games and scoring 28 rushing touchdowns. Wingard also caught 37 passes for 393 yards and scored five receiving TDs. He added 414 yards in kickoff returns and 235 yards in punt returns. Wingard concluded his senior season with 2,702 all-purpose yards and averaged 207.8 all-purpose yards per game. For his career, Wingard accumulated: 3,251 total rushing yards on 414 carries and 52 rushing TDs; 810 receiving yards on 81 receptions and 12 receiving TDs; 1,331 kickoff return yards; 323 punt return yards; and 5,722 all-purpose yards. He helped lead Ralston Valley High to a 12-1 record and the Semifinals of the Class 5A State Playoffs. He played for head coach Matt Loyd. 

He was selected the Mountain West Conference Freshman of the Year in voting by conference head coaches and media. Wilson ranked No. 1 among MW freshmen in tackles, averaging 6.7 tackles per game. He had 94 tackles on the year to go along with 7.5 tackles for loss and three sacks. Those tackles for loss combined for 45 yards. He also recovered three fumbles and forced one fumble. As a defensive back, wide receiver and punter, he helped lead Natrona County to an undefeated season and the 2014 Class 4A State Championship. Wilson was selected to play in the 2015 Shrine Bowl on June 13, 2015, in Casper, Wyo. He was also part of Natrona County's 2012 undefeated State Championship team. His senior season, he had 29 receptions for 493 yards, averaged 17.0 yards per reception and scored seven receiving touchdowns. Mick and Susie McMurry High Altitude Performance Center Will be One of the Premier Athletic Facilities in the Country

Construction of Wyoming's \$44 million, state-of-the-art Mick and Susie McMurry High Altitude Performance Center began in December of 2016, the week following Wyoming hosting the 2016 Mountain West Championship Game.

The new facility is located at the north end of War Memorial Stadium. It will expand the current Rochelle Athletics Center by 71,000 square feet to a total of 118,000 square feet.

Contained in the new facility will be: an expanded academic center, a larger sports medicine area that will incorporate two recovery pools, new strength and conditioning center, new football locker room, a theatre-style squad room, a player lounge, a recruiting lounge, new football meeting rooms and a training table that will include a complete kitchen to help meet the nutritional needs of all UW student-athletes.

The project is being funded by \$24 million in private donations and a \$20 million State of Wyoming matching program. The matching program was established by Gov. Matt Mead and the Wyoming State Legislature. The project will be completed in 2018.
